Updated and new laws

Below are a few updates and changes for the 2022-2023 hunting seasons. As a hunter it is you responsibility to view all of Maine's hunting laws.

Antlerless Deer Permits: Beginning in 2022, a licensed hunter with an antlerless deer permit can harvest an antlerless deer in the designated district **and** an antlered deer statewide. Learn more about antlerless deer permits and apply for a permit online.

Persons may take antierless deer without an antierless deer permit only in designated WMDs/subunits during the regular archery and crossbow season and on Youth Deer Hunting Day. An antierless deer permit is required in non-designated WMDs/subunits. Learn more about deer hunting laws.

Bear Trapping Permit Requirements: Effective as of January 1, 2022, to purchase a bear trapping permit you have three options. Under one of these options, a person may trap a bear with their big game hunting license as long as they have taken the NEW Black Bear Trapping Education course and obtained a bear trapping permit. Learn more about the 3 options to purchase a bear trapping permit.

Civil Trespass with Hunting Dog: If you plan to hunt bear, bobcat, coyote, raccoon, and fox with dogs, OR train for bear, fox, and raccoon, <u>click here to learn about the new Civil Trespass</u> with Hunting Dog law and Dog Training and Hunting Permit requirement.

TRI-TOWN WASTE FACILITY NOW HAS SCALES!!

The Scales have been installed and are running for residents up and Baldwin, Hiram and Porter. As you may have seen in the Shopping Guide, Tri-Town has applied for an amendment to their license with DEP. The amendment is to possibly allow in the near future Parsonsfield and later Cornish residents to bring their demolition debris, metals and bulky waste to the station for a fee. The fees they will pay per pound on the scale is higher than the member town fee. No household waste, electronics, or recyclables will be accepted from these towns at the station. We are waiting to hear from DEP on the amendment and working out the fee schedule and paperwork for when we are ready to accept from Parsonsfield residents first.

2022 TAX BILLS WERE MAILED OUT JULY 14TH, 2022



- Looks like the tax rate only increased by 11 cents this year.
- Interest will begin September 13TH, 2022. If you have your taxes escrowed through your mortgage company, make sure you forward your bill onto them or check with the office to see if your mortgage company has contacted us for the amount of taxes owed.
- Taxes are based on property conditions and completion of construction as
 of April 1st. Bills are mailed to the property owner as of April 1st.
 - If you demolished a building or portion of after April 1st, you will still be taxed for that building or portion of in 2022 taxes but will be removed for 2023 taxes upon notification from property owner or seen by assessor.
- If you sold your property or purchased your property after April 1st, 2022, the tax bill will be mailed to the previous owner according to Maine State Law. The proration of the taxes should have been taken care of at your closing.
- If you have changed your mailing address in the last year, make sure we have your current address.
- You can get a copy of the tax bill on our website or by calling the town
 office and we can email you a copy.
- If you have any questions concerning your assessment or tax bill, feel free to call the office and we will assist you. Terry can go over the assessments with you and if questions not answered we can have you meet with our Assessor, Dave Ledew.





HIRAM HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The 2021 recipient of the Hubert W. Clemons Award for Outstanding Service to the Town of Hiram is the Grand Dame of Hiram. She has quietly participated in many Hiram organizations over many years – volunteering at the Congregational Church, cooking for suppers at the Grange, long before they closed. She is a gifted knitter and seamstress and has donated many hand-made items for their sales, as she does for Soldiers Memorial Library, and has done for the Hiram Historical Society. You can see the apron she made for her mother out of a grain sack upstairs in this Museum, Great Ossipee Museum- grain sacks weren't just for flour and their designs are beautiful, in case you don't know! She has been a trustee of Soldiers Memorial Library and the Hiram Historical Society for many years. For generations she has been the gracious hostess of Wadsworth Hall, which she has opened to the public in the Sacopee Valley Adult & Community Education program and on many other occasions. And significantly – but coincidently - for this day, June 12, 2022, the day of the long-awaited program on Longfellow, she is the protector of the bedroom of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow at Wadsworth Hall when he visited his beloved grandfather, Hiram's founder, General Peleg Wadsworth. We are happy to present the 2021 Hubert W. Clemons Award for Outstanding Service to the Town of Hiram to Susan Douglas Moulton.

• The Boston Post Cane Award began in August 1909 when the then Publisher of the newspaper "The Boston Post" Edwin A Grozier forwarded to 700 Select Boards in Towns (no cities included) in New England a gold-headed ebony cane with the request that it be bestowed with the Boston Post to the oldest male citizen of the town. Towns today recognize the oldest resident, male or female.

Alice Elizabeth Wadsworth Receives the Boston Post Cane and Pin at age 97 in a ceremony at her home on 20 April 2022

In a ceremony in her home on April 20, 2022, Alice Wadsworth received the Boston Post Cane as oldest resident of the Town of Hiram. Williams also presented the Boston Post Cane Pin to Alice, which is hers to wear and keep. Also attending the ceremony were Alice's son Lee Alan Wadsworth and his wife Sue, and Marylou Stacey, Town Clerk of the Town of Hiram.

WELCOME! FIRST FRUITS MARKET



We welcome First Fruits Farm Market, at the corner of Durgintown and South Hiram Roads, a market selling fresh produce grown on the Amish settlement on Sunrise Lane, and other products made in Maine. Five families contribute to the enterprise – some grow vegetables (organically or least-toxic), some bake bread and cookies, small fried fruit pies on Fridays, glazed donuts on Saturdays (delicious, we can attest!). Fried pies and donuts sell out early! Three hundred donuts sold out by noon on one Saturday, so production was ramped up to 400 for the following Saturday. Other products include jams, jellies, maple syrup, cheese, and sturdy wooden chairs, at reasonable prices, all grown or made in other Amish communities in Maine in Wales and Unity. The rocker pictured had a price tag of \$209.



The Amish community also provides other services, such as shoeing horses, applying insulation, and small carpentry jobs. The best way to contact the right provider is to inquire at the store – open Monday through Saturday, 9:00am to 5:00pm.

The store is plain and simple and easy to follow, as you can see in the photograph. The Amish do not like their photographs taken - they do not believe in "graven images" – but this is in a public setting and no individual is



identified.

The store opened on June 17, and it was their one-month anniversary when we visited. We trust there will be many more!



If you pay court ordered child support, you may be able to deduct the current amounts paid from your household income.

If your household income is over the HEAP income guidelines, you may be able to deduct a portion of the amount you paid for medical expenses.
