
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THANK YOU TO SUNNY SAN LEON!

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

I know fishermen get tired of me publishing that San Leon is the best spot to launch your boat on Galveston Bay. It's been a secret for years. If you launch your boat in Seabrook, you have a long boat ride to the fishing spots as they only have a few good places to fish.

Texas City has better access to the jetties. San Leon has two free boat ramps, the Spillway and the Dickinson Bridge. We also have Topwater at the south end of 12th St. with very reasonable launch rates and Eagle Point Marina with a good launch and live and dead bait with a reasonable launch fee. Fish are being caught all around San Leon, most at the deeper reefs out around the channel. You might try Exxon A lease out of San Leon using a live shrimp under a popping cork.

SCHOOL TIPS FROM A GRADUATE**



"The Boobies" Cop a Feel

Everyone who knew Dear Steve knew he was a huge fan of the boobies. Round or long, big, or small, he didn't care, he loved them all. So this month, being it is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, we will be giving you a few boobie tips. Ladies, I encourage you to allow your husbands to help you with these few simple techniques. I think you will find this is one honey-do that he will not mind doing. Doctors recommend doing a boobie check at least once a month. But, hey, why not once a week? Maybe it just could become part of your weekly date night!

Girls, before you get started, take a nice long shower and get all fixed up. Remember, although this is serious business, we must always look our best for our husbands.

Here are a few things that should be looked for while doing this exam. A lump, firm knot, or thickening in the boobie. A change in size or shape of the boobies. Lumps under the arm. Nipple pain, tenderness, discharge, or bleeding. A nipple turning inward or inverted. Changes in texture or color. Swollen, warm, sore, or itchy boobies and any signs of a rash.

Step 1: Men, have your wife lay topless on a comfortable surface like a bed or sofa. Make sure the area is well lit and perhaps put on some Barry White playing softly in the background. Have her put one arm behind her head and prop her shoulder up with a thin pillow.

Our youngest gal was 21 and our oldest was 84 when diagnosed. And, oh, by the way, men get breast cancer too! Roughly 2000 men in the United States are diagnosed with breast cancer every year. So, ladies, shake it up and perform the same exam on your man!

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
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San Leon MUD Update



Your water bill is calculated based on the amount of water you use, so how do we measure your water usage? San Leon has electronic meters that store your usage on an hourly basis that are then gathered by our meter readers with special equipment. However, you can always track your usage yourself or check to see if you have any leaks. Just open your meter box and make a note of date and time of the read based on the image below.



If you take another read at the same time on another day, you can subtract the two numbers to see how many gallons of water you used during that time. As always, if you have any questions about your usage, don't hesitate to contact the office and we'll be more than happy to assist you with figuring out your usage trends.
