

TINY TEETH EXPRESS ORAL HEALTH PROGRAM

Tiny Teeth Express provides mobile preventive dental services to ECEAP programs, Headstart/EHS, preschools, and community centers.

Our preventive services are covered 100% by Medicaid/Apple Health/Molina at no cost to families or schools. Professional licensed dental hygienists bring quality care directly to kids at their schools, saving families from missing work and kids from missing school. Our visits are quick, easy, and fun for kids! There is never a charge to the school or facility. TTE follows strict infection control guidelines put in place by the CDC & Washington State DOH. Partnering in community efforts with Delta Dental of Washington, Arcora Foundation, Smile Spokane, Better Health Together, Communities in Schools and several local and county health districts, Toothsavers is the largest school oral health program in the state of Washington, serving over 350 schools.

Tiny Teeth Express' goal is to provide interim preventive services in schools but also to connect families to a "dental home".

How our school-based program works....

- For ECEAP/Headstart/Early HS programs we offer oral screenings and fluoride treatments (both varnish and silver diamine which can actually reverse cavities). We also offer dental sealants for children 3 years and older. Sealants are proven to decrease tooth decay rates by up to 80%!
- Our oral screenings count toward the "dental encounter" requirement needed for ECEAP enrollment purposes.
- Children 18 months and older may receive fluoride treatments and 3 and older may receive sealants (a thin resin material, coating the grooves of the back teeth where cavities happen most).
- For babies under 18 months of age we will only provide oral screenings.
- Each child receives a toothbrush & prize.
- The first step is to set a clinic date for your site. You will then pass out our provided consent forms to families. They will need to sign & return if they would like their child to receive fluoride or sealants. If a child does not turn in a form we can still provide a visual screening as long as the parent/guardian did not opt their child out.
- Our visual screenings not only count toward EHS/HS/ECEAP enrollment requirements, but they can also detect early oral health concerns and potential emergencies.
