What's this story about?

Mum and Dad are going out to a party, so a baby-sitter comes to be with the children. But the children can't sleep and they all have a good time - including the baby-sitter!

Talk together

Talk about who baby-sitters are and what they do. Has the child ever had a baby-sitter? If so, was the baby-sitter kind?

Read the story






- Look at the cover and read the title.
- Look through the story and point out any tricky words, e.g. 'couldn't' (page 5), 'fight' (page 10).
- Read the story together.
- To help the child read longer words, break them down into syllables, e.g. 'down/stairs' (page 4), 'sand/wich' (page 9), 'every/ one' (page 11).
- Page 9, ask, "Why does the baby-sitter look worried?"
- Page 11, ask, "How has his expression changed? Why?"
- Page 14, ask, "Why is the baby-sitter holding a vacuum cleaner?"
- Page 16, ask, "Why is Dad holding the vacuum cleaner? What is he thinking?"
- At the end of the story, ask, "Do you think the baby-sitter would baby-sit again? Why?" "Do you think he is a good baby-sitter?"



The baby-sitter came.















Play a game

'NO' spells no

To help the child to spell short words.

- Choose a two-letter word from the story: 'go', 'to', 'he', 'we',
 'he', 'in', 'no'. Use the letter names to spell it, and ask the child
 to say the word.
- Then ask the child to spell out a word from the story for you to say.
- Have two or three turns each.

Other ideas

You can use these ideas straight away, or on another day.

- Suppose Mum and Dad had come back early. Talk about what they might have said.
- On pages 8 and 9, read all the labels on the food. Notice which ones are written in capital letters.
