I read an article written by a pastor friend of mine which I think is very appropriate for the New Year. He noted that the Bible frequently speaks about the "new thing" that God is working in our lives. Yet many times we miss the "new thing" God is doing because we stay focused on our past; the baggage, the hurts, the failures, the disappointments. These events so

affect our lives that most of us have a difficult time moving beyond the baggage that comes with such events. Every parent knows that children from birth to 1 year old, or who weigh less than 20 pounds, must be secured in a rear-facing child safety seat. Once that safety requirement has been met, you are able to turn those seats around and the child can suddenly see forward. They can see what is happening in front of them, instead of only seeing life as it goes past them. A lot of us who no longer sit in car seats need to turn our seats forward. We need to stop looking and living only in the past at what used to be, and begin to look forward as Isaiah said, "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing!" God is always doing a "new thing" in our lives. I believe that our attitude toward the New Year will depend on which direction our seat is facing. When we dwell on the past, we dwell on what cannot be changed and that inevitably leads to despair. When we face the future we look for the "new thing" God will be doing in our lives. This year make sure your seat is facing forward, so you will experience all that God is doing in your life. You won't want to miss a single thing the Lord brings in this New Year. - Love in

**Dear Prayer Partners:** 

It hardly seems possible that in a few short days we will be remembering the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. All churches here will be full every night during Holy Week. We pray that the true meaning of redemption might be clearly presented and that many may put their faith in Christ alone.

The Seminary choir going on a tour to Mexico City this weekend, and will present a cantata "What Great Love". The church choir which I accompany will also be going to churches in Cancún over Palm Sunday weekend. Here in Mexico we have 2 weeks of vacation (April 1-15), so the second week, following a wedding, we will be visiting some friends in Cozumel for R & R. We have had many weddings and baptisms since December, and also keep busy in the Seminary.

A grand birthday event was our granddaughter's 15<sup>th</sup> birthday celebration. This is a big observance in Latin America, second only to a wedding. The main purpose (for Christians) is a Thanksgiving service to the Lord for allowing the girl to have lived 15 years. Mark, our son, gave his daughter Ellie a blessing with a Hebrew prayer shawl and also a "purity ring", while our daughter-in-law presented her with a Bible.

Will and Nancy Ackles have been here with us the past month. Will comes every year to teach in February and March. We appreciate all their help and encouragement. He and Dave have conducted various services together, including the baptism and first birthday of Ema's daughter (Ema worked for me many years and graduated from college with a social work degree).

We are anxiously awaiting the arrival of our daughter Debbie March 22. She will be here 9 days, seeking employment opportunities. She has lined up some interviews with schools here.

On March 10 a work group from Trinity EPC (Detroit area) arrived to finish laying floor tiles in the library building,  $2^{nd}$  floor. Due to the poor economy and the bad eye Mexico has in the news, it is hard to get a group together. However, 5 very committed folks have come; two are staying here at the house and the others at the Seminary. They know that this part of Mexico is very safe. There is a police presence, but they have done a good job at keeping violence out of Yucatan. We are very happy living here. Temperatures have been quite warm in the past few weeks (upper 90's), with lows around 70°. We are dreading April and May with its very hot (over 100°) temperatures.

Since Mexico has a holiday Monday March 19, our Camp committee decided to run a special 3-day camp over that weekend for 12-15 year olds. We expect around 50 young people there, some from village churches that Dave has been visiting. Thank you for your prayers for our camping ministry!

Rodolfo of Yalcobá, whom we mentioned in our last couple of letters, who had believed and then fallen a couple of time back into his drinking habit, has repented and asked forgiveness of the Lord and of the congregation. He hopes to be baptized and make public his profession of faith in the coming months. Continue to pray for him.

Health-wise, I have had some minor problems lately. In April I will have a cyst on my back removed, that has been bothering me. I have also had, because of my crooked spinal column, much muscular pain above the left hip area, and had to do bed rest for a while. But we are thankful there are no serious problems ... just some "molestias", as we say in Spanish.

We wish each of you a meaningful time of reflection during this Lent and Easter season. Rejoice: He is alive forevermore!

Our Session has been discussing issues in the PC (USA) for a number of months. At our last meeting, the Session decided that the congregation be given the opportunity to hear some of the issues and to share their thoughts. This took place Sunday, April 29th, at a Fellowship Supper. This information session is only the first of several that will be held. The Session wants to be sure that all

members are given the opportunity to understand the issues and ask questions before any formal decision is made. Maintaining unity and harmony in our church is a primary priority of the Session and your pastor. We are also committed to following the presbytery's policy in handling these matters.

Locally, McBee, Westminster –Florence, and Darlington are three churches in New Harmony Presbytery who have left our presbytery to go to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. The Session of First Florence has recommended leaving New Harmony to go to the ECO. (Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians) Their vote is scheduled for June 24.

An upcoming issue of note is that fourteen presbyteries have sent overtures or concurred with overtures sent to the 2012 General Assembly to allow same-sex marriage. Thirteen presbyteries have sent overtures or concurred with overtures to forbid same-sex marriage. Please pray for the Bishopville church, for our presbytery, and for our denomination. We need wisdom and discernment, as well as understanding and patience. The fervent prayer of the righteous avails much. Love in Christ, Ken



#### Creative approaches to Bible translation and distribution



When we think of the history of Bible translation we might picture St. Jerome and his team of scholars working to translate the Scriptures into Latin in the late fourth century, or perhaps Cyril and Methodius in the eight century creating a Slavic alphabet for the sake of Bible translation among Slavic peoples. We might picture Martin Luther hiding in Wartburg Castle translating the New Testament into German, or perhaps Cameron Townsend in the early 20th century, when he began working among the Cakchiquel people of Guatemala. In one way or another, all of these were pioneers in their day, working in innovative ways to reach the unreached.

#### Bible translation for the deaf

One of the more interesting Bible translation efforts going on today is for the approximately 20 million deaf people of the world, of which only about 2% are effectively reached with the gospel of Christ. This makes them one of the most unreached people groups in the world. It is estimated that there are anywhere from 250 to 400 sign languages in the world, only one of which, American sign language, has a written New Testament. Bible translation is now underway in about 50 sign languages. Translations for the deaf are usually on DVD with videotaped signers, though in some cases the video translation uses animation. This is the case particularly in places where, for security reasons, signers do not want their identity known.

#### **Online distribution**

Another way biblical texts are being distributed is through posting them online. This is especially useful in places where people have internet access but where, for political or religious reasons,



Bibles may not be distributed openly. Various websites exist, and Scripture in various forms can be found there – MP3 audio portions, text, or even video clips.

#### **Cell phones**

Bible texts are also being distributed through cell phone transmission. It is estimated that there are nearly 6 billion cell phone subscribers in the world today, which is around 87% of the world's population. The technology involved is changing and advancing at a dizzying rate, but missionaries are working to

find ways to harness this technology to distribute translated Scripture portions. Now boundaries that would otherwise have been impassable are being crossed to reach people with the translated Scripture.

#### Where are they now?

We occasionally have contact with some of the students we worked with in Kenya five and six years ago. Recently I corresponded with Peter Garang, who is an ordained minister in the Anglican Church of South Sudan. Peter is working as the regional coordinator for the African Leadership and Reconciliation Ministries, working to bring peace in war-torn regions of South Sudan. Unfortunately, his family is unable to be with him due to war and lack of educational opportunity in South Sudan, so they are in Nairobi, where he visits them three or four times a year.

Bethuel Kivuya ministers among the Kam and Idou pygmy peoples of eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo. He has been doing church planting and community development work, and his wife is involved in counseling, especially among women whose lives have been ravaged by warfare. They are earnestly hoping that a well project can begin among the pygmies, as many lives are lost due to the use of impure

drinking water. Recently Bethuel and Noella have been in Sierra Leone, West Africa, training people for Christian ministry.






#### News from the Session...



#### **Dear Prayer Partners:**



"I will bless the Lord at all times, His praise shall continually be in my mouth ... oh, magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt His name together". (Ps 34:1,3)

We thank the Lord for His protection and blessing over the many kilometers we travel each weekend. A new extension seminary opened in Cancún with 8 students. They alternate their classes between Cancún and Playa del Carmen, both cities being a 4-hour drive from Mérida. Dave taught an Old Testament Biblical Theology course on 4 consecutive Friday evenings. The classes are from 7 to 11 p.m. Then he got up at 5 a.m. in order to drive and arrive at his 9 a.m. Saturday class in Citilcum (near Izamal).

Recently we made a long weekend out of it and visited various villages out that way. Rodolfo, in Yalcobá, did not pass the test to make his profession of faith and baptism, because he fell to drinking one weekend. He will now have to wait 6 months to deepen his under-standing and see if he can gain victory over his drinking problem. We wish you could have been with us on another night, for the outside service of renovation of wedding vows in Chemax with a couple who had had serious marital problems in the recent past. They served us a meal of chicken in a tasty broth with hand-made tortillas eaten under the trees, with huge beetles buzzing around our heads and landing in unwanted places.

The next day we visited the town of Señor in Quintana Roo, a village where Dave's Dad first took the gospel 65 years ago. Don Anastacio, an elderly man who is a moving force in the church there along with his family, received us graciously in his home. I talked with his wife doña Julia as she made the tortillas for our lunch on a griddle over an open fire in the thatched roof kitchen. She can understand Spanish but speaks only Maya. So while Dave was conversing in Maya with her husband, she and I had an interesting bi-lingual conversation, but we both understood each other! Her husband, who plays keyboard, accordion and guitar by ear, was so overcome with emotion while I played hymns on his keyboard, that he cried as he prayed, thanking the Lord for our visit. We return there this Saturday and hope to minister to them again.

On May 26 we will again be in Tabi, where Dave's Dad did much of the translation of the New Testament into Maya. Dave preached there back in March at an outdoor meeting of all the churches in the area: over 1,000 people attended. Afterwards we were all served "cochinita pibil" (pork roasted underground on hot coals) and hand-made tortillas with which to make our tacos. At the same service I was handed some music I had never seen and asked to accompany a choir. A man with his cell phone flashlight beamed the light on the music so I could see it. I didn't have to worry about the rhythm – the director didn't know too much either! I just played the notes and followed him. Debbie's fiancé went with us and helped as our chauffeur.

Debbie's job interviews went very well. With her bi-lingual abilities and administrative experience, she was wanted by all. She returns to Mérida June 2 and will decide where she will be teaching. She and Rolando plan a July 27 wedding. Our son Daniel and family will be coming, so hopefully we can get an updated family photo out to you. Johnny, Mark's 11 year old, will play the Canon in D on his guitar for them to march in. Thank you for your prayers for her.

Our Seminary graduation will be June 14. This year some 20 students will be graduating in theology and 8 in music. However, enrollment has been down the past couple of years due to the economic situation, so future graduating classes will be smaller. At present Dave is grading senior sermons, and I'm getting my students ready for the June 5 piano recital. We praise the Lord for all these students.

I was sick one weekend, very unusual for me, and was left with no energy. Some lab tests showed I had a hemoglobin count of 7 (normal is 15), so I'm having iron shots and vitamins, and feel much better. My macular degeneration due to an arthritis medicine is making driving almost impossible. I can read if I have good illumination, but I now fall into the "low vision" category. I should retain the vision I have, however.

Dave has received good medical reports, so we always thank the Lord for continuing to strengthen us as we serve Him. This July marks 45 years since we first came down here together. What an incredible life we have had! In September we will celebrate our 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary here, with a musical concert of thanksgiving for the Lord's blessings. As a result, we will not be traveling to the States this year at all. Don't let up on your prayers!

We will miss seeing many of you, but you are in our thoughts and prayers. May the Lord richly bless you.




# The SCROLL Happy Birthday

Mérida, Yucatán June 21, 2012 Yesterday's high: 88° (rain) Last night's low: 74

#### **Dear Prayer Partners:**

This is just a quick note to bring you up-to-date, to thank the Lord with us for His many blessings, and to continue to pray for us.

Debbie arrived June 2 and found a job as English coordinator in a private grade school. She will be teaching 6<sup>th</sup> graders 10 hours a week, and doing some administrative work as well. The Lord is using many of her abilities! She and Rolando also found a small house to rent only 5 minutes from us, so both she and Mark will be nearby. July 27 is the date of the wedding, with Rolando's uncle preaching and Dave doing the marrying. Thank you for your prayers for her.

Seminary graduation was June 14. A heavy rainstorm caused it to be held in the library building instead of outside. Hundreds of people came, and were seated or standing in any space available. This year 20 students graduated with a theology degree, and 3 with a master's degree (a program started a few years back). Eight graduated from the music school. The senior recitals of the previous week were very good: 2 girls in choir direction, 2 young men as piano majors, one voice major and 3 in a new major of coordination of praise groups. We trust the Lord to direct each one to an area of service for Him. Dan Isaac, whom we help through you, has one more year to go. Tuition is now \$275 a month.

Saturday June 16 there was a united service for all the Presbyterian churches of the Peninsula (Yucatán, Campeche and Quintana Roo) held in Cancún. It was called to celebrate 140 years since the arrival of the gospel in Mexico and 65 years of the founding of the General Assembly of the National Church. Some 5,000 people attended, and we enjoyed seeing friends, alumni of the Seminary in music and theology, and pastors, some of whom we hadn't seen in years. Dave received a recognition for his work in the General Assembly.

We were happy to spend the night at Ramón (Moncho) Celis' home. However, Dave didn't get too much sleep because he got in at 3 a.m. after taking Rodolfo and his wife for whom we have been praying, to the meeting and back home to their village of Yalcobá. Dave was invited to preach at Moncho's church the next morning, and then we drove to Mérida in time to preach at our congregation in the evening, where he also gave communion and attended a Father's Day program afterwards. So we had a very full weekend (as most are, ...he also had a funeral service in another town Saturday morning on the way to Cancún!).

Camp will be held the last week of July and the first week of August, for children and young people. We now have to charge \$50 dollars a week, plus transportation. Any scholarship help would be greatly appreciated.

I don't know when we will write again, but we trust the Lord's blessing on you in these summer months. We will be thinking of you even though we can't get up to the States to see any of you.




#### **174th Homecoming** ~ October 14th






As you are aware, your Session has been working very hard for more than a year to understand the facts and implications of issues going on in our denomination, the Presbyterian Church(USA), to make a decision as to whether they should recommend any response to the members of our church, to


decide what that response should be, and finally to provide the congregation the opportunity to become fully informed about the issues and facts, and the rational for their recommendation. The Session from the beginning wanted to move slowly and deliberately. They wanted to take time to pray, discuss, reflect, and pray some more. They also were committed to following the Gracious Dismissal policy of New Harmony Presbytery. The policy requires that if a church is going to consider seeking dismissal from the Presbytery and the PC(USA) that the Session must request that the presbytery form a Presbytery response team to help the church navigate through the process. The request was made in July. The Administrative Council of New Harmony Presbytery has now approved the formation of our church's PRT and approved the 5 members that will serve on it. The first meeting of the PRT with the Session has been scheduled.

With all these things in place the Session will be setting into motion its plan. Every member of this church will receive an information packet on Sunday, Dec 9th with the Session's recommendation. Those not present will be mailed their copy of the information packet. A series of information sessions and town hall meetings will also be scheduled. The Session will take the time to personally contact all the members of our church to answer questions and communicate important information. The session is committed to helping you, the members of this church, to become fully informed about why we are seeking dismissal and to which Presbyterian denomination we will go, because the final decision is yours.

Please pray fervently and often for the Session, the PRT, and our congregation.

**Dear Friends and Prayer Partners:** 

It is early for a Christmas letter, but someone is going to the States and can take mail. Then again, it is <u>always</u> time to be thankful for God's blessings in our lives, our work, our family. "In <u>everything</u> give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (1 Thess. 5:18).

We are thankful for the gift of life and health. In recent days Dave turned 75, and I 72. The music school students brought me a surprise serenade – very touching. It doesn't seem possible, but after our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, it must be true! We thank the Lord for the times of blessing as well as of hardship. These last have helped us to grow and mature and be strong in our faith, knowing that "...<u>all</u> things work together for good to those who love God and are called according to His purpose" (Rom. 8:28). Our physical ailments are quite minor. We can continue to serve the Lord with the strength He gives us.

This past October Dave was named president (moderator) for 2 years of the Synod of the Peninsula of Yucatan, which covers 12 presbyteries over a three state area (Yucatan, Quintana Roo and Campeche). Though he will no longer be pastoring a specific congregation, he has more invitations to preach and teach each weekend. He will continue to visit three small mission churches (in Yalcobá and in Chemax in the east, and Temax in the north) to serve communion every month.

I take my keyboard and play it wherever we go. Besides the towns I have mentioned, we have also recently been in the towns of Tahmek, Dzitbalché, Dzoncauich, Hop'elchén, Chunjujub, Tixcacaltuyub, (try to pronounce all those good Maya names!). I also sell Bibles, hymnals and other Christian literature. In all these places there are many brothers and sisters whom we have known over the years, so there is always a mutual joy in seeing each other again. The calendar for the rest of the year is very full as well. My Merida church choir will be presenting a Christmas cantata in different congregations that are sponsored by the Divine Savior church. My eyesight has deteriorated some, and I now carry a special lamp with me in order to see the music I have to play, since the lighting is often so poor.

The Seminary is doing well, we praise the Lord for that. Its president Rev. Amós Cahuich was just appointed for another 4 years. Dave has been teaching a heavy load – 5 subjects this semester. Next semester should be lighter. He is now listening and grading the "senior sermons" of the 9 fourth year students he has.

My first year piano students are <u>all</u> doing exceptionally well ... not one is lazy or doesn't practice! The seminary choir's Christmas concert will be held December 12. Classes will resume on January 21, after all the presbyteries in the area have had their meetings. Many thanks to those of you who are helping Dan Isaac complete his last year of music training. He is very grateful to each of you.

Our Daniel and his wife are both teaching; their 3 children are now all in school. We enjoy seeing our daughter Debbie nearly every day, after her 18-year absence from Yucatan. She is adjusting well to life in Mexico again, and of course to her new married life. However, she does miss her nephews and niece back in St. Louis, and all the friends she made while in the States. Mark and Altia's congregation grows, although their personal financial needs are great. We truly thank the Lord for the blessing of Christian families (our own children!) that are teaching <u>their</u> children how to live the Christian life.

We trust you can find many things for which to be thankful this Thanksgiving season; not only the blessings but also the difficulties. As Christmas approaches, may we also be thankful for God's wonderful gift, and what it meant for Him to give us His only Son. I am ending with a small quote that came to us in a recent email ... may we all appreciate Christ's great sacrifice.

Was ever a gift like the Savior given? He leaves the bosom of the eternal Father, and comes to the bosom of an earthly mother. The Son of God becomes the son of Mary. The Infinite becomes an infant. He who holds the world in His arms is held in the arms of a frail woman. He whose garment is space, whose house is the universe, whose chariots are the clouds and whose diadems are the stars is wrapped in swaddling bands, and laid in a manger. ... He leaves the throne of heaven, for the Cross outside the city wall. He who is the Prince of life bows His head in death. He who is without sin becomes the Sin-bearer.
