Ridlon School Project

In keeping with Hiram Historical Society's mission, we undertook an ambitious project to save Hiram's oldest existing schoolhouse, Ridlon Schoolhouse, opened in 1819. We formed a coalition of two other non-profit organizations in Hiram – the Ossipee Valley Agricultural Society and Tear Cap Workshops along with hardy volunteers— to plan its preservation. Unfortunately, we could not move the building intact, so we deconstructed it, saved salvageable posts and beams and stored them safely until we could rebuild it on the Ossipee Valley Fairgrounds. We are committed to recreating it as an historically accurate representation of education as our ancestors experienced it in the 1800's and early 1900's. It will be easily accessible to students in nearby SAD55 which is a bonus to all concerned.

The rebuilding phase will require funds to purchase materials and furnish Ridlon Schoolhouse. We look forward to coordinating with OVAS on fundraising so watch for an announcement about these opportunities. We welcome any contributions to support this project and any ideas about how to raise this money.
