From the Pastor's Desk...

Revelation 2:12-13, “*And to the angel of the church in Pergamum write: The words of him who has the sharp two-edged sword. I know where you dwell, where Satan’s throne is. Yet you hold fast my name, and you did not deny my faith even in the days of Antipas my faithful witness, who was killed among you, where Satan dwells.*”

Dr. Melton used to tell us to be careful about preachers who “knew a little Greek” - usually, he said, that meant they knew a short guy selling gyros. With that caveat, I’m going to try not to go too far out on a limb here -but here we go. There are certain words that have been, well, shoehorned from the Greek language of the Bible into English: words like “prophet” or “baptize” or - significantly - “martyr”. These are words that can be translated into English, but usually have enough baggage or context or implications attached to them that they can’t easily be translated... so we just shove them into English.

Martyr is one of those words. There’s a level where it simply means “somebody who tells somebody else something they’ve seen” - like our word “witness”. At the same time, there’s a sense in the word where what the “witness” has seen is so important, so profound, so true, that they would die rather than contradict what they’ve seen. So, instead of using 10-15 words every time we want to say that, we simply say, “**He’s a martyr.**”

Antipas, in Revelation 2, is a martyr. In fact, he’s one of the earliest Christian martyrs, along with John’s brother James and Steven (both of whom are martyred during the book of Acts). Church tradition holds that the Emperor Domitian either had him burned alive, or burned in a cast-bronze bull, for failing to deny Jesus and renounce his faith. Antipas had been taught by the apostles (likely Paul or John) and had been ordained & installed as the pastor of the church they planted in Pergamum. He was so committed to what he’d been taught - even though he never knew Jesus personally, never heard Jesus preach, didn’t see the Cross, probably (though we don’t know for certain) never even visited Jerusalem - yet Antipas was willing to defy the order of the Emperor himself, the very head of the Roman government, rather than to deny Jesus. That is an amazing level of faith.

Now, other than what we read about him in Revelation and subsequent church history, we don’t know a lot about Antipas. Unlike other martyrs like Ignatius or even Steven, we don’t have sermons or letters (that I could find) from him. All we know with absolute certainty is that he died because he would not deny Jesus - and in that, we are taught something important about our faith. We American Christians are immeasurably blessed; we meet openly, we’re not penalized for going to church, we’re not threatened with murder or confronted with gunmen when we worship, we don’t have our livelihoods taken away by our government or rival religious factions. We are incredibly blessed. Our national identity is built on Christian ethics, values, & traditions (think about how utterly Presbyterian our government is). We even get tax benefits for giving to our church!

And yet... As Dr. Voddie Baucham rightly points out, our national Christian freedom is but a historical “blip” on the grand scale of history. And, for much of the Church, throughout history and even across the world today, persecution is the norm, rather than tolerance or acceptance. We are blessed beyond description - yet that blessing hangs on a fragile thread. So what do we do?


We learn from Antipas. We learn from Steven. We learn from James, from Ignatius, from Justin Martyr, from Jan Hus, from Wycliffe, and from the countless other brothers & sisters across the world and across the ages who show us - who witness to us - what it means to trust Jesus with our very lives, even in the face of persecution. We learn from them, and we pray. We pray, earnestly thanking God for our blessings, and we pray, eagerly urging Him to bless our persecuted family. We pray, with the hurting saints and the great crowd of Heaven itself, “How long, O Lord - come quickly, come quickly, Lord Jesus!”

And, like Antipas, we look to the One who will give us that heavenly manna, and that new name, written down in glory, which no one can ever take away from us.

I always wondered what this part of Psalm 23 meant. I thought “He anoints my head with oil” was figurative language for God keeping the Psalmist healthy. I never knew this parallel - Anoint my head with oil.

“Sheep can get their head caught in briars and die trying to get untangled. There are little flies that like to torment sheep by laying eggs in their nostrils which turn into worms and cause the sheep to beat their head against a rock, sometimes to death. Their ears and eyes are also susceptible to tormenting insects. So the shepherd anoints their whole head with oil. Then there is peace. That oil forms a barrier of protection against the evil that tries to destroy the sheep. Do you have times of mental torment? Do the worrisome thoughts invade your mind over and over? Do you beat your head against a wall trying to stop them? Have you ever asked God to anoint your head with oil? He has an endless supply! His oil protects and makes it possible for you to fix your heart, mind, and eyes on Him today and always! There is peace in the valley! May our Father anoint your head with oil today so that your cup overflows with blessings!







Dear Prayer Partners,

Some of you have written to me saying you are praying about the camp situation. We wanted to share some news that is a reason for rejoicing. The camp board president together with pastor Alberto Tuyub (also a member of our camp board and originally from that same town where camp is legally registered) traveled to the township offices to inquire about the taxes owed on the property. There is a new mayor in the township who has ties to the Presbyterian church there and who knows pastor Alberto personally. He directed them to the treasurer who informed them the amount to pay was 43,000 pesos, but that they were being given a 50% discount for bringing the property tax account up to date and would only need to pay \$22,000 pesos. They were able to pay the tax for the past five years and were also assured that official drawings of the property with updated satellite-measured coordinates would be drawn up for the camp board free of charge. When talking to the secretary of the treasurer's office, she shared with them how she had become a believer in Jesus three years ago and attended the Emmanuel Presbyterian Church in that town. She called others in that office, who are also believers, and church members, and before leaving, Pastor Alberto (Beto) led them all in prayer. This is incredible! Things like this do not happen here in Mexico! The God of the impossible intervened because of all of our prayers. This is just the first step in unraveling this legal mess. But God has also provided support in the next steps that need to be taken. The husband of a close friend of my daughter Debbie is a former attorney general for the state of Yucatán and he met with Debbie and the camp president to review the concerns and propose a response strategy. Although not a Christian, he has a personal interest in the camp because of his wife who grew up attending youth camps at Porvenir and her parents who also were very active in children, family and youth camps. He gave some good ideas and assured us that although the legal part may take years to battle out in court, if it comes to that, he is confident camp Porvenir has the upper hand. It can prove ownership and possession (paying property taxes, bills, maintenance, etc.) of the property for over the past 50 years, and the updated official documents from the township will only serve to reinforce this fact. This attorney and Debbie are also good friends with the head justice of the supreme court of Yucatan, and he has expressed that although he is not able to intervene directly, he can monitor that no corrupt dealings occur when/if the case goes to trial. So once again, The Lord is answering all our prayers and leading us to the right people who can help.

We thought this was such great news and we wanted to share it with you. Have a blessed Christmas and remember to pray for the camp in the new year. We appreciate each one of you. Blessings, Jean Legters

From the Pastor's Desk...

Revelation 1:3: Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear, and who keep what is written in it, for the time is near.


I quit Twitter. Like many of you, I watched 2020 unfold through the lens of social media - and like many of you, I was deeply concerned by what I saw there. Throughout the pandemic, the election, the protests, the riots, the violence, the spread of critical race theory, the cultural shift, the racial & political tension, the lockdowns, the school and business closures, throughout everything I saw, social media - Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, and so on - exacerbated, heated up rather than cooled down what happened throughout 2020. Now, I knew just as much as I know anything, God is Sovereign. None of this is out of our God's hands. Psalm 47:8 reminds us, "**God reigns over the nations; God sits on his holy throne.**"

So why did I quit Twitter? Why did I massively scale back my use of Facebook? Why am I strictly limiting my "ingestion" of social media - **and strongly encouraging you to do the same?** I had an insight while watching skateboarder-turned-journalist Tim Pool and his panel when they were discussing the polarization of American politics, and one of his panelists brought up an interesting point. He theorized the trouble we face stems from the fact that our primary form of communication with each other has shifted from voice-based to text-based. In other words, you're far, far more likely to get an email, a text message, a one-sided snapchat than a call or other form of face-to-face interaction. Why does that matter? How does that "de-civilize" our communication? How does that make things, particularly hard-to-deal-with things like lockdowns & politics & pandemics worse? Text is just that - written words.

Tell me this: when you read what I just wrote, did you "hear it" in your mind in my voice? Or your own? What tone did you hear it "said" in? Optimistic? Gloomy? Harsh? Did you hear me say it in my "preacher voice"? One of the most interesting things I learned (in what little I've learned) about American Sign Language is the importance of your face in signing. Your face - like your voice and body-language - when speaking sets the tone. Am I asking a question? Am I being sarcastic? Am I trying to be funny? Am I being serious? My tone, my face, my gestures, my voice all communicate those things, just as much as, if not more than the words I speak! And this is the problem with social media; 95% or more of it is text-based communication, or it's one-sided videos. Worse than that are the algorithms & other mechanisms social media uses to reinforce our own perspectives, put us in echo chambers and - worst of all - addict us to social media. We are visual creatures, and social media can manipulate us, if we're not careful, if we're not mindful, into becoming addicted more and more to the drama, the outrage, the stress-inducing "high" of social media. And, brothers & sisters in Christ, I can say this: God does not want this for us.

We are speaking creatures made by a speaking God. God's first act in all of recorded history is to speak: "Let there be light," God said. God speaks to Moses through the burning bush. God speaks to Abraham face-to-face. God speaks to you & me through the Living Word Himself Jesus Christ. More than that, throughout the Bible, throughout the written text of God's Word, God repeatedly encourages, instructs and commands His people - you & me - to speak His Word. Get that? The God who speaks to us and made us to speak commands, instructs, and encourages us to speak, to sing, to read his word aloud. The Psalms are songs to be sung. The Laws are answers to be spoken. The Prophecies are mysteries to be shared. The Proverbs are wisdom to be preached. The Gospel is news to be told. As a matter of fact, Biblical scholars like to point out that God's Word came to us originally by "oral tradition" - the spoken word, taught from generation to generation, face-to-face. We're meant to speak with each other, to have questions and answers, to have points of view and tones and laughs and frowns, misunderstandings & clarifications. And here's the thing about social media & text communication: You miss just those incredible things.

So speak. Call somebody. Facetime or Skype. Detox off social media - and be social. And, more than anything else: Listen and be blessed! - Pastor Chris

A Brief History of the Grandfather Clock

In a Virginian lady's home, she has a grandfather clock. One morning, I watched as she "wound it up." I began to think about grandfather clocks. I learned that it all began in 1582 with an 18-yr-old lad who was praying in the cathedral of Pisa, Italy. The pious young man was distracted by a swinging chandelier that had just been lit by the lamplighters. He began to time the swings. Later, in his workshop, he continued to study the movement of pendulums. The boy's name was Galileo! He did not make a clock, but his work inspired Christiaan Huygens, a Dutch astronomer who was in pursuit of a more accurate clock for predicting the movement of the stars and planets. In 1656, Huygens successfully "hitched" a pendulum to the workings of a clock. It revolutionized clock-making by greatly increasing the accuracy of timepieces. Typical clocks could be off as much as 15 minutes every day. Huygens reduced this discrepancy to about 60 seconds per day. His creation was the very first prototype of what would later be called the "long case clock." At the time, these clocks were named "wags-on-the-wall" since their pendulums were short, and "wagged" back and forth like the tail on a dog. Before too long, the clocks were encased in wood. The clocks became known as "grandfather clocks" thanks to a song written in 1875 by Henry Clay Work, an American songwriter & composer. He named the piece "The Grandfather Clock." The popularity of Work's ballad swept the nation, and by the early 1880s the long case clock was known as the "grandfather clock." We are like those clocks. Sometimes we need "winding up" so that we can be faithful witnesses to the correct time. -T. Merrill



Jesus says, "Stay dressed for action and keep your lamps burning, and be like men who wait for their master to come home from the wedding feast, so that they may open the door to him at once when he comes and knocks." (Luke 12:35-36)


What is Jesus telling us?


Brothers & sisters, until He gets back, I pray for you in His name that He will bless you, that He will fill you with all His joy - joy that shakes Heaven because He saved you!



From the Pastor's Desk...

*“There is only one Physician – Very flesh, yet Spirit, too; Uncreated, and yet born; God-and-Man in One agreed,
Very-Life-in-Death indeed,
Fruit of God and Mary’s seed; At once impassible and torn By pain and suffering here below:
Jesus Christ, whom as our Lord we know.”* - - Ignatius of Antioch, around AD 108

It was fun in March to get to know the risen Christ a little better through the book of Revelation. Wasn't it thrilling to see Jesus, alive and well, brighter than the sun in the midst of John's exile - and in the middle of things in His church? To be reminded of His great work, the Lamb of God slain for our sins and raised for our hope? To hear the roar of heaven and earth, angels and saints: "You are worthy!" And to see our King, the Lord of lords, Ruler of rulers, Jesus the One and Only Christ, ready, willing and able to come back for His church!

Not only was it thrilling, this was important for us as well to know (1) that our Redeemer lives, (2) our Savior did what He said He was going to do, (3) He's got a plan to make all things new, and (4) He is ready to keep that promise He made us in John 14: ***"If I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and take you to myself."***


That's good news. That's good news worth sharing. And it all starts with getting to know Jesus a little bit better by letting the Bible show us Jesus.

As your pastor, I wanted us to know Jesus - as the Bible teaches us Jesus, from Genesis to Revelation - because we're living in an age that increasingly ***gets Jesus wrong***. Not only are there false cults and false religions who make Jesus out to be a "holy man" or "prophet" or a created being, a self-made "god", but there's incredible pressure from the secular & atheist world to find the "historical" Jesus - "if he exists at all."


Sadly, these ideas, these errors have found their way into churches all over America. From consumer-driven churches that think Jesus is their key to riches & health, like a Nazarene genie in a bottle, to uber-liberal churches that think of Jesus as that really cool dude who didn't say anything about our pet sins, and you know he'd be cool with what I'm cool with, right? Just as persecution is a real thing, so too are false teachings, false doctrines, false prophecies, and false preachers/teachers.

I don't want you to be confused or led astray. I know Jesus is the One who has saved you and will forever save you - but I want you to know Him as absolutely well as I can possibly help you to know our Savior & Lord. So, starting this month, we're going to be looking at what the Bible teaches us about getting Jesus wrong so that we can do 3 important things: (1) Get Jesus right ourselves. (2) Help other Christians get Jesus right. And (3) Get people who get Him wrong to get Jesus right.

That's what Ignatius was doing with his song, way back in the 100's. It was good work to do then, and it's good work for us now, 1,921 years later. God bless you! Pastor Chris



*"Were the whole realm of nature mine That were a present far too small
Love so amazing, so divine, Demands my soul, my life, my all.
It was on the cross Jesus bled and died It was there he was crucified
But he rose again, and lives in my heart, Where all is peace and perfect love."*

This is an arrangement I especially enjoy playing from a much beloved hymn. And it is true--What more can I give Him than my all?

Schools in Yucatán are still closed to in person classes but Diego seems to be doing alright. Some of Debbie students have had problems and are feeling depressed so they have begun on Monday nights a time to talk, play games, and have a brief devotional and discussion in small groups. These have been well received and a big hit with the students who are craving social connections that they don't currently have.

The seminary is hopeful it will be able to resume in person classes in August. Even if possible, the four-year theology course will be offered online and in person, hoping to reach more people all over the country and beyond. In June, we will be graduating 7 in theology, 4 in music and 22 in Biblical counseling. Hopefully the youth ministries program can begin once again. Please pray that the Lord would bring more students, both in person and on-line, for the coming school year. There is a great need for this preparation and the seminary is trying to adapt to the current situation as best it can.

The camp governing board met online March 8. Due to some gifts received, we have been able to do some much-needed maintenance and would like to be able to offer the facilities for retreats of 30 people beginning in May. Other money has been set aside for the ongoing legal expenses. So far things are going well. Some camp and government personnel are going to walk the perimeter of the property, 3+ kilometers of beachfront and 6 km in land through swamp that goes through a couple of ranches that are part of the property. This is to validate our claims to the property. Cost will be nearly \$5000 but is necessary to prove our ownership according to our documents. Please continue to pray that this property which, belongs to the Lord, will continue to be used for his glory and to bring many young people into the kingdom.

I was able to get out to a Maya village recently for an ordination and installation service for a good friend. I took my keyboard and the brother who drove me played his trumpet. It was so good to take part in a service, to hear Maya being spoken, to

see the colorful Maya huipiles (Mayan dresses) and see some pastor friends and their wives I have not seen for a while. I am on the list for the vaccine whenever it reaches Merida for the older generation. Then I will feel a little safer about leaving my home and going out to the villages again. My church is not open yet to worship in person but I enjoy participating with several church's online services, both in English and Spanish.

I am grateful for the Lord's provision and protection in these months and I hope that you have found him faithful as well. Easter is right around the corner and that is the hope that sustains and strengthens us each and every day. May you find much joy and encouragement as you celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior.

P.S. once again, my son Daniel is sending out these letters so I am not able to add a personal note. May the Lord bless you.

So, we walked the halls, all the way through the gym and back, but again all was in vain. We returned to the parking lot and looked under cars... and even when several cars left, there was no trace of the key. Since it was her only key, she called her husband and a tow truck and began to make plans.

I decided to walk through the school again, this time by myself. As I went through the gym, the girls' basketball team had started their practice. I introduced myself to Coach Duncan and explained who I was and what I was doing. **As we talked briefly, it hit me. It was no accident that I was in the gym and they were practicing.** I was there to do more than just look for keys. Her eyes lit up when I asked her if she would like for me to speak to her team, since she was thinking the same thing.

So, we gathered at center court for a few minutes and I shared my testimony and challenged them with the gospel. Coach Von Duncan was grateful that I stopped by and I'm sure that I'll get to connect with them again.

The feedback that I got from Coach Duncan was very encouraging. The girls said that they could relate to my own testimony, as I shared how I may have been in church when I was their age but was guilty of just going through the motions. I concluded by sharing about surrendering to Christ and giving my life to Him.

I heard Chuck Swindoll say that he would often tell his secretary that he would be busy preparing his ministry messages and didn't want to be interrupted. But the Lord eventually taught him that oftentimes, the "interruptions" were his ministry.



In the past few months, Pam began to struggle again. As I could tell her mobility and memory had slipped, our surgeon ordered a CTSCAN in Charleston in early February. While the scan was clear, he ordered a Lumbar Puncture on March 2 to take out spinal/Brain fluid. That gave her some temporary relief, which is indicative that the shunt is not working properly and may need to be replaced. The relief was short lived which was expected, and on March 8, she was struggling again. This really concerned our Neurosurgeon's team. By late afternoon, Pam, Michaela, and I, headed to MUSC to go through the emergency room. After a long night, and an MRI, another CTSCAN and EKG, we were relieved to know that was no bleeding

We left the hospital at 2:30 AM and decided to spend the night in Charleston. In the meantime, our Zac took a redeye flight to Charleston and we picked him up on the way home. He's been working remotely anyway, so he's been here with us and continuing to work. He's been a big help this week, especially since he loves to cook!

As I write, we are scheduled for shunt replacement surgery on April 9th, with the hope of being able to be bumped up if there are any cancelations.

I will try to update you with a text or email. Let me know the best way to communicate any prayer requests to you. Gathering emails and cellphone numbers has been a work in progress!

Also, Pam's birthday is April 1, no fooling! I know she will be surprised with lots of birthday cards!

This is amazing. I was about to begin folding and stuffing our newsletters when I got the call... Pam's surgery has been rescheduled for March 26th! **Carroll**

From the Pastor's Desk...

But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel: *‘And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy’* (Acts 2:16-18, emphasis mine).

Why do we have Sunday School?

As we get ready to dive back into a more “normal” year, as we celebrate our 1st anniversary “back” to church, I think it’s a great time for us to answer this question. It’s time to think about why we do what we do - and to be deliberate about that answer. Are we having Sunday School because “that’s what we’ve always done”? Are we doing Sunday School because the Baptists & Methodists & whoever else are doing it? Or does this - could this part of our church be something incredible & incredibly important to both our individual faith & our growth as a church?


Well, I preloaded that answer, didn’t I? Without getting into the long history of Sunday School, or even our own church’s history of Sunday School, let’s think about the purpose - the “why” - of Sunday School. And that brings us to Acts 2:16-18, to Peter’s sermon on Pentecost. When Peter addresses the 1000s of new members of Jesus’ church, he reminds them - and us - that one of the longest-standing promises of the Bible is that God will pour out. His Spirit - the Holy Spirit - on every person who makes up his church. Rich, poor, white, black, brown, men, women, young & old, God has & is pouring out the Holy Spirit on us, the Church.

So what does that mean? If God is pouring out the Spirit on all of us Jesus-followers, then we all have an obligation to understand, to lean into, to trust in the Holy Spirit. We all have an obligation to understand & use the gifts the Spirit empowers & enables in us, we all have an obligation to grow & nourish the fruits of the Spirit in our lives, we all have an obligation - as the Spirit-filled church we are - to know & understand the Holy Spirit. Nothing better equips & educates us on the Spirit than the Spirit’s best-known work: The Bible.


And so Sunday School is that place where we learn together from the Bible. Young & old, rich & poor, “educated” & “street-smart” alike, we can learn from each other as we learn & study the Bible together. Sunday School is like the bike with training wheels, the bowling lane with bumper guards, the plate with the steak already cut up and a glass of milk alongside. Sunday School is where we can discuss with other believers the questions atheists & pagans ask us. Sunday School is where we can learn from others’ experiences how to deal with our own issues. And Sunday School is where we can challenge & provoke & grow with each other - to knock ourselves out of those seasons of Christian stagnation we all can slip into. Sunday School is that place where the iron of our faith can sharpen—and be sharpened by—the iron of our Christian brothers & sisters.

So what’s the bottom line?

As Granny Parnell used to sing, “Come to Sunday School, come to Sunday School - every Sunday morning, come to Sunday School.” God bless you - and see you there! - Pastor Chris



From the Pastor's Desk...

On May 17, 1980, in Lowndesville, SC, my father Carl preached Matthew 19, verses 13-16: *Then children were brought to Him that He might lay His hands on them and pray. The disciples rebuked the people, but Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." And He laid his hands on them and went away. And behold, a man came up to Him, saying, "Teacher, what good deed must I do to have eternal life?"*

Now, you might be wondering how I know, with such accuracy when & where my dad preached. I know this because I have a Bible that my grandfather, Pete, owned. My grandfather diligently kept a record of every person who preached, when they preached, and what passage they preached in that Bible from 1976 until sometime in 1983. All while filling in every letter "o" in the text like some fill-the-bubble test.

As I think about Fathers' Day, and the legacy my own father, grandfathers, even father-in-law have left me, I can't help looking at this text in Matthew - a text about Jesus, children, the kingdom of heaven, and a text that my dad thought best to teach with that question hanging there at the end: *"What good thing must I do to have eternal life?"* He's asking how to get to heaven. He's asking how to be good enough, how to be sure enough, how to be saved enough to make it to heaven. How do we get to heaven?

And there, in Jesus' interaction with these children, is our answer. *"To such,"* Jesus himself says, *"belongs the kingdom of heaven."* In another place Jesus says it more clearly: *"Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven."* So what does He mean? What is this child-like (not a childish) faith?

To understand child-like faith, we need to understand children. As a father myself, one of the greatest joys, difficulties, struggles, and victories in my life is working to understand and appreciate my children. It helps me to remember my own, shall we say, "rambunctious" childhood and what my own father went through. When we look at children, when we see and appreciate how they approach the world around them, and when we take what we learn from how children approach the world around them, we learn something incredible from Jesus about faith.

Children are always growing; our faith should be growing. Children are always learning; our faith should be learning. Children are always trusting someone; our faith should be trusting the One. Children are always pushing boundaries; our faith should be pushing our boundaries. Our faith should be child-like. To be childish is to be stagnant, static, locked in an immature moment in time. To be child-like is to be exploring, creating, enjoying, playful, energetic, joyful and trusting.

What good thing must I do to have eternal life? I must learn to have a child-like faith in the One and only Hope, Jesus Christ. I must learn to be a child-like - growing, learning, leaning - follower of God. I must know that I have a Father - and I must know my Father's deep, unending love.


I don't remember May 17, 1980, so I can't help but wonder - is this what my own father taught the church that day? And I can't help but wonder - did his father, sitting there in the pews, look at him and smile like I am, just thinking about that moment so long ago? I think he did.




NEWS FROM THE SESSION...





From the Pastor's Desk...

Colossal: “co·los·sal /kə'läsəl/ adjective - extremely large. Ex. colossal amount of;. Synonyms: huge, massive, enormous, gigantic, very big, very large, great, giant, mammoth, vast, cosmic, immense, tremendous, mighty,” etc. (from the Oxford online dictionary)

Colossae: “ten miles east of Laodicea, was a center for dyed red wool. Although wealthy in the late fourth century BC, it was later eclipsed by Laodicea. The churches in Laodicea, Hierapolis, and Colossae (the oldest of the three cities) were begun by Epaphras . . . Colossae, where Philemon hosted the house church.” (from the Baker Bible Dictionary)

Colossians: One of the Apostle Paul’s so-called “prison letters” (Acts 27-28), written at the same time as Philemon & Ephesians, along with a lost letter to the Laodicean church. It was carried by Onesimus, a slave who had fled his master Philemon. Probably written around 62 AD (more than 1,710 years before the USA was founded!!).

Why am I sharing all this information? Because, starting on July 4, 2021, we are jumping into the colossal little book of Colossians!

One of the things I learned growing up is that our nation, the United States, was first founded by men & women who sought freedom, independence, and self-reliance. I learned that freedom-loving men & women fought and bled to make us free; that later generations sought to keep us free; and that even later generations would fight our bloodiest war to undo the institution of slavery that, for nearly a hundred years previous, tainted that freedom. And I learned July 4 was the day on which we celebrated the birth, preservation, and recommitment of this nation - a nation that has had a colossal impact on the course of history.

And, one of the most important things I learned was that our freedoms - freedom of worship, freedom of association, freedom of press, freedom of redress, freedom from unwarranted prosecution, and freedom from cruel punishment - stemmed from a philosophy rooted in teachings like that in Colossians 3:11-14: *“Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all. Put on then, as God’s chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.”*


Do we always get it right? No - that’s why we need humility & patience. Do we have black stains on our history? Yes - that’s why we need to practice forgiveness & kindness. Do we have a glorious blend of peoples? Yes - that’s why we love; and that’s why we need to preach Christ always.

So this Independence Day, let’s celebrate our identity as Americans, but more than that, let’s embrace and preach and live our identity in Christ. Let’s show our nation - in all its colossal wonder - the wonder of the Colossal freedom Jesus is and gives us. Let’s show what perfect harmony can be!

From the Pastor's Desk...

Genesis 1:16, *And God made the two great lights - the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night - and the stars.*

When I was a little boy, my cousin & I used to stay up late on Friday nights, lay out on the trampoline, and look at the stars. Some nights we'd watch thunderstorms, far off and silent, some nights we'd look up at the moon, but every night - especially during the summers - we'd look up at the stars. Where my parents live, on the edge of Abbeville & Anderson counties, far off from any city or town, you could look up and see millions & millions of stars. I didn't know their names back then, and I couldn't recognize any constellations beyond the Big & Little Dippers, but I knew they were stars, galaxies, the Milky Way, all shining brightly up there.

I love the stars. I grew up with Star Wars and Star Trek and Doctor Who, I had spaceships and astronauts as toys, and my favorite games are about flying among the stars. Even to this day I spend some of my free time playing *No Man's Sky* on our family's PS4. So imagine my delight, after Jesus saved me, to see and hear how the Bible talks about these things we call stars.

In Genesis, we see how God made the stars - and why. In Genesis 1:14 God said, "***Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night. And let them be for signs and for seasons, and for days and years, and let them be lights in the expanse of the heavens to give light upon the earth.***" Later in Genesis God promises Abraham repeatedly that his family will be as countless as the stars in the sky or the sand on the shore.

In Deuteronomy 4:19 Moses warns against worshipping the stars because "***that the LORD your God has allotted to all the peoples under the whole heaven.***" In Judges 5:20 Deborah sings praises to God at the defeat of Sisera the Canaanite, "***From heaven the stars fought, from their courses they fought against Sisera.***" In Job 38:7 God himself asks Job if he had heard the sound "***when the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy?***" And, in Psalm 147:4, as the psalmist is calling on the Church to "Praise the Lord!" he writes that God "***determines the number of the stars; He gives to all of them their names.***"

In his children's adventure *Voyage of the Dawn Treader*, CS Lewis wrote about a boy named Eustace meeting a star and telling him that in his world - in our world - a star is nothing more than a "a huge ball of flaming gas." The star seems to chuckle in Lewis' voice as it replies, "Even in your world, my son, that is not what a star is but only what it is made of." To that, I say Amen! The Bible tells us the stars were made and named by God himself. The stars worshipped God, singing to Him at creation - something they still do today! (check out <https://exoplanets.nasa.gov/news/1516/symphony-of-stars-the-science-of-stellar-sound-waves/> to find out how science yet again helps us appreciate the Bible!)


"***Their voice goes out through all the earth,***" Psalm 19:4 says, echoing Deuteronomy 4, "***their words to the end of the world.***" The stars help us to appreciate, to worship, and to enjoy the God who made them and named them - the same God who made us and names us after the name of Jesus our Savior

So take some time tonight, if you can (and the clouds cooperate): Go out and look at the stars. See the constellations God has bound together. Listen - listen closely! Hear the music of the heavens and know the Lord God, He is good!

From the Pastor's Desk...

I wrote this letter to our youth group a few years ago; I meant to share it back then, but it slipped my mind (as things do). It's the answer to a question maybe you've asked - I know I have: Can someone who commits suicide go to heaven?

Steve was a member of my church many years ago. He was one of those guys who grew up in the church but fell away for a few years, and in those years discovered drinking & drugs. His family was one of the families in his church. So, he got sober and tried to put his life back together again. He'd done this before, but he really wanted it this time. He started back at the church and tried not to listen to the mumbles from the people in the pews who knew where he'd been and what he'd been doing. He & I spoke from time to time, but he was pretty guarded about himself. Steve wanted to be like his family. He wanted to be his own man, and he desperately wanted to be respected. The very last time I saw him, we ran into each other in a Dollar General, of all places, and he seemed to be so happy and carefree. Two days later I found out that he'd committed suicide.

Suicide is the taking of one's own life. That's it - and yet that overly simple definition doesn't tell the whole story, not by far. It doesn't tell the whole story for the person who attempted or committed suicide, nor does it tell the story about all the people "left behind." There are no easy answers - just ask a teacher of mine, Dr. Jack Basie, a man with a heart bigger than himself. Famously he was sitting listening to a young pastor explain his views on life & death, and so Dr. Basie asked him, "Can I go to heaven if I commit suicide?" The young man said yes, and Dr. Basie shook his head: "You just lost one."

There are no flippant, easy, one-word answers to the question of suicide. As a pastor, I won't use statements like "it's a coward's way out" or "it's the easy way out" or even "well, if you do it, you'll go to Hell." Why not? Because I've seen with my own eyes, and I understand that conscious suicide - what happened to Steve - is almost always an ultimate symptom of an incredibly painful mental and emotional disease we call depression.

Let me talk about the Fall - Genesis 3 - for a minute. Because of Adam's & Eve's sins, pain and brokenness entered the world, along with death. The Calvinists have a term for it - "Total Depravity". All that means is that every part of humanity - body, soul, mind, & heart - has been affected by sin. Every part of our human existence - our bodies, our souls, our minds, & our emotions - can be broken. Think about Alzheimer's, cancer, broken bones, even COVID. Now think about depression. Depression can happen to anyone, and it ranges in severity from "I have the blues" to "I can't get out of bed, I can't even function." Sometimes it can come from chemical interactions in that organ we call the brain. Sometimes it happens because things go incredibly wrong in our lives. Sometimes it comes with other diseases or issues. Dr. Neil Anderson says, "Depression often signals that you are desperately clinging to a goal you have little or no chance of achieving, and that is not a healthy goal." There are a lot of causes for depression. Because of this, there are many different ways to treat this disease. Sometimes it can be overcome with prayer, and sometimes it needs medicine to fix it. Sometimes, depression can be helped with counseling, or just by knowing you have a friend you can really, truly trust to listen. But far, far too many times, people suffering from depression don't look for help. They're afraid of being labelled broken. They've been told "it's all in your head." They've been told they need "to get thicker skin." They've been told people with mental illness are either "faking it" or "need to be locked up." So they don't get help - and while, in some instances untreated depression can go away, too many times (and in my mind ONE time is too many) people will look for a way out. They'll self-medicate with drugs or alcohol or sex, with trying to "live it up & force myself to be happy" or trying to be a hero. Or they'll decide there is no way out - except the ultimate way.

The Bible is a brutally honest book. There are people who committed suicide in it, and when we look at their stories, we can almost always see what could be depression. Look at Judas Iscariot, depressed by his guilt over betraying Jesus; Ahithophel, depressed by being fired; King Zimri, depressed by losing his kingdom; Samson, depressed by failing God & looking for a last minute redemption. Just like the people we know, the Steves in our lives, these are people who, though they might have seemed "normal" on the outside, were dealing with an impossible goal, an unimaginable pain. They were people who felt like the only escape was to die. The Bible is incredibly honest about what it means to be human, and sometimes, to be human is to hurt. And because of that, we can trust in what the Bible teaches us about depression & suicide. So what does the Bible teach us?

1. That murder (intentionally killing a human being & it not being self-defense or in defense of another person) is a sin. (Exodus 20:13)
2. That sin will be punished by God. (Romans 6:23)
3. That Jesus paid the price for all the sins of the people who believe in him - past, present & future. (John 3:16, Romans 8:38)
4. That emotions - even "negative" emotions like anger or depression - are not sins, but what we do with them might be. (Ephesians 4:26)
5. That we Christians are called to help each other deal with our emotions, especially sadness & depression. (Galatians 6:2, Matthew 5:4)
6. That sometimes we will face more than we can bear; the Bible makes no promise whatsoever that we won't therefore it is not weakness to need & ask for help! (1 Thessalonians 5:11, Colossians 3:13, Ephesians 4:32)
7. That Jesus himself desires to help those who feel they have no other options and are loaded with more than they can bear - so he helps us help them. (Matthew 11:28-30)

So, as your pastor, here's the bottom line: Jesus can & does forgive any & all sins - including suicide. No true Christian's life - both their life here & their eternal life - should be defined by a single sinful decision. HOWEVER! Jesus calls on us to not despair, nor to give into despair or depression. That means we're called to help each other, and - here's a much scarier thought - to depend on each other for help. You are not alone! You've got Jesus, you've got the Holy Spirit, and you've got your church: me, your elders, your friends, your family. We are here for you. I am here for you. The saddest part of Steve's story is that he & I never got to know each other well enough for him to know he could trust me with his secret hurt, or for me to realize how badly he hurt. I'd only been in North Carolina about a year. He thought he was all alone and had nowhere else to turn, and in a split-second, impulsive decision, looked for the only escape he thought was out there. He wore a mask - a smiling "I've got this" mask. He didn't let anyone see the real Steve and, ironically, was even sadder because no one really knew him. I hope I'll see him again because I know that he was following Jesus; he just stepped off the road a second too long. That's not what I want for any of you, and that's not what God wants for you either - he wants you to know him & trust him always. I hope this is helpful: Pastor Chris



Dear Prayer Partners & Friends,

This is a quick note asking for your prayers in these coming days for camp Porvenir. You may know that a federal judge, who fraudulently purchased a couple lots on what is legally camp property, is suing our camp board members for unlawfully entering his property and damaging protected native shrubs and plants. He claims we cut the plants down to set up fence posts and prepare for construction. The truth is that he himself, working with corrupt police officials, ordered the fence to be set up to mark his property and the town sheriff is the person whom our board president found doing that work the day he was alerted of a trespasser on our camp property. The sheriff and the judge have joined forces to sue for damages with fabricated evidence. The state agency in charge of the conservation of endangered local species of flora and fauna dismissed the counter evidence we provided on this case as invalid and quickly declared us guilty, imposing a huge fine for repairing the damages. This happened in the months of April and May and we were given a very short amount of time to pay for those damages. We quickly appealed the decision at the federal level, asking for a federal court to intervene and review the evidence before paying any fines.

A federal court hearing has now been scheduled for Monday, September 6th, at 10 a.m. here in the city of Merida. The date for this hearing has been delayed twice because the judges presiding each of the previous times were found to be colleagues with personal ties to the judge who purchased the properties in question. We are praying for a fair hearing and decision on the matter of whether or not we are guilty of the charges brought against us. In the meantime, the owner judge has continued to work on the property preparing to build what we understand will be luxury condominiums on the disputed lots. Although there is a pending investigation and we have requested he be ordered to stop all work on the property until a court ruling is given, no local authority has followed through on this request. If the ruling on September 6th finds us guilty of the charges, our board president and other members specifically named in the lawsuit as trespassers could be sentenced to time in prison as well as being fined. Please pray that God will intervene, that the outcome will bring glory to Him and that His will may be done.

While the legal defense to the charges is being prepared for this penal court hearing, we are also working on an offensive case against all unlawful "owners" of our camp property. We are still awaiting a date for a civil court hearing on that matter which is much broader because it involves owners of about 40 lots fraudulently sold on our property. A favorable ruling on September 6th on the trespassing case would truly help us in the greater civil case yet to be scheduled.

We have good lawyers on both the penal and civil cases, but we know the Lord has the final word on this difficult situation. We ask you to pray with us as things are coming to a head now. This is His camp and His property, we are only caretakers of what has been entrusted to us. We thank you for your prayer support and will keep you informed of the ongoing process and outcomes.

From the Pastor's Desk...

On the way to Jerusalem, Jesus passed between the regions of Samaria and Galilee. As He entered a village, He was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and cried out: "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" When He saw them He said, "*Go and show yourselves to the priests.*" And as they went they were cleansed. (Luke 17.11-14)

The most difficult step is the first. Jesus, on the way to Jerusalem and the Cross, cuts across the countryside and finds a village. Just outside this village is a leper camp - and lepers, as we've all been told by preachers since we were little boys & girls, were incurable & untouchable. To touch a leper was to become a leper. And to be a leper was to lose your home, your job, your family, and your comfort. You were a social & literal outcast, unable to do more than shout at non-lepers that heartbreaking cry: "Unclean! Unclean!"

So you can see why these lepers were so desperate to catch the ear of Jesus. They were near enough to town to hear from travelers & townsfolk who threw pennies at them to keep them going, to hear that someone named Jesus had shown up and was "showing out." This Jesus, they heard, controlled wind and storms, this Jesus, they heard, healed little girls and centurions' valets, this Jesus, they heard, fed thousands and thousands with a little boys lunch, this Jesus, they heard, could even raise the dead back to life! And so they cry out, as loud as they could, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!"

And look at this - Jesus takes them at their word. They call Him "Master" (rightly so), and He immediately masters them. He doesn't say, "Be healed," he doesn't mix dirt and spit, he doesn't touch them, he commands them: "Go and obey the procedures God's Law put in place for just this situation" (referring back to Leviticus 14). He doesn't heal them - at first - He commands them to GO. And so, with visibly leprous hands and feet, still feeling, still smelling, still knowing they are lepers, these men turn and they start on the long road to the priests... And it's only as they go they are healed.


The most difficult step is the first.

If we call Jesus "Master" - something we ought to be doing - then we need to let Jesus master us just as much as He masters these lepers. If we call Jesus "Lord" - the Bible tells us so! - then we must let Jesus lord himself over us. If we call Jesus "Savior", if we call Jesus "King", if we call Jesus "our God" - then we need to behave as though Jesus is our God.

This month celebrates the first sparks of the Protestant Reformation, that moment in time when the Church herself had a choice to make - will Jesus be Lord and Savior and Master and King - or will human tradition & thinking? Does Jesus and His Word reign - or do ours? The Reformers found their answers in God's Word, and challenge us to do the same. So they tell us, be like those lepers: When Jesus says "Go," go. When Jesus says "Forgive," forgive. And when Jesus says "Do," do - not for our own sake, or the sake of those for whom we do what Jesus tells us - do for the glory of Jesus the Master. It takes faith. It takes self-sacrifice. It takes Holy Spirit power. The most difficult step is the first -

But it's into Jesus' footsteps we're stepping.

NEWS FROM THE SESSION...

This week, I wrapped up reading a book by Tim Keller who in theology circles, is one of the most well-respected Presbyterian thinkers and writers of our age. He has written countless books it seems, and all are well-worth the read. This specific book is entitled *Counterfeit Gods*. In a nutshell, the central premise is recognizing that we all have idols and we must re-focus on God versus those idols. He makes clear that idols do not literally have to be a statue or some other God. Rather, an idol can be a friend, a want, a child, a parent, or even proper theology. Keller describes an idol as anything more important to you than God. So, if you put doctrine before God, it has become an idol. If you put your parent's blessing before God's, it has become an idol.

What idol are you struggling with? What idol is the church struggling with? How can you help the church with that idol? How can the church help you with your idol? God made us in His image, and the church is where we live that out. They each feed another. We as a Session are here for you: to hold your hand, point you in the right direction, to listen. 

From the Pastor's Desk... (adapted from a sermon I preached in 2017)

"It's convenient having a preacher in the family - after all, now we don't have to worry about who'll say the blessing."

And I can say, without exaggeration, I've heard that statement (or ones just like it) more than once or twice. I guess having a preacher in the family is like having a doctor or mechanic - you know just who to go to when you need to know about that knocking in your engine, knee, or soul.

So, a few years ago my dad asked me, "Why don't preachers talk about victory anymore? All I hear is how beat up we are by the world & Satan, and how desperate we are. Why don't preachers talk about victory?" I got bothered by that question, because I got to thinking about a lot of sermons I'd been listening to, and a lot of preachers I'd been reading. We did talk a lot about how hard the world is, and we weren't talking about victory. Why was that?

After all, doesn't Paul tell the Corinthians, "Thanks be to God, who gives us the victory in Christ Jesus"? Doesn't John shout, "The victory that has overcome the world is our faith"? Why aren't we preachers emphasizing Christian victory?

We need to know about victory, not as the world defines it, but as God defines victory - our victory in Christ Jesus. What does the Bible say? Well, as Paul, John & the other apostles tell us, Jesus is the source of our victory. It's like one of Daddy's favorite songs, our victory is in Jesus. So what does Jesus teach us about victory & thanksgiving for that victory? (It's November; we can't help but think about Thanksgiving, right?)

In the Gospels there are 4 times we see Jesus' thanksgiving: (1) When he's preaching about faith in Matthew 11:25-28, (2) When he feeds the 5,000 with 7 loaves & fish in Mark 8:6-8, (3) When he raises Lazarus from death in John 11:41-44, & (4) When he shares what he shares at the Last Supper in Luke 22:14-20.

In Matthew 11, Jesus gives thanks as he gives us a reason to be thankful for a "childlike" faith (& rest) in Him. My daughter used to put herself down for a nap when she was 2. How often, as adults, do we ignore our need for rest - we try & outsmart it. What does rest do for us? It changes our attitude. It gives us strength. It changes our perspective. It can make us easier to be around. It helps us be ready to help. Jesus wants us to live in victory & thanks God that in Him we have true, Sabbath-rest - **and rest is victory!**

In Mark 8, Jesus gives thanks as he gives us a reason to be thankful for a "hungry" faith (& sustenance) in him. My dog, half-chihuahua, half-dachshund and all mouth & stubbornness, will do anything for a treat. She'll hop, she'll dance, she'll sit & roll over. It's amazing what we'll do for hunger, especially a hunger for love. What happens when we take that hunger & give it to Jesus? In Him, our hunger & thirst for God's love will be satisfied. What does satisfaction do in our lives? It makes us work harder. It keeps us going. It makes us want to find others' satisfaction, too. Jesus wants us to live in victory & thanks God that in Jesus we are truly satisfied - **and satisfaction is victory!**

In John 11, Jesus gives thanks as he gives us a reason to be thankful for a victorious faith in him (& his resurrection). My Granddaddy was a hard man. He'd drank, owned a still, shot at people, fought, farmed, cussed, and threatened. Yet, I praise God that in his last days, just like that thief on the cross, he met Jesus, and that in the last days & hours of his life, he started to make things right. That's what faith in Jesus does. It brings dead things to life: Dead relationships, dead families, dead communities, even dead souls. Jesus wants us to live in victory & thanks God that in Jesus we can live - **and living is victory!**

Finally, in Luke 24, Jesus gives thanks as He gives us a reason to be thankful for forgiveness & the Cross. Jesus thanks God his Father that He is about to do the great work of salvation. He thanks God for the broken bread, the poured wine, and the everlasting commitment that God makes to us at Jesus' expense. We can rest in the forgiveness Jesus earns. We are satisfied by what Jesus gives. We live because Jesus wants us to live in victory & thanks be to God that in Jesus we have it - **Jesus is the victory!**

God defines victory through Jesus; Jesus defines victory through faith in him - and for that, even Jesus gives thanks. So let's live that victory in Jesus. Let's live that simple, rested faith. Let's live that satisfaction in knowing our Lord & Savior is our friend. Let's live because Jesus has given us life! Let's live in blessed forgiveness, forgiving & being forgiven in his holy name - and let's live thanksgiving to the One who makes this possible.

My wife bakes cookies, we pop corn, and the 5 of us sit in the den to watch Charlie Brown, Lucy, Linus, Peppermint Patty, Marcy & Snoopy manage to turn every major fall & winter holiday into an adventure. It doesn't matter that I've seen these movies since I was a boy, or that our kids are all (mostly) grown up - we do this every year and *love it*. For me, though, my undisputedly favorite of the three (main) "Peanuts" holiday movies is *A Charlie Brown Christmas*.

Who can't identify with Charlie Brown's lament: ***"Everything I do turns into a disaster. I guess I really don't know what Christmas is all about."***

Who hasn't had great plans go wrong around Christmas? 

It was a day that I'll never forget at Lugoff-Elgin High School

It started during the afternoon. After visiting with head football Coach **Matt Campbell** and Assistant Coach **Mike Armstrong**, I met with a few of the basketball players with Coach Jones in the weight room and with Coach Ham's volleyball team in the gym. I eventually headed out to the football field where Coach Campbell gave me a few minutes with the team after practice.

I shared the simple truth of the greatest motivation verse, Colossians 3:23. But it wasn't about motivating them to play harder and win more games. I addressed other areas of their lives, like their grades and behavior. I reminded these guys that when Christ is first in our lives, it should change the way we do everything. It was a quick, yet salty message, to make them thirsty!

Shortly after practice, I headed over to the **Fields of Faith** event at the football stadium. **Fields of Faith** is an annual FCA event on many of our campuses nationwide where students challenge their peers to read the Bible and follow Jesus Christ. There was great worship, student testimonies and a local youth pastor sharing the gospel.



Afterwards, I approached a football player who attended. God was already working in his heart. After we reviewed the message, I asked him, "what would keep you from surrendering your life to Christ, even right now." He said, "Nothing"! His heart was ready!

What happened next will go down as one of my all time highlights in my entire ministry career. We knelt together at the 50 yard line of his own football stadium and he surrendered his life to Christ. It didn't matter that others might see him and he didn't care who was watching. Soon after, his friends rushed to congratulate him and he was overwhelmed with quiet tears of joy.

The next day, I went back to Lugoff Elgin and I was available to talk with players after practice. I wasn't surprised when **Broughton Gardner**, the starting quarterback, approached me and he wanted to talk. Once again, God had been preparing his heart, and he was also ready to surrender his life to Christ. This time we were all alone in the end zone of his practice field and he knelt and asked Jesus to be his Savior.
