

Press Release: From Henry A. Trochesset Sheriff, Galveston County



Julia Szebehely San Leon, Texas

n September 7, 2024, the Galveston County Sheriffs Office responded to the 800 block of 29th St. and San Leon, Texas. To assist the Galveston County Health District Animal Services with an animal cruelty investigation. The Animal Control Officer reported numerous deceased cats were on the location

Upon arrival, the deputies observed that the residence and property were in deplorable conditions and identified the owner of the property is Julia Szebehely – 63, who was on location while there, the animal cruelty control officer and deputies observed an emaciated horse at the rear of the property. The Houston Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to animals (SPCA) responded to assist the overall investigation and seized the horse and two deceased cat carcasses. A total of 16 cat carcasses were removed from the property, including the seizure of four live cats.

On September 17, 2024 the Sheriffs Office Animal Cruelty Investigator conducted a follow-up investigation which led to the execution of a search warrant for the residence. Upon executing the search warrant, a total of 42 animal carcasses were located and examined.

Throughout the investigation a total of 60 deceased animals were removed from the property. A majority of the deceased animals were located inside lock kennels, crates, and traps.

The Galveston County District Attorneys Office was contacted and accepted charges on Szebehely for ten counts of cruelty to non-livestock animals and one count of cruelty to a livestock animal with a bond totaling \$16,500

The Sheriffs Office Warrant Division arrested Julia Szebehely and transported her to the Galveston County jail. She is currently out on bond, pending the judicial process.

REPORTING ABUSE YOU WITNESS: If you witness suspected cruelty to animals, call your local animal control agency as soon as possible or dial 9-1-1 if you're unfamiliar with local organizations. If you make a report of alleged animal cruelty, the responding agency is required to investigate. To the right are additional resources to to contact in case of animal cruelty.





"One of the things rehabbers hear often is, "I don't know how you do it! I wouldn't be able to let them go."

The public (you amazing humans) only see a snippet of what we endure as rehabbers. There is blood, sweat, tears, ugly sobbing, laughing while sobbing, stomach churning events, we see things we can't un-see and we feel things we can't un-feel.

We get animals that are injured, sick, orphaned, broken, wounded, abused, scarred, fighting for their lives, clinging to life, losing their lives. We work with blood, urine, feces, vomit, eye infections, abscesses, lacerations, and other gore.

But in the midst of it all, something beautiful happens...

The dependent orphans learn to eat on their own. The broken leg heals and allows for bearing weight. The eye infection clears up and vision is restored. The wound scabs over. The wing heals. The pain fades.

Then one day, the very animals that we poured our heart, soul, time, money, and energy into are loaded up. The kennels are opened...in that moment, everything we've worked for, everything YOU have supported, comes to fruition.

The bird walks then flies off. The skunk feels fresh grass under his paws and waddles away. The owl spreads his beautiful wings and takes flight. The mama opossum cautiously takes that first step into her second chance. The raccoon climbs the tallest tree.

And... We walk away. We let go.

Yes, we cry. We worry.

None of it matters because they were never ours to begin with."

San Leon MUD Update

Galveston County Mosquito Control

Galveston County has a fleet of vehicles that are deployed throughout the county to spray for mosquitos. If you have any questions regarding spraying schedule or want to request spraying in your area, you can call them at 800.842.5622 or visit their website to see maps of the locations they've recently sprayed as well as where they intend to spray next.

What is a sewer cleanout?

A sewer cleanout is a PVC pipe and cap, typically 4" in diameter, that intersects with the sewer line that runs from your home to the District's main lines. It provides an access point for plumbers to diagnose and repair backups in the line that connects to the District's main line. It should be kept closed to function properly, as being left open will result in rain water getting into the District's collection system and inundating the wastewater treatment plant with unnecessary flow. If you have any questions about the location of your cleanout or how to replace a damaged cap, just call the office!



Not much to report about fishing except for the Harvest Moon, which allows fish to eat at night.



If you would like to attend, you can sign up to receive emails of the next meeting, there is no charge and the sponsor choses the location. Sponsorships are also available.


