Actor's Workshop in San Leon

The Actor's Workshop is free workshop that started as a rehearsal forum for cast members of the upcoming movie version of Siren Song, written by local author, George Dismukes. Pacific Seafood on Bayshore Drive. Originally started for cast members of Siren Song, it began to expand when other people came forward and expressed a desire to learn acting. The workshop continues to grow and invites interested parties to apply. For now, it is completely free of charge, but in the spring will be charging a small monthly fee.

At this time, Siren Song, The Novel is being converted to an audio book featuring many of the cast members participating in the recording. Rather than a straight narration, the book is being recorded in the style of an old radio show.

AW, SHUCKS!

The Texas oyster commercial harvesting begins November 1st and closes at 3:30 pm on April 30th. Well, not in 2022! The Texas Parks & Wildlife Department (TPWD) closed the harvesting down on January 19, 2022, due to the oysters at the reef they checked found to be small. The Seabreeze spoke with a gentleman that has been in the industry for years and he said that the reef that was tested probably had small oysters, but two reefs away probably had big and legal-sized oysters. A reputable oyster harvester will not go fish small oysters due to the hefty fines, jail time, and the loss of their license and boat. He further said they used to be allowed 15% small oysters and dead shells, but that has moved to 5%. These fines are as follows: Class A misdemeanor of TPWD is punishable by time in county jail not to exceed one year and a fine of \$500.00 up to \$4000.00. A class B misdemeanor of TPWD is punishable by up to 180 days in county jail and a fine of \$200.00 up to \$2000.00. A class C misdemeanor of TPWD is punishable by a fine of \$25.00 to \$500.00.



The oyster commercial harvesting has been taking hard hits for years. They had 11 years of drought and then a few years of good rain, followed in 2008 by Hurricane Ike. Prior to 2008, Galveston Bay provided nearly 80% of the oyster harvest in Texas. The severe sediment smothered the oyster reefs and killed the oyster harvesting. Many large oyster harvesters worked together to rebuild the oyster beds, but on August 17, 2017, Hurricane Harvey disrupted nearly every oyster-producing region in Texas. Harvey killed 80% of the oysters in the bay. TPWD has permanently closed six bays and is trying to close three more. Again, more pain to the struggling industry.

This has left many of our coastal community businesses having to lay off employees. You might think that's unfortunate for those folks, but the truth is, it affects the whole coastal community. The men and women working in this industry stop off at the local convenience stores in the morning to get breakfast, drinks, gloves, and some may need some new white boots (aka San Leon ropers) because they have had those for 2 years. They get off work and the wife or hubby calls and says, "We need milk," or they want to stop and grab a beer or get some gas. That just cut the convenience stores out of sales of probably \$20.00 to \$25.00 a day per unemployed person, which could be as many as 50 men and women per small town. These hard workers are no longer driving to the coastal community spending roughly \$1250.00 a day.

On Saturday, February 26th, 2022, The Seabreeze inquired of some of the establishments that sell oysters on the half shell. The best prices found were in San Leon. Galveston had some very pricy oysters. Landry's had a price tag of \$26.99 a dozen. It's a pretty safe bet that the prices will only go up if they don't reopen the bays.

For those of you that have read the post on Nextdoor suggesting that the bays were closed due to pollution, that is not the case. The following was released by TPWD:

AUSTIN – The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) is closing TX-29 in Aransas Bay to commercial and recreational oyster harvest beginning at 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, Jan. 19, 2022. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission is scheduled to consider this rule during the March 2022 Commission Meeting. This closing is based on samples recently collected by TPWD showing low abundance of legal-sized oysters. TPWD has worked with the oyster industry to develop criteria for closing areas to harvest. The criteria include parameters for oysters when they fall below certain thresholds based on the abundance of legal-sized oysters (3 inches or greater) and the percentage of small oysters (2-2.9 inches). All areas currently closed to harvest will continue to be monitored by TPWD and will reopen when criteria thresholds are met.

Public hearings: TPWD Coastal Fisheries staff will be hosting several public hearings on the coast to receive input from stakeholders concerning the proposed regulation change. What is a sewer cleanout?

A sewer cleanout is a PVC pipe and cap, typically 4" in diameter, that intersects with the sewer line that runs from your home to the District's main lines. It provides an access point for plumbers to diagnose and repair backups in the line that connects to the District's main line. It should be kept closed to function properly, as being left open will result in rain water getting into the District's collection system and inundating the wastewater treatment plant with unnecessary flow. If you have any questions about the location of your cleanout or how to replace a damaged cap, just call the office!
