### What's this story about?

### Talk together

Read the title, explaining 'hey presto'. Talk about magic tricks.

## Read the story



- Begin to read the story together.
- Sound out the first letter of the word(s) that the child finds difficult.
- Page 16, ask, "Do you think this was a clever trick?"
- Ask the child to read the story again, praising good reading.

She was called Sheena.


## She took Dad's tie.






She put it in a bag.


# She took Mum's ear-ring.

#### Play a game

#### Hey presto!

To help the child work out what makes sense in a sentence.

- Cover a word in the story. Ask the child to read the sentence, guessing the hidden word.
- When they have guessed, say, "Hey presto!" and uncover it.
- Read to check that the guess was right.
- Then the child does the same for you.
- Have a few turns each.

#### Other ideas

You can use these ideas straight away, or on another day.


- Find 'took' in the story. Count the number of times it appears.
- Turn three containers upside down on a table. Put an object under one. Slide the mugs around. Ask the child to choose the mug with the object. Say, "Hey presto!" and lift the mug. Was he/she right?
