New for 2024

The State has moved to a semi open primary.

You ask what does that mean?

Well if you are currently not enrolled in a
political party you can choose from the available
party ballots and cast your vote without
enrolling into that political party. Meaning an
unenrolled voter can choose either the
Democratic or Republican Ballot for
the Primary Election.

If you are enrolled into any party then you are
only eligible for that party ballot.

Building permit applications are often incomplete, lacking information and unsigned. Please carefully review the application and provide all the requested information (including signature and date). Reviewing your application for content and accuracy prior to submittal will prevent unnecessary delays and additional correspondence.

Exemption Forms Due by April 1, 2024

Homestead Exemption: Letter and application mailed to eligible residents on January 23rd. Those eligible can get \$25,000 off your valuation. Once applied, there is no need to re-apply.

Farmland: Letter requesting income from the past 5 years was mailed to those that are enrolled on

years was mailed to those that are enrolled on January 24th. Income report must be filed every 5 years.

Tree Growth: Letter requesting classification compliance from a licensed forester was mailed to those enrolled on January 24th. Classification Compliance must be filed every 10 years.

MOTOR VEHICLE UPDATES

Title Law has Changed.

Vehicles more than 25 years old no longer will require a title here in Maine. So 1998's and older are now exempt from title procedures.

100% Disabled Veterans
The State has had some difficulty
interpreting the new excise tax
exemption law for veterans who
classified as 100% disabled.

Currently motor vehicle has advised us if you are classified as a 100% disabled veteran, you can register all vehicles under the excise tax exemption law, this does not exempt the state registration fees unless you display the disabled veteran plate.

The Veteran is required to provide proof of "total, service-connected disability" in the

form of a current Department of VA Benefit

ASSESSING

Properties get assessed annually according to building permits that get pulled or any significant changes to properties.

Please keep in mind that if you pulled any permits between April 1, 2023 and April 1, 2024, our assessing agent, Dave Ledew will be stopping by your property to assess your changes between the months of March 2024 to May 2024.

Soldiers Memorial Library Update

Thanks to the monies received from the Maine State Library we have begun to move forward with the improvements to Soldiers Memorial Library.

As a result our building has become more comfortable and efficient. Added workspaces have been included for folks who need space for their own laptops and work materials. We currently have three desktop computers and three laptop computers for use by patrons and we plan to upgrade the desk tops and add two new laptops in the next couple of months. Knowing that the library isn't always the quietest place (hurray for storytime!), we have purchased several pairs of noise canceling headphones for patrons who need to boost their concentration with some quiet time.

With the coming of spring and warmer days we will be beginning construction on our outdoor pavilion. This outdoor space is designed to support our patrons with fast Wi-fi, electrical outlets, device charging stations, and comfortable seating. Our hope is that this outdoor space will provide service outside our open library hours, be a fresh air alternative to patrons who prefer to meet with others out of doors, and come to be a place our community will use to enjoy our beautiful spot here in Hiram.

January we held our first open house for remote workers and have developed a questionnaire to help us develop programs that fit your needs -please come into the library and fill one out -this is your library and your input is valuable. The library is for everyone and has many valuable resources come by for a visit!

Our goal was to provide information about what we have done so far, what we are planning, and to receive feedback from our patrons about what they need to support their work goals.

Here at Soldiers Memorial Library we are interested in supporting patron work goals of all kinds. If you have a remote career and need some quiet space or a change of scenery, if you are working on your family genealogy, if you are taking classes online, if you are looking for a new job, it's all work!



Hiram Historical Society Ridlon Schoolhouse Restoration

Thanks to the efforts of many volunteers and the generosity of owner Shane Lajoie, the Historical Society has started dismantling the old Ridlon Schoolhouse, one of the few remaining one-room schools in the area dating back to the early 1800's. The Ossipee Valley Agricultural Society (Ossipee Valley Fair folks!) recently joined in the effort, and Tear Cap Workshops is helping.

The plan is to salvage the old timber frame and other original materials, label and store them within the next weeks and then fund raise to rebuild the structure on the fairgrounds as enthusiasm grows for the benefit of the community. We are very fortunate to have skilled local people volunteering to help supervise and keep costs down.



Recent photo of Ridlon School, originally built in 1819. Most old, one-room schools in Maine have been demolished, left to decay, or now serve other purposes – private homes, museums, town halls, etc.

Once the school has been rebuilt, local students and community members will have an opportunity to "look into, as well as experience" rural education in the early 1800's.
