SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

Eye Contact:

Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.

Inhalation:

Rinse mouth. Do not induce vomiting. Seek medical advice if symptoms occur.

Handling:

Avoid contact with eyes. Use with adequate ventilation.

Store tightly closed in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area

Exposure Limits (Isopropyl Alcohol)

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Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- **Eyes: Safety glasses recommended for bulk handling**
 - **Skin: Gloves recommended for prolonged use**
 - **Respiratory: Not normally required**

- **Appearance: Liquid**
 - **Color: Clear to light amber**
 - **Odor: Mild**
 - **Flash Point: > 60°C (not classified as flammable)**
 - **Solubility: Partially miscible in water**
 - **Consistency: Light liquid wax**

- **Stable under normal conditions**
 - **Avoid excessive heat and open flame**
 - **Incompatible with strong oxidizers**
