WHO?

One Hope fellows are young men and women who have graduated college or are at least 21 years old and are interested in developing experience and practical knowledge in urban ministry, community development, and nonprofit work. Fellows should be members in good standing at a local church and must be willing to live in Tulsa for 11 months to participate in the fellowship full time.

WHAT?

- Fellows live in the neighborhood around the Rose Bowl, alongside the community One Hope serves.
- Fellows gain hands-on experience in multiple areas of urban ministry and will grow their skills for creative problem solving and collaboration in a multi-stakeholder environment.
- Fellows learn about the Imago Dei, racial reconciliation, trauma care, peacemaking in the midst of violence, the priority and purpose of the local church, kingdom economics, reading the Bible with the poor, prophetic imagination and lament, incarnational living, and more.
- Fellows receive room and board, along with a small monthly stipend.

WHERE?

One Hope Tulsa is a community development non-profit working to create flourishing neighborhoods where relationships build resilience and hope changes outcomes. Our approach is trauma-responsive, local church-based, and focused on our neighbors on the margins.

WHY?

- Learning from the poor and from Christian leaders committed to urban ministry is good and necessary spiritual formation for young Christian (future) leaders.
- The Fellowship is intentionally designed to help you build Christian community and friendships centered around Jesus.
- You will get the privilege of working and living in a racially diverse neighborhood

- You will have the opportunity to pursue areas of personal special interest related to community well-being or ministry.
