San Leon MUD Awarded Nearly \$15 Million in Funding

Austin, TX / June 6, 2023

During the regular meeting of the Texas Water Development Board on Tuesday, San Leon MUD's District Manager Andrew Miller presented a sewer improvement project to the board members.

The majority of San Leon's existing sewer mains are original to the District's initial development in the 70s and 80s and are comprised primarily of ABS truss pipe. Deterioration over time and poor soil conditions have degraded the integrity of the system and warrants evaluating the more than 50 miles of gravity sewer mains so that the District can rehabilitate or replace the mains where necessary.

The proposed project would also take into consideration the integrity of service connections and manholes as they are an additional source of inflow and infiltration, which can cause further degradation of the collection system. After some deliberation, the board unanimously approved the funding request, which will be comprised of a \$10 million grant, \$3,055,000 in a 0% interest loan,

and \$1,310,000 in a low-interest loan that will be reasonably priced as a result of the District's excellent credit rating.

While the project will take some time to complete, the finished product will ensure reliable service for San Leon residents for years to come.





Smart Irrigation Month

Yards can quickly die in the brutal Texas heat if not adequately watered, but overwatering can also drown the yard, resulting in shallow roots and decreased resilience. Most lawns only need about 1" of water per week to stay green and healthy. Place a few empty tuna cans around your lawn while you're watering and measure how long it takes your sprinkler to fill them with a half-inch of water. Then, try watering that amount of time twice a week, gauge how your landscape responds, and adjust based on weather conditions. Heat Stroke vs Heat Exhaustion

Heat stroke is a life-threatening condition that occurs when the body can no longer control its temperature. It's more common in hot, humid weather.

Symptoms of heat stroke include:

- » Nausea
- » Dizziness
- » Headache
- » Muscle cramps
- » Hot, dry, red skin
- » Confusion
- » Seizures
- » Loss of consciousness
- » Body temperature above 103°F
- » Rapid and strong pulse
- » Fainting

Heat stroke is a severe medical emergency. If you think someone is having a heat stroke, call 911 or get them to a hospital immediately.

HURRICANE SEASON

Your pets are an important member of your family, so they need to be included in your family's emergency plan. To prepare for the unexpected follow these tips with your pets in mind:

Make a Plan

If you have a plan in place for you and your pets, you will likely encounter less difficulty, stress and worry when you need to make a decision during an emergency. If local officials ask you to evacuate, that means your pet should evacuate too. If you leave your pets behind, they may end up lost, injured or worse.

Things to include in your plan:

Have an evacuation plan for your pet. Many public shelters and hotels do not allow pets. Know a safe place where you can take your pets before disasters and emergencies happen.

Develop a buddy system: Plan with neighbors, friends or relatives to make sure that someone is available to care for or evacuate your pets if you are

Have your pet micro chipped. Make sure to keep your address and phone number up-to-date on their chip and include contact information for an emergency contact outside of your immediate area.

Contact your local emergency management office, animal shelter or animal control office to get additional advice and information if you're unsure how to care for your pet in case of an emergency.

Build a Kit for Your Pet

Just as you do with your family's emergency supply kit, think first about the basics for survival, such as food and water. Have two kits, one larger kit if you are sheltering in place and one lightweight version for if you need to evacuate. Review your kits regularly to ensure that their contents especially medicines.



Animal Emergency Kit:

Food: Keep several days' supply of food in an airtight, waterproof container.

Water: Store a water bowl and several days' supply

Medicine: Keep an extra supply of the medicine your pet takes on a regular basis in a waterproof container.

First aid kit: Talk to your veterinarian about most appropriate items for your pet's emergency medical needs.

Collar with ID tag and a harness or leash: Include a backup leash, collar and ID tag. Have copies of your pet's registration information and other relevant documents in a waterproof container and available electronically.

Traveling: bag, crate or sturdy carrier, ideally one for each pet.

Grooming items: Pet shampoo, conditioner and other items, in case your pet needs cleaning up.

Sanitation needs: Pet litter and litter box if needed, newspapers, paper towels, plastic trash bags and

household chlorine bleach to provide for your pet's sanitation needs.

A picture of you and your pet together: If you become separated, a photo of you and your pet together will help to document ownership and allow others to help find your pet.

Familiar items: Put favorite toys, treats or bedding in your kit. Familiar items can help reduce stress for your pet.

Tips for Large Animals

If you have pets such as horses, goats or pigs on your property, be sure to prepare before a disaster.

Ensure all animals have some form of identification. Evacuate animals earlier, whenever possible. Map out primary and secondary routes in advance.

Make available vehicles and trailers needed for transporting and supporting each type of animal. Also make available experienced handlers and drivers.

Ensure destinations have food, water, veterinary care and handling equipment.


If evacuation is not possible, animal owners must decide whether to move large animals to a barn or turn them loose outside.


