# WHO?

Fellows are recent college graduates who move into northeast Tulsa to join One Hope in urban ministry work under the discipleship of the One Hope staff. Applicants should be interested in urban ministry, missional living, and nonprofit work. Applicants must be members in good standing at a local church and can expect the fellowship to be equivalent to an 11 month missions trip.

# WHAT?

- Fellows live in the neighborhood around the Rose Bowl, alongside the neighbors One Hope serves. Fellows attend Springs of Grace Church in this neighborhood.
- Fellows gain hands-on experience in multiple areas of urban ministry; they will grow their skills for creative problem solving and collaboration in a multi-stake holder environment and build their capacity for life alongside their neighbors.
- Fellows serve as key team members in One Hope's kids and youth programs, community outreaches, and neighborhood events alongside staff members.
- Fellows learn about the Imago Dei, racial reconciliation, trauma care, peacemaking in the midst of violence, the priority and purpose of the local church, kingdom economics, reading the Bible with the poor, prophetic imagination and lament, incarnational living, human-centered design, and more.
- Fellows are housed in the community and receive a small monthly stipend.

One Hope Tulsa is a community-based non-profit cultivating safe spaces and relationships for neighborhood flourishing in Northeast Tulsa. We pursue our mission through kids, youth, and family programs, neighborhood care, and leadership development.

Northeast Tulsa neighbors experience high levels of trauma due to poverty, racial injustice, violence, and struggling institutions. Because of this, our approach is trauma-responsive, local church-based, and focused on our neighbors on the margins.

# WHO?

One Hope fellows are young men and women who have graduated college or are at least 21 years old and are interested in being discipled in urban ministry, missional living, and nonprofit work. Fellows should be members in good standing at a local church and must be willing to live in Tulsa for 11 months to participate in the fellowship full time.

# WHAT?

- Fellows live in the neighborhood around the Rose Bowl, alongside the community One Hope serves. Fellows attend Springs of Grace Church in this neighborhood.
- Fellows gain hands-on experience in multiple areas of urban ministry and will grow their skills for creative problem solving and collaboration in a multi-stake holder environment and will build their capacity for life alongside their neighbors.
- Fellows serve as key team members in One Hope's kids and youth programs, community outreaches, and neighborhood events alongside staff members.
- Fellows learn about the Imago Dei, racial reconciliation, trauma care, peacemaking in the midst of violence, the priority and purpose of the local church, kingdom economics, reading the Bible with the poor, prophetic imagination and lament, incarnational living, and more.
- Fellows receive room and board, along with a small monthly stipend.

# WHERE?

One Hope Tulsa is a nonprofit community development organization working to cultivate safe spaces and relationships for neighborhood flourishing in Northeast Tulsa. We pursue this mission through kids, youth, and family programs, neighborhood care, and leadership development. Our approach is trauma-responsive, local church-based, and focused on our neighbors on the margins.

# WHY?

- Northeast Tulsa neighbors experience high levels of trauma due to poverty, racial injustice, violence, and struggling institutions among other factors.
- Oklahoma has some of the highest rates in the nation of childhood trauma, which has a direct negative impact on long-term health and educational outcomes. Children growing up in high-poverty neighborhoods are much more likely to experience trauma.
- Tulsa's history includes racism and disenfranchisement from its outset, including the Tulsa Race Massacre; Racial Injustice causes deep inequities in our neighborhood to this day.
- Even in the midst of relational brokenness, our neighborhood is a place of hope and healing because of Jesus. We believe God deeply loves our neighbors, and we are committed to developing servant leaders with a heart for communities on the margins.
