- Flammable Liquid – Category 2
- Eye Irritation – Category 2A

(Skin irritation Category 3 removed – no longer recognized under current GHS)

Signal Word: Danger

Hazard Statements

- H225: Highly flammable liquid and vapor

- H319: Causes serious eye irritation
 - H336: May cause drowsiness or dizziness
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Precautionary Statements

Prevention

- P210: Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames. No smoking
- P233: Keep container tightly closed
- P240–P243: Ground/bond container; use explosion-proof equipment
- P261: Avoid breathing vapors or spray
- P271: Use only in well-ventilated areas
- P280: Wear protective gloves and eye protection

Response

- P303+P361+P353: IF ON SKIN: Remove contaminated clothing; rinse with water
- P304+P340: IF INHALED: Move to fresh air
- P305+P351+P338: IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water
- P312: Call a POISON CENTER if unwell

Storage

- P403+P233: Store in a well-ventilated place
- P405: Store locked up

SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

Eye Contact:

Rinse with water for at least 15 minutes. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.

Inhalation:

Move to fresh air. Seek medical attention if symptoms occur.

Skin Contact:

Wash with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing.

Ingestion:

Do NOT induce vomiting. Rinse mouth. Seek medical attention.

SECTION 5: Fire-Fighting Measures

Suitable Extinguishing Media:

Alcohol-resistant foam, dry chemical, CO₂

Specific Hazards:

Flammable vapors; may form explosive mixtures

Protective Equipment:

Self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective gear

SECTION 6: Accidental Release Measures

- Remove ignition sources
 - Ventilate area
 - Absorb with non-combustible material
 - Prevent entry into drains
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SECTION 7: Handling and Storage

Handling:

Use in well-ventilated area. Avoid inhalation and contact.

Storage:

Store in cool, dry, ventilated area away from ignition sources.

SECTION 8: Exposure Controls / Personal Protection

Exposure Limits (Isopropyl Alcohol)

- OSHA PEL: 400 ppm
 - ACGIH TLV: 200 ppm (TWA), 400 ppm (STEL)
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PPE

- Eyes: Safety goggles
 - Skin: Nitrile gloves
 - Respiratory: Use respirator if ventilation inadequate

- Appearance: Clear liquid
 - Odor: Alcohol-like
 - Flash Point: 21°C (70°F)
 - Specific Gravity: 0.90–0.91
 - Solubility: Miscible in water

- Stable under normal conditions
- Avoid heat, sparks, flames
- Incompatible with oxidizers, acids
