What's this story about?

When Kipper can't tie his laces at school, other children laugh at him. Dad makes a block for Kipper to practise on. Kipper tries very hard and at last he can do up his laces – but then he discovers that he has tied his shoes together!

Talk together

Talk about learning to tie laces and how difficult it can be. Can the child tie his/her shoe laces? Briefly look at the pictures to see what happens to Kipper.

Read the story




- Before reading, look at the word 'couldn't' on page 2 and help the child to guess what it says. Ask, "Can you see a word inside 'couldn't'?"
- Read the story together.
- Page 4, ask, "What subject are the children doing?"
- Page 7, talk about the boys who are laughing. Ask, "Are they being kind to Kipper? How do you think Kipper feels?"
- Page 10, ask the child to run the sounds together in 'block': b-l-o-ck.
- Count how many times the word 'tried' is found on pages 12 and 13.
- G Ask, "What does this tell us about Kipper?"





Play a game

Capital Letters

This game helps the child to recognise capital letters.

- Look through the book and find words with capital letters.
 Notice whether the capital letters are used to begin a sentence or a name.
- Choose one of the capital letters and ask the child to find it and show it to you.
- Then the child chooses a capital letter and asks you to find it.
- Have two or three turns each.

Other ideas

You can use these ideas straight away, or on another day.

- Look at the letters on the blackboard on page 5 of the story. Say the alphabet together, putting in the letters that you cannot see on the page.
- If the child has trouble doing up laces, use a block or a shoe to practise. Give plenty of praise for trying.
