



### What's this story about?

The family's car gets stuck in a muddy field. A tractor comes to the rescue.

### Talk together

Talk about things we push or pull. Ask, "Do you think you could push a car?"

### Read the story

- Page 1, segment the phonemes in 'stuck' (s-t-u-ck).
- Pages 2 and 5, ask children to listen to the 'sh' sound in 'pushed' and the 'l' sound in 'pulled'.
- Page 6, segment the phonemes in 'tractor' (t-r-a-c-t-or).
- Page 6 ask, "What do you think will happen?"

Mum pushed it.




# Biff and Chip pushed it.

# Oh no!

#### Play a game

#### Push and pull

#### To help spelling.

- Mime pulling on a boot, or pushing a pram. Ask, "Am I pushing or pulling?" When the child answers correctly, say, "Spell 'push'" or "Spell 'pull'".
- Have two or three turns each.

#### Other ideas

#### You can use these ideas straight away, or on another day.

- Let children look for words that they know how to spell. If they say, "I can spell car", close the book and ask them to spell the word. Then check it in the book.
- Act out the story with a toy car and a toy tractor. Tie string to the tractor to pull the car.
