Senator Middleton Files Bills to Hold **Drunk Drivers Accountable**

The Galveston community has been devastated Well, it has happened in our multiple times in the last year by drivers under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

We have come together as a community, but we need more accountability and stricter laws that will hold repeated drunk drivers accountable for their actions. We owe that to Sam Mixon and Mason Nelson, who were tragically killed in front of Ball High, and all other victims of drunk driving and families who have suffered injury and loss. I have filed three bills to bring accountability to repeated DUI offenders and to help ensure these tragedies do not re-occur.

Senate Bill 324 would require that, after a 2nd DUI offense, a repeated DUI driver must serve at least half of their jail sentence or a minimum of 2 years.

Senate Bill 1067 would require enhanced parole board oversight when considering parole for an This includes increased notice requirements in the community for parole hearings, mandating they review social media when making decisions on parole, and also requiring the parole board to consider public school disciplinary records of the potential parolee.

Senate Bill 1310 would enhance the criminal penalty for defeating an interlock device and then causing a death from driving under the influence to a 1st degree felony without parole.







What is a house shut off valve?

A house shut off valve (pictured below) is a valve that's typically found on the side of your home where the water line comes in. While not all homes have a house shut off valve, it's a very important valve if you do have one: if closed, this valve will turn off all water service to the home! While this is handy to take care of any repairs you may need to address inside the home, during the summertime many people accidentally turn the house shut off valve when trying to turn off hoses or sprinklers. If you're experiencing a loss of service, always be sure to check your house shut off valve because it might be the culprit!




