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Did you know:

Only 6 of the 30 MLB teams have a retractable roof? That's why Houston doesn't ever have to worry about rain delays. (MLB teams with retractable roofs/domes include: Astros, Blue Jays, Diamondbacks, Mariners, Brewers, and Marlins.)

Speaking of retractable roof, it takes 12-20 minutes to close the roof, and moves back and forth an estimated 160 times a year for a distance of 14.6 miles.

The Houston Astros are estimated to be worth \$1.65 billion, according to Forbes (which ranks them as the 11th most valuable MLB team)

The Houston franchise debuted back in 1962 when they were the Colt .45s.

After three seasons as the Houston Colt 45s and playing home games at Colt Stadium, the team changed their name to the Astros and began the 1965 season in the newly built Astrodome.

The one millionth run in Major League Baseball history was hit by a Houston Astro. Bob Watson pulled off this feat in May of 1975. Nevertheless, the Astros lost the game.
