HIGHLIGHTS

Embedded Licensed Professional Counselor

- Launched a partnership with Flourish Counseling to provide free trauma counseling services to our neighbors at the Rose Bowl
- Our counselor is a Christian LPC specializing in EMDR with over 20 years of community development experience; she is passionate about supporting individuals on their healing journey and building emotional muscle to withstand life's challenges

Expanded Summer Camp and Family Camp

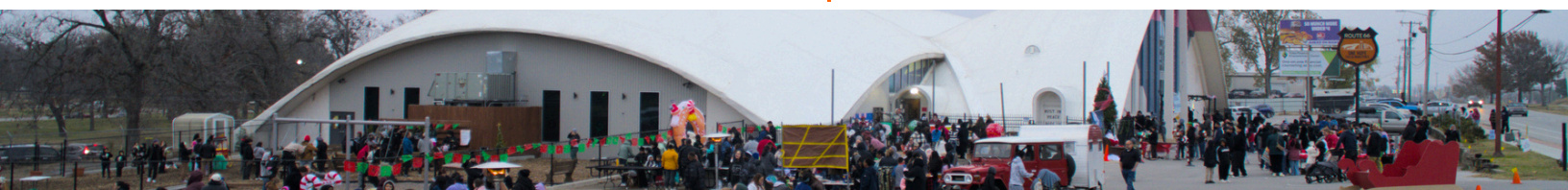
- Provided Sports, Arts, Music, Field Trips, Literacy, and more for 500 kids at no cost to their families
- Hosted 10 families at Keystone State Park for a weekend retreat of fun, spiritual formation, and creating family memories

HOPE Leader Program

- Empowered 21 neighborhood teens to become community leaders while providing wrap-around support and professional development training
- Many HOPE Leaders were inspired to join the program because of how much they loved being a part of One Hope as kids!

Human-Centered Design Partnerships

- Partnered with the Dr. Brian Fikkert and 4 students from Covenant College's Social Innovation Department
- Empowered our team to utilize creative solutions to address neighborhood challenges



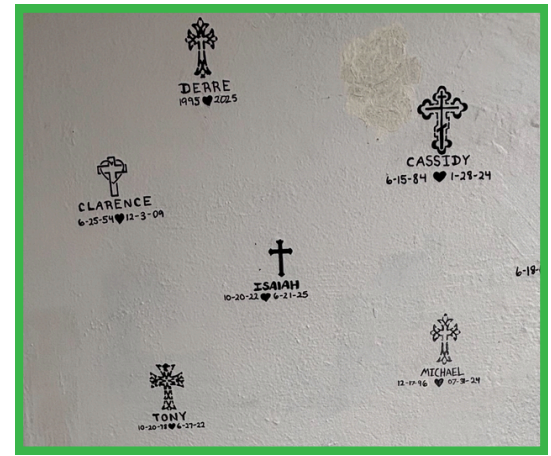
Relationships Build Resilience

Kids attending our Resilient Kids after-school program began the year an average of 24 months (2 years) behind in key developmental measures. Over the course of 12 months, our kids averaged a growth in development of 20 months per child. Our relational approach is working! Through long-term supportive connections and positive experiences, kids are rebuilding what trauma and hopelessness have taken from them.

Neighborhood Realities

- 86% of students at our local neighborhood schools are economically disadvantaged
- Tulsa's child neglect and abuse rate is twice the national average
- 853 violent crimes were committed within 2 miles of the Rose Bowl*
- 761 evictions were filed within 2 miles of the Rose Bowl*

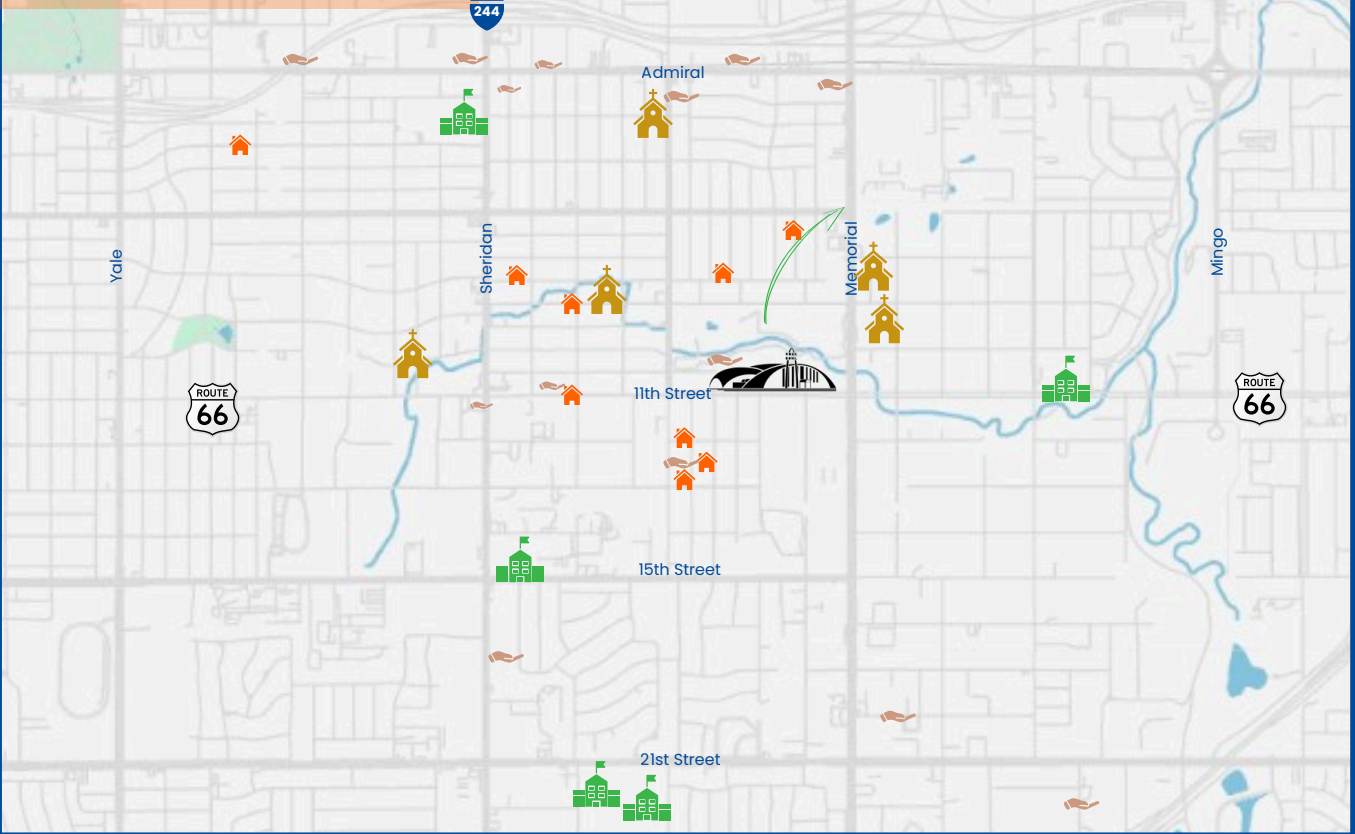

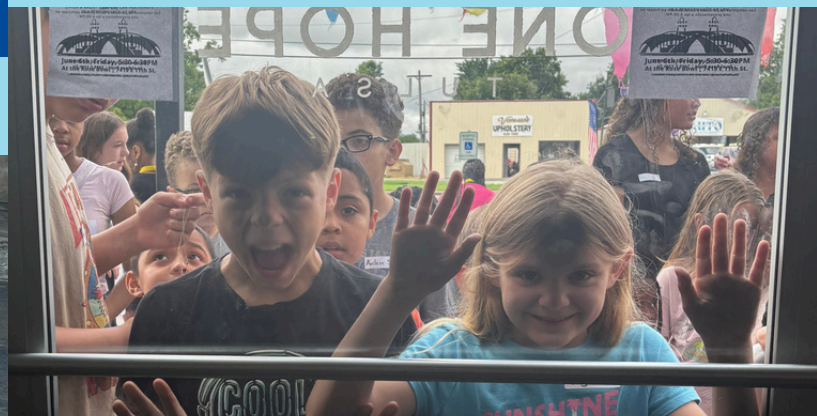
- 10 interns from six colleges and over 200 intern alumni
