TEXAS OPENS TO 100% THANK YOU GOV. ABBOTT!

Exactly eight months after issuing a mask mandate in COVID-19 orders he signed last year.

Texas Gov. Greg Abbott made the statewide announcement Tuesday. "Too many Texans have been sidelined from employment opportunities," Abbott said. "Too many small business owners have struggled to pay their bills. This must end. It is now time to open Texas 100%.

Effective next Wednesday, March 10th, all businesses regardless of classifications are allowed to open to 100% capacity, Abbott said.

Abbott said "Texas is in a far better position now," with increasing vaccination numbers and more knowledge of how to manage the spread of the virus. Abbott also pointed to a decreasing hospitalization rates and positivity rate.

If COVID-19 hospitalizations rise above 15% for seven straight days for any hospital region, county judges may opt to impose stricter COVID-19 mitigation strategies, but they cannot impose face mask restrictions or fines, Abbott said.

Although Abbott acknowledged that the virus hasn't disappeared completely, he said "state mandates are no longer needed." "It is their business, and they get to choose to operate their business the way they want to. At this time, however, people and businesses don't need the state telling them how to operate."

"HOLD MY BEER"

Pandemic, lockdowns, hurricanes, impeachments, elections, the great toilet paper shortage, and now the Ice Storm of the Century, it seems we are now on Day 812 of 2020. The arctic storm that reached across the majority of the country is certainly something that most Texans are unfamiliar with. Most folks prepared as best they could, hunkered down, and got through it. Almost all of Texas was without power from as little as a few hours to as much as four or five days. These outmost Texas counties, Gov. Greg Abbott reversed that ages were due to multiple factors including power generation stations that were down for schedorder on Tuesday, along with most other statewide uled maintenance or down due to not being winterized and failing with the cold weather, as well as failures with frozen wind turbines and solar energy panels. All aspects of these failures and the actions of ERCOT, the Electric Reliability Council of Texas are being investigated by various government agencies including the Texas Legislature in order to find out exactly what went wrong and how to prevent it in the future. Several of the ERCOT board members have resigned. Tragically, more than 80 fatalities have occurred so far as a result of the storm from causes such as hypothermia and carbon monoxide poisoning among others.



In any disaster, natural or otherwise, two distinct groups tend to emerge. Those who want to help and those who want to complain. Those who want to help seem to be the majority of the citizens of Texas. There were countless acts of kindness and compassion as the state struggled through this weather. Grocery store giant, HEB, upon losing power to its store, allowed all customers to leave the store with full baskets at no charge. Neighbors with power and heat and water invited their neighbors, or even strangers, into their homes to ride it out. People who had the ability to cook made soups, stews, casseroles, and barbeque to share with all in need. Once the thaw arrived and water pipes were bursting and water was not available, the same thing happened. Texans helped Texans with stopping the flow of water, obtaining clean water for drinking and cooking, and sharing hard to come by plumbing supplies. Local water districts worked around the clock to maintain or to increase water and water pressure capacity to get water restored to their communities while at the same time dealing with all the same issues at their own homes.

Especially in our coastal area, we all know about the importance of preparation. While this weather event was very unusual for South Texas, a lot of the same preparedness measures were useful. It's a good reminder to have the usual things on hand, water, flashlights, batteries, food, medicine, make sure generators are serviced and in working order, etc. Who knows when and if we will see an ice storm like this anytime in the near future, but being as ready as possible is 90 percent of the battle. The things not seen in Texas were looting, robberies, and violence. Texans should be proud.



Thank You San Leon





Water is a precious resource that's often taken for granted: when you turn on the faucet or flush the toilet, it's expected that water will be there to take care of business. As all of Texas found out last month during winter storm Uri, even the most prepared systems can falter under extreme circumstances. As the District Manager for San Leon MUD, I've fielded many calls and emails since that week and realized an explanation of how the water distribution system works was likely warranted, so here we are.

While water distribution systems may have unique features, the general principle remains the same: a source of water is tapped and treated for safe public consumption, then relayed throughout the community via a network of interconnected pipes. Many areas have ground water wells that pull water from aquifers, naturally occurring spaces underground that store water from rain or other runoff. Much of the Galveston area is serviced by the Gulf Coast Water Authority (GCWA), a regional agency that operates a surface water treatment facility. Surface water plants don't pull water from aquifers, but rather source from bodies of water above-ground. GCWA gets its water from the Brazos and treats it prior to sending it down to us here in Bacliff & San Leon, not to mention Galveston, other local municipalities, and many industrial customers who purchase water from them.

Once the District has received the treated water and run our own tests to confirm it's been adequately disinfected and safe for public consumption, we use an assortment of storage tanks and equipment to ensure adequate pressure and supply is available to the community. Ground storage tanks are constructed of steel or concrete and provide a readily-available stockpile of treated water. System pressure is regulated via booster pumps and hydropneumatics tanks, elevated storage tanks (water towers), or a combination of them all. The distribution system is intended to be a closed system, looping back on itself to provide continuous pressure throughout. There are some instances where closing the loops isn't feasible, in which case there can be buildup of sediment in the dead end. Typically, a blow off valve will be installed in those locations to allow for the line to be opened up and discharge the buildup, preventing an impact on water quality for customers nearby. The District may also open fire hydrants near the area to help flush out the water that was there, bringing in fresh water.

There are a significant number of controls set in place (both mechanical and electronic) to monitor the system and help keep a stable supply of well-pressured and treated water for the community. During winter storm Uri, as the cold weather persisted and more lines began to break, San Leon saw

an increase to nearly triple the demand we've experienced during heavy demand peaks. GCWA's distribution includes many more municipalities than just the ones listed above, and as each of them experienced breaks, there was increased demand across the region. We began closely monitoring our systems, gauging if bringing our groundwater well online to supplement GCWA's supply would be enough to meet the demand. Unfortunately, it was not so San Leon had to turn off the water for the entire community as we assessed the damage and did our best to isolate and repair as many breaks as possible before the bringing the system back online. During that down time, no water was coming from our plant, which triggered the boil water notice that so many municipalities issued. There are specific circumstances that can trigger a boil water notice, but fortunately this was not due to any negative lab result but merely a precautionary notice due to the decreased pressure in the system. Once a significant number of leaks had been repaired or isolated, we began to bring the system back online, restoring water service to the community with the boil water notice still in place. We continued to discover and isolate or repair leaks as we found them, reaching a stable point in the system the evening of the 19th as system pressures reached 55 PSI. Now that stable pressures were in the system, we engaged a state-certified lab that handles our routine sampling to conduct a special sampling as required by the state regulatory agency, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). Once we received notice on the morning of February 22nd the tests were clean, we were able to lift the boil water notice and get back to business as

We've come through a tough time, but we're a resilient bunch... This was an intense test of our grit, but we persevered as a community and as a state. While I don't wish a return of that weather one bit, I appreciate the stories that have come out of it: people going to social media and offering whatever resources they had available for whichever neighbor might benefit, county agencies and local volunteer fire departments handing out cases of water, the support and understanding that was shown towards utility workers working around the clock to restore power and water. When we needed neighborly spirit during trying times, our community stepped up to the plate. It's an honor to serve San Leon; here's to brighter days ahead.





Winter Storm Uri

Last month, a winter storm unlike anything the region has seen devastated our community. Even homes that had prepared for the cold were not prepared for the loss of power, scarce resources, and interruption of water service. February 16th, we realized the demand created by the number of pipes that were broken throughout the distribution system meant we may need to consider working overtime to address the leaks by isolating customer lines and repairing District lines. By 3 AM on February 17th, it had become apparent that the District would not be able to keep up with the demand as pressures dropped below State mandated levels. Over the coming days, both our staff and the community banded together to repair the damage from winter storm Uri. Our community is unlike any other, and the generosity and willingness to help each other during these trying times is what makes our people so amazing. Thank you for your understanding as the District has worked tirelessly to bring things back to regular operations. 





ROYSTON JONES

Roy was a sailor, adventurer, teacher, jack of many trades, photographer, entertainer, inventor, and above all a master storyteller. He was born in Neath, Wales, Great Britain to Alfred Jones and Dorothy Ingerson on May 2nd, 1942 during WWII. He died January 19, 2021 in Port Bolivar, Texas.



At a young age he sailed the waters around Great Britain with his grandfather. Eventually he became a Master Sailor which gave him opportunities to rub elbows with royalty and politicians during the 70's and 80's.

At 15 he began working in the "hell hole" of the Welsh steel mills, but left Wales at 18 for greener pastures to hitchhike across Europe for a year. While going through college in Wales to become a teacher

and later on, he traveled extensively at every opportunity. At one point he travelled the length and breadth of India for 6 months in hopes of opening an import business.

In summers Roy worked many jobs learning skills such as stone masonry, logging, roof tiling, gardening, and auto mechanic. He would later incorporate these skills into his teaching profession. As often was the case, he became a photographer by accident when a friend saw some of his photos and needed publicity shots. Another friend saw those photos, asked him to do some for him, but when he got to the night spot to shoot, the man did not show and they needed someone to fill the bill. Roy went on stage, told a few jokes, some card tricks and some sing-along. Thus, he became an entertainer. Being a political animal, he also took on the job representing his colleagues in the variety guild or union. This twist of fate turned into film and television work also.

In the 1980's he had several ideas for saving energy. He patented those ideas and started a company producing and selling the products. It became a million-pound a year business. Roy became tired of the high pressure of business, sold the company and took a 2-year hiatus. After the break, he went back to his first love, teaching. He developed a scheme to teach troubled teens through hands-on life skills on a farm in central Wales.

In 2000, Roy met his future wife Bonnie English on the internet. He traveled to Texas in 2001 where they met and married 4 months later. Roy taught in High Island school and worked at the Children's Center in Galveston. They sailed Galveston Bay and the Gulf of Mexico and travelled throughout Europe, the USA, and Mexico. Due to immigration problems after 9/11 they moved to Italy and stayed for 10+ years but returned to Texas due to Roy's deteriorating health and was unable to work. He spent his last 4 years under the watchful care of the UTMB medical staff and the Crystal Beach clinic for which he and Bonnie are eternally grateful.

He leaves an empty place in the lives of his family. His wife, Bonnie Jones; sons Alan and Peter Jones in Europe; stepsons and wives- Bryan and Dawn Aaron, Dean and Martha Aaron, Clifford Howard and Sarom, and step daughter, Deborah Aaron; his grandchildren Allison and Travis Campbell, Meagan and Anthony Tran, Katelynn and Christopher Fruge, Devin and Vikki Ebert, Grant Aaron, Stephanie, Steven and Nick Gallegos; his greatgrandchildren- Dex, Parker, Neo, Lana, Kai and Devyn; his sister-in-law Anita Aldridge.
