



Dear Prayer Partners,

"There is a time for everything... a time to be born and a time to die... a time to weep and a time to laugh... He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the hearts of men." Ecclesiastes 3:1-11

The Lord has brought happiness and new life into our family with the birth of Diego Andre, Debbie and Rolando's first child, born January 1. As you can imagine, grandchild #6 has changed life and routines for all of us in this house, but is dearly loved, a gift from the Lord. Nearly all who see him comment on how much he looks like his grandpa Dave. Although Dave has been with the Lord for two years, we now have his "representative" with us!

The seminary opened in January for students in the master's degree extension program. In February regular classes began and an international group of students working on doctorates in theology met here. My first year piano students are working on their recital pieces and growing both in music skills and in their knowledge of God's word.

In December I purchased a 2009 Chevrolet Aveo with low mileage, which has now covered many new miles. With the arrival of Dr. Will and Nancy Ackles at the end of January (here to teach at the seminary), I have been able to visit many villages to encourage believers and to sell Bibles and Christian literature. Most of these believers want the resources but have no access to them unless I can go to where they are because the distances and costs of getting to a Bible bookstore are just too great for them. For example, in Carrillo Puerto in the state of Quintana Roo, where Dave lived 1947-1950, Will shared two studies on parables and I sold over \$800 worth of books. A lovely Maya couple there shared with us the way they came to faith in Christ. There are now three Christian couples in their nearby town, a community that for the most part practices the old Maya ways. In the town of Señor, a very dear old Maya believer had me play his church's new keyboard while he sang and then prayed for us.

A visit with the believers in Chemax and Yalcobá was very rewarding for all, but I was saddened to learn that Rodolfo, who recently made his profession of faith, has fallen once again to the temptation of alcohol. Please pray for this dear man. In Chemax, God's timing was perfect. That week, Samuel Hoil, who pastors the smaller of the two churches, had a conversation with three young men who had never read the Bible before in their lives. They accepted Samuel's invitation to attend worship, and I was able to give each of them a Bible from the supply I carry. Pray as the word bears fruit.

1968 to get young people out of the city's often raucous celebrations and to reflect on a God-honoring way to live. I can no longer get to the campground easily, but Will, Nancy and I were able to visit the camp one day and enjoyed a fresh caught dinner in a nearby fishing village.

March 16-23 my son Daniel and his family will be here. We are hoping to have a complete family reunion on the island of Holbox March 20-22. Even baby Diego will be present! We hope to get an updated family photo for you then, before granddaughter Ellie leaves for the states and college this summer.

April 1-3 the Divino Salvador church choir which I accompany is making a tour to Tabasco, about ten hours away. I am looking forward to it since I have many former students, whom I haven't seen in years, serving the Lord there.

On June 19 I have an appointment in Raleigh, NC, with a macular degeneration specialist. He has made special glasses enabling some patients to read again! My plans are uncertain at this point but I will more than likely be in the states until mid-July.

I have opened a new gmail e-mail address and will probably close the Prodigy address in June. Please take note of my new address: jeanlegters@gmail.com. My fine vision is not clear enough to write e-mails, but my granddaughter and Debbie help me. You may have to wait for a reply. I'm sorry this letter was so long in coming but as you can see, life has been very full. The Lord has blessed us abundantly, we are grateful for your gifts and prayers.

AN UNTOLD STORY---- WESTMINSTER SEMINARY AND THE GOSPEL IN YUCATAN, MEXICO, by Wayne Brauning.

This is the story of two Westminster Seminary alumni, father and son, David Brainerd Legters, Sr., and David Brainerd Legters, Jr., and of God's unfolding an amazing ministry over three generations. This story comes to us by the kindness of Wayne Brauning (M.Div. '60, D.Min. '93), who compiled and wrote in collaboration with Jean and Daniel Legters, David Brainerd Legters, Jr.'s son, in February 2015.

The Legters' name came out of the Netherlands in the 1800s and survives by a thin line to our day. For the backdrop, meet Leonard Livingstone Legters (L.L. Legters) who worked early in the 20th century with Cameron Townsend to co-found Wycliffe Bible Translators. He served the "Red Race" among the Comanche and Apache in Oklahoma and conducted the funeral service of Chief Geronimo who had become a member of a Reformed Church. L. L. Legters and his wife were given only one son, born in 1908, David Brainerd Legters. Brainerd caught his father's vision for world missions

After training at Moody Bible Institute, Brainerd entered **Westminster Theological Seminary** in Philadelphia and graduated in 1935. He was ordained to the ministry at J.R. Miller Memorial Presbyterian, Upper Darby, PA. In December 1936, Brainerd married Elva McMahon, the valedictorian nurse graduate of John Hopkins. Within a year, they were settled in the Mayan village of Xocempich in Yucatan, Mexico as one of the first Wycliffe missionaries. They learned the Mayan language and maintained a ministry that lasted 44 years for Elva and 66 years for Brainerd.

Today, the Mexican Yucatan Peninsula is best known for the magnificent beaches of Cancun and beyond on its 700-mile eastern coastline and the amazing Mayan temple ruins. Over hundreds of years, a vast, indigenous pagan empire arose that worshiped ancient gods and organized in something like city-states with authoritarian governments and blood-sacrifice religious practices around temples like Chichén-Itzá. Then Spanish efforts to subdue the Yucatan Peninsula along with its Roman Catholicism took about 170 years and that influence is evident widely but was always syncretistic. God was preparing a people for Himself while at the same time He was preparing His ambassadors to bring the Gospel of Hope to the Mayans. As we will see, when the biblical Gospel did come, it found much fertile soil.

Brainerd's passion was for the Mayan people to have God's Word in their own language and to establish local churches for the true worship of the triune God and the training of their families. He almost became a Mayan, living among them for months at a time, sometimes neglecting his own family, translating the New Testament into Mayan, preaching in Spanish and Mayan, founding one village church after another throughout the peninsula. The Mayan New Testament was dedicated in 1960. A Bible society then undertook the translation of the Old Testament. It is difficult to determine which was Brainerd's greatest legacy; this translation of Scripture or the preaching of those Scriptures, and the pastoral care he gave face to face, to thousands and the establishing of numerous churches throughout the land. Brainerd was a single-minded missionary in his devotion to the Mayans. He had such little interest in the United States that even when an all expense trip was provided for him to attend Westminster's 50th anniversary celebration and to receive an honorary doctoral degree, he sent his wife in his place. Westminster's investment in Brainerd's education, at a time when the seminary charged no tuition, has brought vast returns for the Kingdom of Christ and great joy to the Mayans.

Brainerd and Elva had only one child, a son, whom they also named David Brainerd. He was born in September of 1937 at John Hopkins Hospital because his life was at great risk due to Elva's Rhnegative blood. He too grew up among the Mayan, tagging along with his father from village to village and lived among them, almost becoming a Mayan himself. Fluent in English, Spanish and Mayan, he then sensed the call of God to this needy people. In about 1951, his parents sent David to the USA for his high school training. He continued his education at Wheaton and Sterling Colleges. He enrolled at Westminster Seminary, following his father's path and graduated in 1964. In 1961 he met Jean Edwards from Detroit in Yucatan when she came for a mission trip from Wheaton College. They were married in September, 1962. During seminary and for several years after, they assisted in inner-city church ministry in Philadelphia and held various jobs. Their first trip together to Yucatan was in 1963.

Significant financial support for them soon came from several sources and in 1967 they immediately took up residence in Merida, Yucatan. God gave them three children, two of whom still live in Yucatan. Dave and Jean served the Mayan ministry for 46 years together until David's death in 2013. Jean continues her service as her health permits.

Their accomplishments are staggering. David, with Jean's constant help, engaged in many tasks: preaching, teaching, nurturing and organizing many rural and urban congregations; translating numerous Reformed books and articles, such as Edmund Clowney's *Syllabus on Biblical Theology* into Spanish, compiling a Mayan hymnbook and training national pastors personally. They established the *Itinerant Theological Institute* with over 25 training centers for the study of God's Word and preparation of pastors and leaders. David served as president of the National Presbyterian Seminary in Mexico City for three years.

Together David and Jean established San Pablo Presbyterian Theological Seminary in 1982 and its respected school of church music in Merida with a well-equipped campus built in 1993.

The National Presbyterian Church of Mexico began to take its stand against the liberal theological and social movements as early as 1970. In 2013, this denomination courageously terminated its relations with the liberal and wealthy Presbyterian Church USA.

Though it is difficult to evaluate all the factors accurately, there is no doubt that the impact of the teaching of the "whole counsel of God" as provided by the Legters family for over 75 years continues to be a huge influence for good in the Presbyterian church of Maya land and all Mexico.

An examination of recent data over more than seven decades among the Mayans shows God's blessing on the labor of this Legters' father and son Westminster team and those who joined them. It reads a bit like the early chapters of Acts. When Brainerd and Elva Legters began their mission outreach in 1936, the Presbyterian Church of Southeastern Mexico recorded 50 unorganized and 12 organized congregations, one presbytery and no ordained Mexican pastors. By 1967, after 31 years of ministry, there were 250 unorganized and 55 organized churches with 7 presbyteries and 30 ordained pastors. By 2011, just 44 years later, there was phenomenal growth with 2,000 unorganized and 500 organized churches, 32 presbyteries and 450 ordained pastors. No matter how we do the math, such growth by the quiet, sacrificial use of the means of grace can only be a supernatural product. Societal benefits also developed as the Gospel spread making the State of Yucatan one of the safest and most stable of all Mexico.


This is a report of the quiet transformation of large numbers of real flesh and blood men, women and children and of the corporate growth of the body of Christ in actual local churches.

Such accomplishments come only as God moves faithful men and women to lay their hands to the plow and not look back. The Legters' family, called of God, educated at Westminster Seminary, became tools in the hand of the Lord of the harvest. Without fanfare, they planted and watered the truths of Scripture that they learned at Westminster Seminary. They brought this "whole counsel of God" to a largely unreached and backward people group, the Mayan Indians of Mexico. All over that land today, these dear people faithfully continue to build Christ's churches, rejoicing in their newfound Savior as did the first church of Christ in Jerusalem upon hearing the reconciling Gospel from the Apostle Peter on Pentecost.

The Jesus film as an auxiliary aspect of Bible translation

When Scripture is translated into a language that has not previously had it, it is very common for the Jesus film, which bases its script on the gospel of Luke, to be produced when the gospel of Luke is translated. It is part of getting the message of Scripture into the hearts and lives of people, and is especially strategic in places where the people cannot read in their own language, or perhaps cannot read at all in any language. The website for the Jesus film project (www.jesusfilm.org) says that "since 1979 more than 100 million men, women and children worldwide have indicated decisions to follow Jesus after viewing the film."

Here is a testimony of a man who encountered Christ through the Jesus film, as related by a Bible translation consultant who works with indigenous translators in that language:

My name Sreenu, son of Settiah. I used to worship [other] gods. I was a guru swami (head saint) for 14 years. I had been going on pilgrimages to the temple and fulfilling my oath to that god. They did not solve any of my struggles and I did not have peace in my mind and was addicted to alcohol. At that time, my aunt told me to come to watch Jesus Film as it was being dedicated in our language. I went

and watched that movie from the beginning to the end and I saw many wonders and miracles, like raising the dead, the wonder of catching fish, feeding multitudes. I felt like, if I believe Jesus Christ, he may deliver me from my struggles and save me. I trusted in Jesus and started attending church every Sunday and took baptism. My struggles went away now. My life is changed and even I changed my name also. Now my name is not Sreenu (which was the name of a god in my religion) but Samson. Therefore please pray for my spiritual growth.

Moved to weeping by ancient truth

In a tiny room in the West New Britain Province of Papua New Guinea, a woman approached a microphone. She wore a brightly patterned dress but had removed the colorful strings of beads that usually hung around her neck. All must be quiet for the recording session that was about to begin. In her hand she grasped pages from the book of 2 Corinthians, printed in Mangseng—the language of her heart. Hobson Poka rechecked the sound level, assured himself that the record button had been engaged, and nodded to the woman at the microphone.

In a calm, steady voice she commenced reading from Paul's letter to the church in Corinth. But as the ancient words and their meaning sank in, her voice faltered, and she began to weep. Hobson paused the recorder and waited for some time, but his deeply moved reader couldn't stop crying. A crew member quietly removed the headset microphone and told everyone to take a short break while the young woman struggled to compose herself. But the convicting power of God's Word was so strong, she was unable to continue. Hobson was forced to find another reader and start recording a different book.

Pirate attack in Papua New Guinea

The MV Kwadima II is a forty-foot boat that is used to help to move language development and translation teams in Papua New Guinea to and from remote areas, many of which do not have regular maritime travel and are not easily accessible by smaller boats. It will accommodate up to thirty-five passengers and can carry up to fifteen tons of cargo.

You may recall a report in our newsletter from May of last year that a translator couple and four passengers and crewmen who were traveling in a small boat were nearly lost at sea in an accident

last February. The Kwadima, as well as the thirty-one foot fast transport boat that I and others have been working on at the JAARS

Center, can provide much safer, more reliable water transportation in Papua New Guinea than the smaller boats like the one that sank last February.

However, even a larger boat can be subject to safety concerns. Just a few weeks ago the Kwadima was overtaken and boarded by armed bandits who were after money. A shotgun blast fired by one of the pirates destroyed some of Kwadima's electronic equipment and a few of the pellets hit the captain in the arm. He also suffered a bad cut, and a passenger was injured as well. Fortunately no one was badly hurt, though the experience was quite unsettling to all aboard. We would ask your prayer that God would protect our crew members and passengers from pirates, and that our administration and staff there in Papua New Guinea would have wisdom about how best to insure safe boating operations.

Dear Friends and Prayer Partners,

"The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?" (Psalm 27:1-2)

I trust the Lord's presence has been evident in your life as it has in mine these past few months. Although at times I feel overwhelmed with the demands of the ministry, physical limitations, and all the everyday problems I encounter, He indeed is the strength of my life.

Each month I continue to visit the congregations we have been ministering to in Chemax, Yalcoba, Tekom and Followers of Christ here in Merida. There are several lay ministers who regularly go with me to preach while I play the keyboard during worship. I find my weekends fill up fast between traveling to the villages to minister, accompanying the church choir, and being church pianist.

The end of March we had a family reunion/vacation on the island of Holbox. During our time there we remembered the 2nd anniversary of Dave's call to heaven. On our last day together we gathered in the patio of some good friends who had also recently lost their son. It was a meaningful bilingual time of sharing how the Lord has given us strength and the ability to carry on.

At Easter time the church choir took a short trip to the state of Tabasco (10 hours away) to sing in various congregations. The choir also sang at churches near and far in the Merida area. I enjoyed accompanying the choir with an Easter cantata I know well. My participation with the church choir has become a challenge as I have found it increasingly difficult to read unfamiliar music

On June 19 I have an appointment with a macular degeneration specialist in Raleigh, NC. This doctor has helped some of his patients to be able to read again. How wonderful it would be if my eyesight could be helped- it affects every area of ministry and my life.

The seminary graduation was June 5, with 2 graduating in sacred music, 8 in theology, 23 in Biblical counseling and 2 in the master's program. We are grateful to the Lord for these new "Servants for the love of Jesus" that have prepared to enter a field ready to be harvested. God is supplying well-trained leaders for His church, here in Mexico as well as Belize and Guatemala. Classes will resume August 24.

I will be in the US June 17 to July 14. Apart from my eye exam, I will also be visiting some supporting churches and friends during my time in the US. It is always good to be able to personally share what God is doing among His people here. My plans are to be in North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Michigan and Missouri. While I am in the US, I will have a temporary phone number: (336) 938-6408. It would be great to hear from you while I am there!

4 days after returning home, Daniel will arrive with a work group from his church to continue the construction of the Presbytery property they began last year. They will also be helping with a week-long VBS in the village of Citilcum. The construction project they are helping with will enable the Presbytery to have classrooms for the extension seminary that meets there on the week-ends, as well as a retreat center for churches in that area.

Camp Porvenir will be in progress every week of the summer. Our governing board runs a camp for children July 18-24 and then one for young people July 25-31. The cost of camp will be \$60 per person, including transportation. Mark's church is also organizing a family camp August 2 -7. My grand-daughter, Ellie, who graduates from high school this year, will be leaving after camp to travel to Harrisburg, PA. She will be continuing her studies in the field of physical therapy.



from the Pastors Desk

Greetings from me and my family to all of you, the saints in Christ Jesus who are at Bishopville, and grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

I praise our Lord and Savior for the opportunity to serve the Bishopville Church and Community, and I thank him – and all of you – who, since our arrival here, have made us feel not only welcome, but truly, "at home." As my wife has said many times since our coming here, we feel like this is our hometown, that we've been here all our lives.

You're probably curious about your new minister, so I'm glad for this opportunity to introduce myself and my family to you. I'm originally from Iva, a little town in Anderson County in the upstate. I went to Erskine College for my first degree in English, and that's where I met my wife, Laura. After she finished her degree from Erskine, we got married that June and moved to Rock Hill, where I went to work for what was then the INA Bearing Company (it's changed names a couple of times since). 

FROM THE

The SCROLL

One of the questions I often get asked is about Bible translations. There seem to be more and more of them every day (as of 2010, there were more than 20!), and we can get bogged down with trying to figure out which one is good to use – especially when we start thinking about giving a Bible to a family member. If you go to the bookstore or the Christian bookstore, what should you look for? What Bible should you buy?

Before I wade too deep into this, let me clarify that there are a LOT of good books, online resources, and articles on this topic and these books have been written by people with a LOT of skills, training, information, and expertise. I

myself have found *The Complete Guide to Bible Translations* (Rhodes, 2009), to be an invaluable resource, as well as James White's and D.A. Carson's books on English translation debates.

To begin with, the Bible was given to us originally in several languages: the Old Testament in Hebrew (with a smattering of Aramaic in Daniel), and the New Testament in Koine Greek. These languages were then translated by committees of Bible and language scholars. If you'd like to see either the Hebrew or Greek texts, I have several published editions in my office, along with some translation and textual tools.

One thing I was interested to learn about when I started my own Bible classes was *translation philosophy* and its importance; that is, these committees of scholars, while working to be faithful to the original Greek and Hebrew texts, have to make certain decisions about how to translate from one language into another. So they have to decide, do we translate word for word, or do we translate thought for thought? The main difference between most English translations is where they fall on that spectrum between a literal, word-for-word or a more dynamic thought-for-thought scale. But what does this mean for you and me?

Here's the best illustration I've seen, and it's French, which I studied for years: A Frenchman says to you: *j'ai un chat dans ma gorge*. Literally, or word-for-word, he's saying, "I have a cat in my throat", but his meaning dynamically could be rendered, "I have a frog in my throat." In other words, "Hey, my voice is scratchy, I've got a cold." So when you translate the Bible, you have a couple of options of how to express it in English.

So which way is right? Honestly (and I hate to say it this way), it depends.

Isn't that wonderful? You come for a simple answer and get, "it depends." But let me further muddy the water and tell you some of the things it depends on: Your reading ability – some translations, such as the NLT (New Living Translation) are, by design, easier to read than others. Sometimes word-for-word translations, because of the structure of the underlying Greek or Hebrew sentences, are more awkward to read. Your theology can influence your choice, as well. Many people in the Reformed tradition prefer the ESV (English Standard Version) because of its ties to the RSV and (going waaaay back) the Geneva Bible.

I would also factor cost into your decision; some of the newer versions, such as the HCSB (Holman Christian Standard Bible) are printed by large-scale Christian publishers and are often less expensive to buy. The King James Version, for instance, has what's considered a public domain text and will often be the least expensive of any and all Bibles, while the New King James, printed exclusively (for now) by Thomas Nelson, is sometimes more expensive than even Crossway's ESV or Zondervan's NIV. All the ones I've listed are in my office, and I've found them all helpful and decent translations. If you have any specific versions or questions about any of these, feel free to ask me about them, any time!

All that being said, there are some Bibles to be wary of: not all translations are as good as others, and some are attached to cults. There are two cultic Bibles that are especially prevalent in our region. The so-called "Inspired Version" is a Mormon alteration of the King James that looks to promote their "prophet" Joseph Smith and the book of Mormon. The NWT (New World Translation) is the Jehovah's Witnesses' re-writing of the Bible.

It's my hope that I've been a help to you. This is a question we've all, myself included, dealt with, and something we want to be as certain about as we can. Blessings to you! - Pastor Chris

Dear Prayer Partners and E-mail Friends,

... the plans of the Lord stand firm forever, the purposes of his heart through all generations." (Psalm 33:11) His plans for the summer were not always what I expected, but I know they have a purpose. Leaving home June 17th, I had an appointment with the low vision specialist in Raleigh, NC. I already knew little could be done for the macular degeneration, but he was able to fit me with telescopic lenses which now enable me to see words on a screen and the pastor or the people who stand on the platform at the front of church. The near vision could only be fitted for the right eye. The lenses magnify sufficiently but are hard to adjust to. I am still learning to use them for reading print and music. It is very slow, only a couple of words or notes at a time, but thus far they have helped me read more than I could. I continue to practice with them.

Further travels included Greensboro, Charlotte, the Philadelphia and Harrisburg areas, Detroit and St. Louis. I was on the plane to Wichita but bad weather cancelled the flight. I had my fill of airplanes and traveling alone, but the Lord's hand of blessing was very evident everywhere I went, renewing and deepening ministry contacts and friendships. Debbie, Rolando and baby Diego traveled to St. Louis while I was there. We had a good visit with Daniel's family and the four of us returned home together. I arrived exhausted but glad for all that was accom-

We got back just in time for my granddaughter Ellie's high school graduation. It was a very special time with Mark's family. Ellie will leave in just a few days for Harrisburg, PA, where she will be involved in a three-month

discipleship course that will also serve as a period of adaptation to life in the United States.

Three memorable camps were held in July and August. Our children's camp had about 100 and youth camp had nearly 200 young people in attendance, many of whom are un-churched. A large number of them made a decision for the Lord or renewed their commitment to Him during the conferences and camp activities. The kids who attend camp also form strong friendships that will continue long after camp is over. Mark's church led another youth camp that welcomed about 270 young people. The Lord did great things at this beautiful campsite on the Gulf of Mexico. My in-laws began it in the 1940's after having been involved at the Keswick conference grounds in Whiting, NJ. Keswick's motto is also true at camp Porvenir as it continues to be a place "where God speaks to hearts."

This fall the ministry calendar is filling up with commitments at area churches as well as the congregations I usually visit in the more remote regions of the state of Yucatan. This past Sunday morning a Hawaiian missionary and another friend from my church sang together "How Great Thou Art" in three different keys and three different

languages. It was a joy to accompany them, worshipping our God in Spanish, English and Hawaiian.

This coming weekend I will visit the village congregation of Tekom, and then the San Pablo mission church on the outskirts of the city of Merida. I will be selling Bibles, hymnbooks and other Christian literature at both congregations after the services. August is known as the month of the Bible in Mexico and a special offering is sent to the

Bible Society by all the Presbyterian churches.

On September 6th Mark and I will be delivering a love offering to the church in the town of Maxcanú for their building needs. This gift was sent from brothers and sisters in a church in the Detroit area who have worked at this town in partnership with the church. Later on in September I will be visiting the villages of Chemax and Yalcobá. The church in Chemax now has a beautiful cedar door and half of the window protectors (metal bars that are placed around windows here to keep thieves out.) Once all the window protectors are in place, they will be able to work on getting electricity. They don't want the cables and lights stolen! On the last Saturday in September I have been asked to play at a special service in the city of Valladolid. Emmanuel Church will become an organized church with elders and deacons that evening.

When you receive this, the seminary will be in session again, and the church choir will also have resumed its regular activities. My mornings are occupied cooking and helping care for Diego while Debbie homeschools five students at Merida Christian School (in her living room next door.) Dieguito is a delight and privilege to care forsuch a sweet and happy baby. He will be 8 months old on September 1st, and already weighs twenty three pounds!

He has large hands and feet like his grandpa Dave.

I covet your prayers for my health as I have been battling shoulder pain from pressed nerves because of scoliosis as well as a slight (and temporary, I hope!) hearing loss due to a severe cold I had in July. I will be receiving therapy two times per week for the shoulder pain and I will be having eardrum studies to determine the extent of the

damage and what assistance the specialist might be able to provide.

Thanks for your prayers and gifts for the ministry- they are much appreciated! Opportunities for more direct involvement also abound if you or your church would like to participate through church building, camp Porvenir, summer VBS next year, or just come for a visit. There are many ways you can help with the work we do here. As the Lord gives strength for each season, we will continue in His service.

Why Maritime Services?

JAARS Maritime Services exists for the same reason all our other services exist, which is to facilitate the work of Bible translation so that people of every language in the world will be able to read or hear the Word of God in a language they understand well. To further that work JAARS has been providing air transportation for years in many parts of the world so that Bible translators can go to where they need to be to do their work. But we are also providing water transportation for travel over rivers, lakes and open ocean. That's the job of Maritime Services.



Sudest Island is in the far southeastern part of Papua New Guinea (lower right corner of the map)

For example, on July 5, Mike and Thera Anderson dedicated the Sudest New Testament on Sudest Island in Papua New Guinea—thirty-one years after beginning their translation project. The island is a twenty-seven hour, non-stop trip from the mainland by boat. Thera candidly admits that she seriously contemplated resigning from their translation project **each time** they faced a boat trip out to their island. Traveling in small motorized boats operated by local people the trip would take several days due to the many stops along the way. Sometimes they would wait for months even to find a boat that was going. That has all changed now that the Kwadima II is in service in that region (see photo below). The boat that I (David) have been working on at JAARS will serve in a similar capacity farther to the north (upper right corner of the map), enabling translators to get to their language areas.

What does the exegetical summary of portions of Exodus look like?

If you're not a Bible translator this may not appeal to you. But you might want to see some of the things that I am writing and that translators can use in preparing to translate Biblical texts. This is what Exodus 19:6 looks like in the exegetical summary. (The Latin is included for the benefit of mother-tongue translators who are Roman Catholic and want to see the passage in the Latin Vulgate.)

How does a baby bird build a nest for its mother?

Following the death of my stepfather, 7 years ago, my sisters and I began a campaign to bring our mother back to SC from Virginia. After several failed attempts we began to lose hope this would ever happen.

Recently a small house at the farm became available and I approached Momma again about moving to SC. To my surprise (and my sisters') she said yes! Over a year ago my Mother learned she has Chronic Lymphatic Leukemia and she shared though she is doing very well, she felt it was time to make the move. Imagine our surprise when she put her condo in Yorktown on the market and it sold in 3 days! It seems that God has been orchestrating this as everything began to fall into place so perfectly.

Once the house on the farm was vacant Don and I faced the harsh reality of the actual condition of the house. Realizing we had only a month to get the house move in ready for Momma, Cypress quickly became a buzz of activity! Everyone tirelessly worked through the SC heat and humidity coupled with a couple of days of heavy downpours, all threatening to hamper our efforts.

We all refused to be defeated and give up on our goal of being ready for her arrival. You see, the reality of the move was beginning to set in with Momma, and I could tell how difficult it was for her to change nests at 82. Her nest in Virginia was comfortable and she had so many friends to leave behind. My sisters and I became cheerleaders and tried to make it seem more like an adventure than a challenge.

So, how "do" you prepare a home for your mother? I started by asking her, "how do you want your home to feel, Momma?" Without hesitation she said, "I would really love for it to feel like an enchanted cottage." She then described a 1945 movie in which a honeymoon cottage later became a haven for some very special people who needed love. Though the movie (which I purchased and watched) did not give me the decorating tips I desired I did come away with what I thought Momma "felt" as she watched the movie.

After the major repairs were made to the house, I could then begin to visualize how my mother's furniture could be used in the spaces. I wanted her to feel comforted by her things but I also wanted her to feel that new life had been breathed into them. My vision and my efforts became centered on developing a space that she could *start* a new life in, rather than a place to finish in.

I still cannot believe how well her furniture fit right into the house, seeming as though it was meant to be there. As each picture was hung and all of her belongings were carefully placed, I watched her as she slowly began accepting this was her new home. The house is filled with tiny reminders of her life and everything in it has a purpose or a story behind it. Don and I made sure to hang bird feeders as we hoped our enjoyment of bird watching would rub off on her. Soon her front gate will be adorned with a sign reading, 'The Enchanted Cottage', at her request!

For the woman who brought me into this world and nursed me, dressed me, and loved me, the most difficult part of it all was deciding when enough was enough. I kept thinking how blessed I am to be able to show love for my mother in such a wonderful way. The excitement and energy was contagious as the workers seemed to share in the anticipation of her arrival. My sisters and our families shared in the process of "feathering" Momma's nest and it has made for some lovely memories.

My Mother's return to the South has been a blessed one. She marvels at how the clerks at Wal-Mart are courteous and helpful. Everyone has been so warm and welcoming and she enjoys 'owning' the road as she learns her way around with little-- if any-- traffic!

I am now blessed to have both of my parents in South Carolina, home of beautiful places and smiling faces!!!

From the Pastor's Desk

498 years ago, on October 31, 1517, in Wittenberg (in what would one day become Germany) a law-student turned priest named Martin Luther nailed to the chapel door his 95 Theses and sparked what would be known throughout history as the Protestant Reformation. The Reformation would be defined by what it rediscovered about Christianity, and these rediscoveries flowed from a commitment by the Reformers to study and know the Word of God. Accordingly, the Reformation saw the translation of the Bible into the common languages of the peoples of the Church: German for the Germans, English for the English, and so on. At the same time, the nature of the church itself was redefined. Instead of communion being the central element of worship, the promises of the Gospel which underlie communion – in the Bible – are the central element of Protestant worship. And the church would move from a centralized monolithic organization intricately linked to European politics to a localized resource for families and communities to be gathered and be trained and be energized for ministry.

What does this mean for us?

The key to the Reformation is the Church's commitment to focus on the Bible's authority rather than man's authority in defining what it means to be a Christian. As a Reformed church, we must make our first commitment to the authority of God's Word, and we must let what God says have precedence over everything we do as his church. As a Reformed people, we've got to do the same in our daily lives as well; we let the Bible be its own best interpreter, we let the Bible define how we govern and behave as Christians and Church, and we let the Bible show us what is right and wrong. This principle, known at the time of the Reformation by its Latin name, *Sola Scriptura*, has to be the defining characteristic of a Reformed Church. We commit ourselves, as did the Reformers, to hearing God speak to us through His Word.

As we do this, as we listen to God's voice, we hear the other great creeds of the Reformation in it: We learn that it is by believing, putting our faith in the work of Christ Jesus that we are saved, not by human effort, not by perfect obedience, not even by rituals, rites, and the permission of priests. Like Abraham, we trust in God's promises, and this is accounted to us as righteousness. We learn that our salvation is the free gift of God, given to us, who by no means deserved or merited it. God so loved us that he gave us freely His Son, our Savior. We learn that Jesus Christ alone is the Mediator, the Priest-King who alone stands in the gap between us and God, paying the price for our sins, absorbing God's wrath, and giving us an eternal home. We learn that all of these "onlys" these *Solas*, as God says in the Bible, bring Him glory – and to God alone belongs all the glory.

So this October, as we enjoy the changing season, the harvests, the feasts, the fun, and the upcoming holiday season, let's not let this anniversary of the Reformation pass us by without remembering – and recommitting – to the principles which have helped to shape not only our church, but our lives, and the life of our nation, especially that great commitment to God's Word.

From the Pastor's Desk

As a boy, I used to love to go to the movies. One of my favorite movies was *Back to the Future*, from 1985. I loved the adventure, the characters, the humor (even if I didn't get some of the jokes until I'd grown up), and the overarching theme that a person can have a profound effect on his or her own story. I still love *Back to the Future* as an adult, and I find that my enjoyment of the film comes now from an appreciation of how well it was written and put together, from the depth of its allusions to the humor of its rather paradoxical title: How exactly does one go "back" to a place that doesn't yet exist (the future)?

And so it might surprise you that this paradox, this theme of the movie, is a theme derived from, of all places, the Bible. The writer of Hebrews in chapter 11, verse 10 says, "For he [Abraham] was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God." He's looking forward to a city that goes back, all the way back to the beginning. And, as Hebrews' writer notes, Abraham's not alone in this journey to the future that goes back – this is a journey all of us as followers of Jesus are making. What does that mean?

You might put it this way: as Christians, we should be *looking back to see the future*.

Unbelievably, 2015 is coming to a close soon. You may or may not know, but the sequel to *Back to the Future*, its "Part 2" was set, for the most part, in 2015! As this year comes to a close (and what a year it was!), we can't help but begin to think about where we're going and what we're doing in the year to come, in 2016. What is our vision for the future, both as individual followers of Jesus and as his church here in Bishopville? What will our vision for 2016 look like, and what will we do in order to make that vision happen? And what impact will that vision have on what we're already doing and where we're already serving as a church?

This is the tension Hebrews 11:10 drives home for us. We're looking forward, but what we're looking forward to has its foundations in the past, the future whose designer and builder is God. Like Abraham, we're looking for what God is building through his Church in terms of his eternal kingdom, and we're, like Paul says to the Corinthians, looking to help him build it on its incorruptible foundation, the foundation of Christ Jesus' Gospel. As we look *back* to the Gospel, we see the *future* – our future destiny, destination, and home. And this vision of the Gospel and its destiny give us reasons to thank God and helps guide us as we look to where God is taking us, our vision of the future. We're seeking the city to come, as the old song says.

So how do we move ourselves "back" to our future? We start by holding fast to that firm foundation, that anchor in our past: the Gospel. We then look at how the Gospel manifests, where it goes, and what it does; in other words, we look for the tracks God's Church has left. From there we look at how God *is* working in the "here and now" of Bishopville today: what are the gifts, resources, passions, and abilities of the people he's drawn together to make up our church. Finally we put these elements together, built on that foundation, using where we've been and what we have as his church in order to grow with our Lord into the vision he's cast for us through the Gospel. It's exciting times. Let's get back... back to our future!

I will be starting 2 classes at the beginning of the year:

- A catechism class for youth interested in becoming a part of the fellowship of the church or interested in learning more about our church, denomination, and faith. Course materials will be provided, along with light refreshments. Please RSVP by January 2, 2016, if interested
- A theology study, with a Q&A format, on Sunday afternoons. This class is open to all church members, their friends, family, neighbors and anyone who wishes to participate. From the Pastor's Desk

I love the old English poem "A Visit from Saint Nicolas" which I, like most of us, recognize by its first line, "'Twas the night before Christmas." It's filled with wonderful language, delightful style, and such well-written rhyme and rhythm that it's been, for hundreds of years, a staple of Christmas celebrations in English-speaking nations all over the world.

I sometimes wonder, though, if the poet Moore, would have been so eager to see Santa, as he writes, "out on the lawn there arose such a clatter, I sprang from my bed to see what was the matter" if he had read the Monk Damaskinos' testimony regarding the events of the Council of Nicaea (AD 325).

The good monk writes, "The emperor [Constantine] was sitting on his throne, flanked by 159 bishops to his left and 159 to his right. [Arius] was presenting his views with great vigor and detail. As Saint Nicholas observed the scene, the bishops listened to Arius in complete silence and without interrupting this discourse. Outraged, and prompted by his saintly vigor, he left his seat and walked up to Arius, faced him squarely and slapped his face."



Wow. Jolly old Saint Nick, indeed!

What happened at Nicaea that caused the bishop of Myra, St. Nicholas, to react so strongly? To understand, we go back in time, way back past AD325 to the 40s & 50s, when Apostle Paul, on his missionary journeys, plants a church in Patara, a key seaport in the Roman region of Lycia. In that city, in that very church planted by Paul, some 200 or more years later, a couple gave birth to a son they named Nicholas, the very same Nicholas who would grow up to become the bishop of Myra and attend the First Nicene Council. What a heritage – he grew up in a church planted by Paul himself! Now let's go back to Nicaea, to this august assembly of bishops

presided over by the Roman Emperor Constantine himself, to where a bishop named Arius "was presenting his views with great vigor."

What were Arius' views? What about his views provoked the "saintly vigor" of St. Nick? Arius' main point was that Jesus, while special, while unique, while uniquely powerful, and while the exclusive redeemer of mankind, that Jesus was a *created being. In other words, in Arius' view Jesus is less than God while greater than the creation. Jesus was, like you and me, just another created being, not the unique and only Son of God. Arius wanted to redefine Jesus, to make Him something less than Scripture reveals.* The thing is, Arius' views were gaining appeal throughout the Church – just as they still exist today in modern cults that de-emphasize Jesus, attempting to make him something less than fully human, fully God, and fully exclusive as our mediator.

So there's Arius, and he's denying the divinity of Christ Jesus. There's the silence of the church, seeming to allow this false teaching to go forward. And there's Nicholas, having grown up in a church planted by Paul, who had written the words of Colossians 1:16-20: "By Him [Christ Jesus] all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through Him and for Him. And He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. And He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything He might be preeminent. For in Him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through Him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of His cross."

So, of course, Nicholas has to act, even though his actions landed him in prison (for the night). There are just some things you can't do in front of a Roman Emperor. But sometimes a stand needs to be taken, even if taking a stand costs something – like a night in jail. So, as we come to this time of year when we celebrate, if indirectly, the ministry of Saint Nicholas, let's ask if we have his same passion for the truths of the Scripture. Are we willing to take and make the same kind of stand he made, to be as bold for the truth of the Gospel as he was? Are we willing to pay the price for that boldness? What will we do, who, like Nicholas before us, have inherited the great gift of a strong foundation in the faith? That's something for all of us to think about this holiday season. Blessings to you! - Pastor Chris
