The CERT Program educates citizens about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. that if anyone wants to know the facts about the Battleship Texas, they could go to their website www.battleshiptexas.org. The Battleship Texas is 110 years old. Construction started in 1911 and was commissioned into the Navy in 1914. She was docked at the San Jacinto Battleground for 70 years, and the move to the drydock in Galveston was out of necessity. They were pumping 2,000 gallons of water a minute out of the hull. Bruce Bramlett said the overall move went very well and they were ahead of schedule. Along with about 30 people, they had many pumps and generators in place in case they were needed.


The plan for the Battleship Texas is that it will be in the drydock at Gulf Copper Manufacturing Corporations for 12 to 14 months with 35 million dollars to do the work needed.
