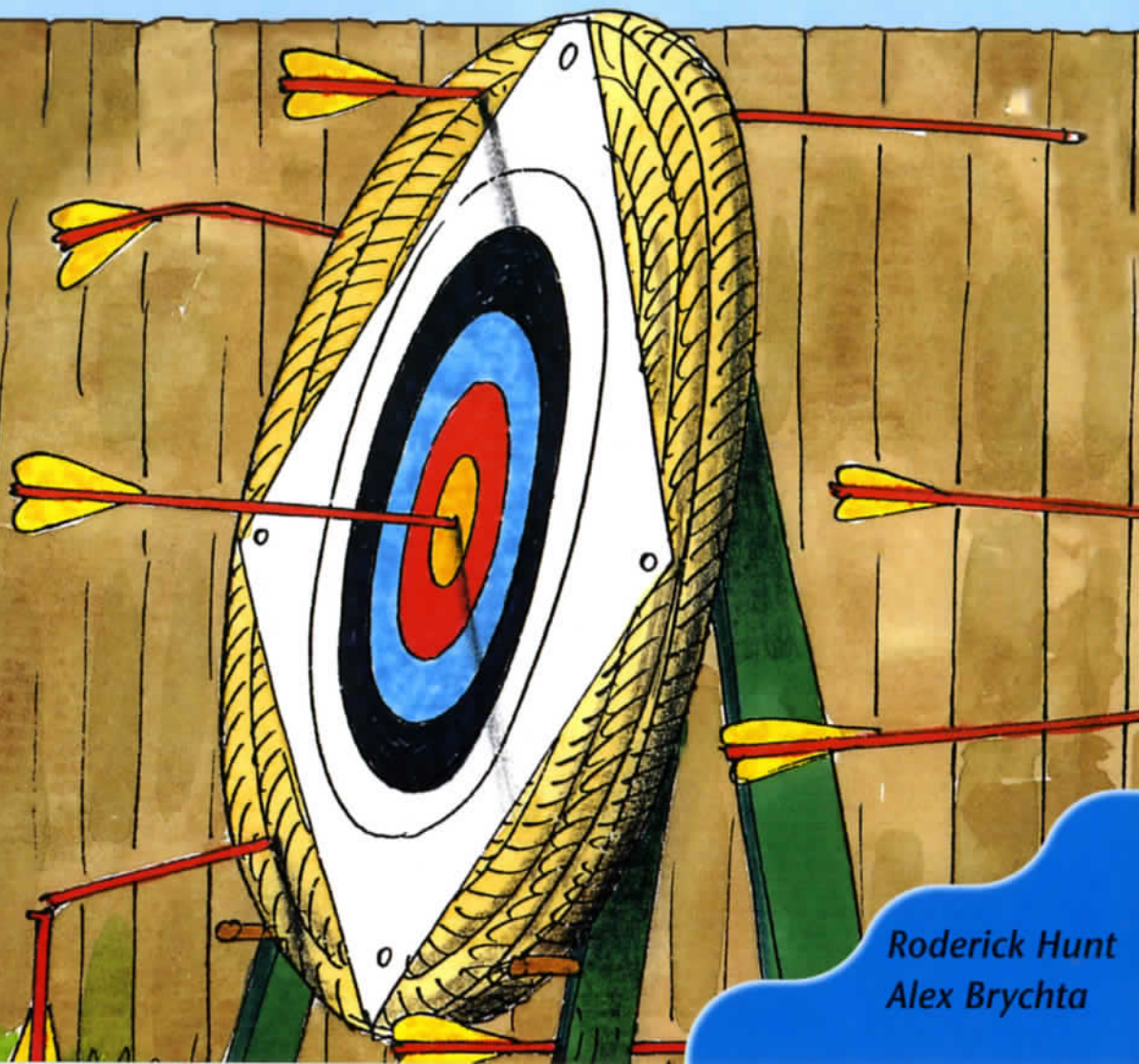

What's this story about?

At the school fair Dad gets cross when he can't get a bull's-eye and win a teddy. But when he gets caught in a fight, he wins the teddy by accident!

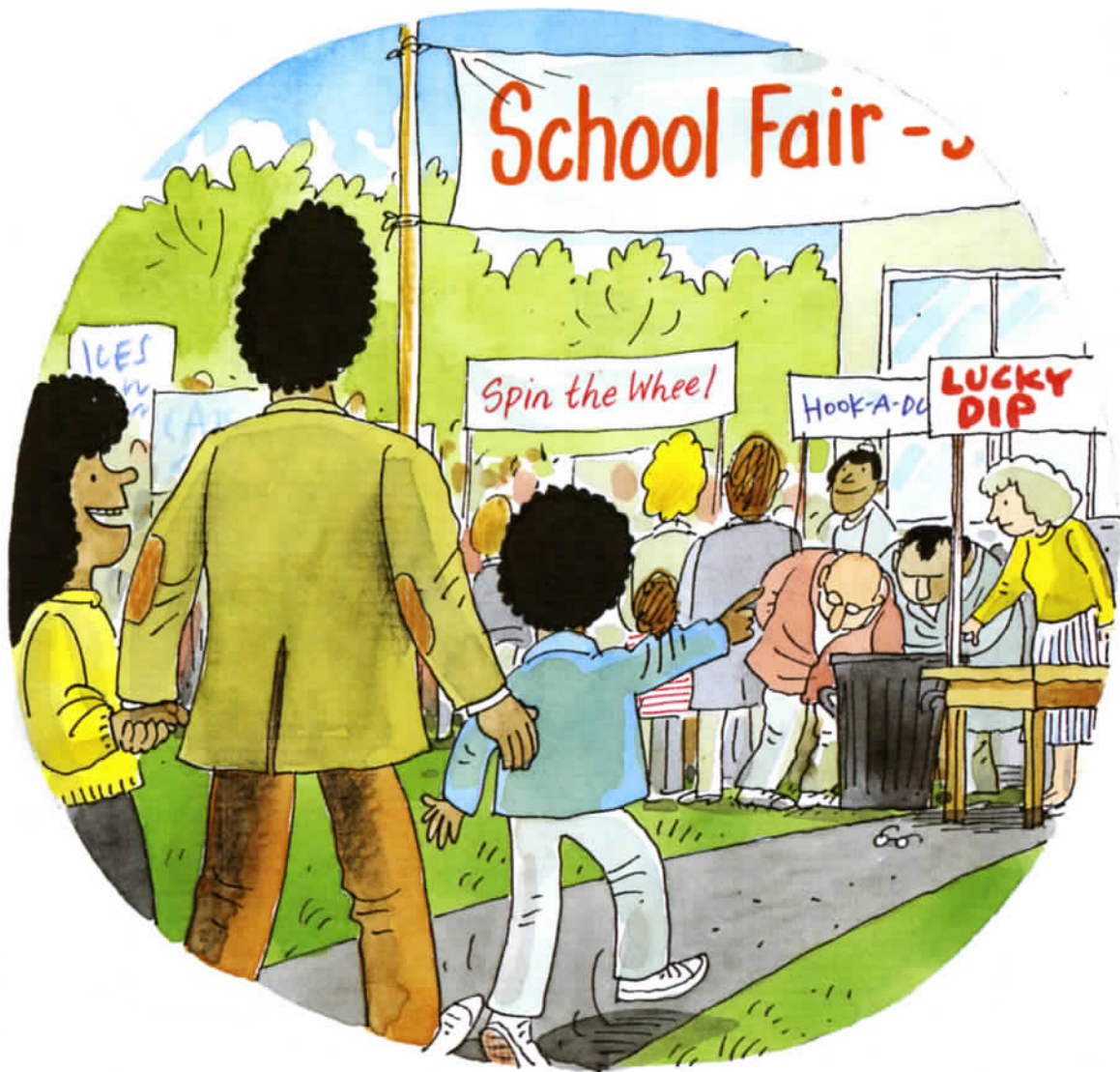
Talk together

Read the title on the cover and explain that the bull's-eye is the centre ring of the target. Talk about any school fairs you have been to.

Read the story

W = Word recognition **G** = Language comprehension

- G** Read the banners and notices to find out what you can do at the fair.
- W** Page 10, work out 'display' by noticing that it is 'd-i-s' and 'play'.
- G** Page 12, talk about why Wilma was cross.
- G** Page 16, ask, "Why did Wilf and Wilma stop fighting?" "What do you think their dad will do with the teddy?"

Wilma wanted a book.

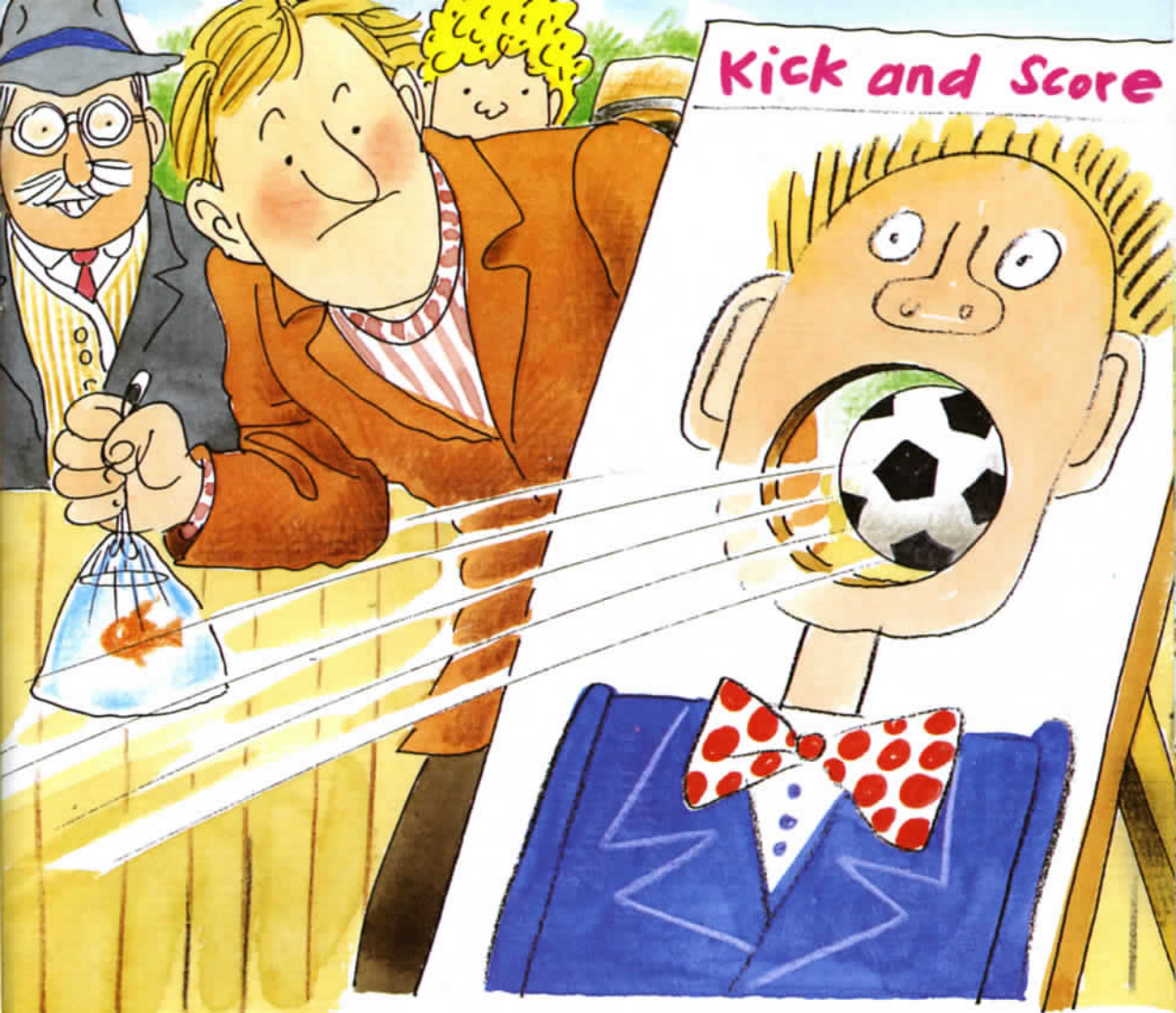




Her dad bought it for her.

Wilf kicked the ball.

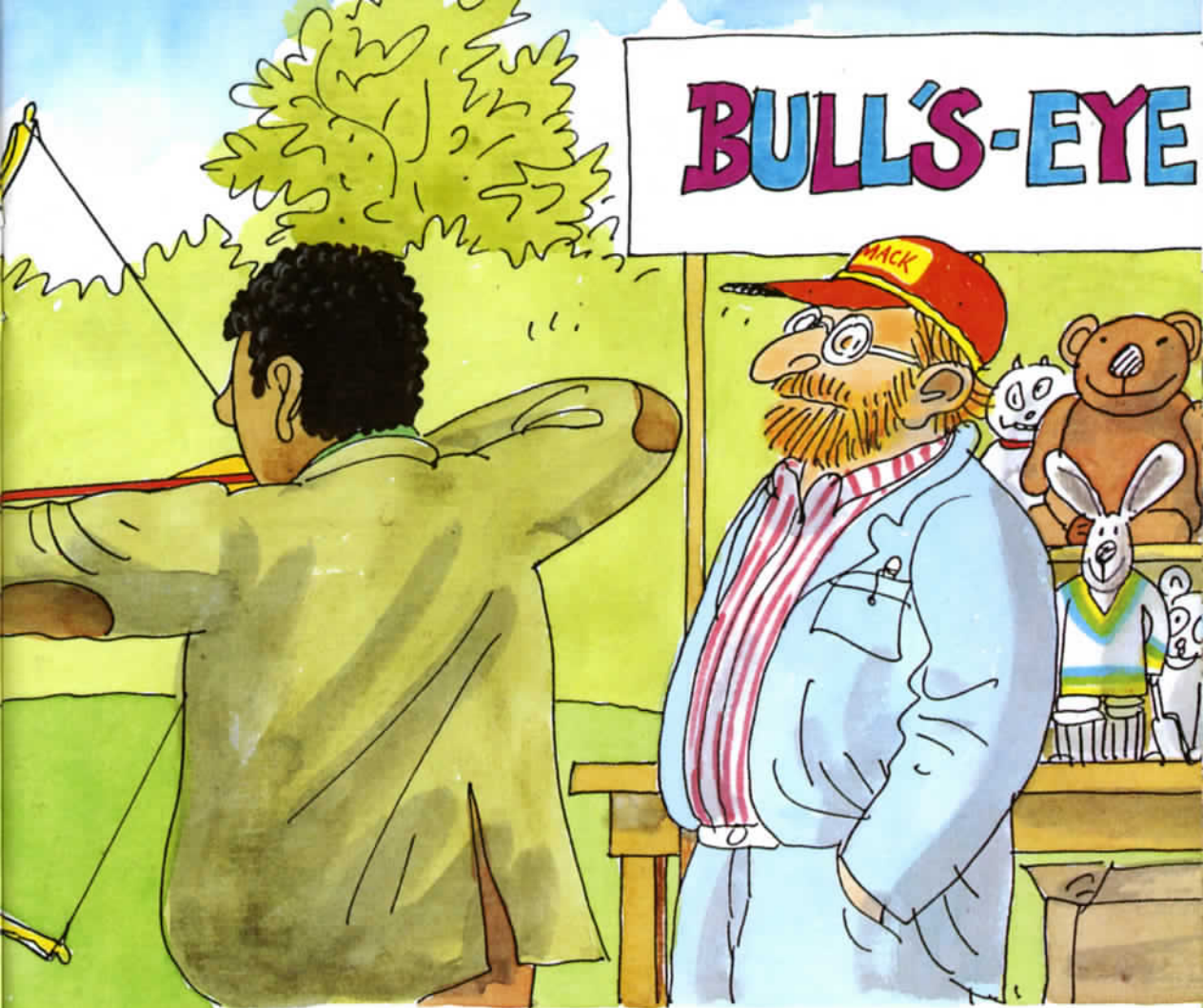




He won a goldfish.

Dad wanted to win a teddy.

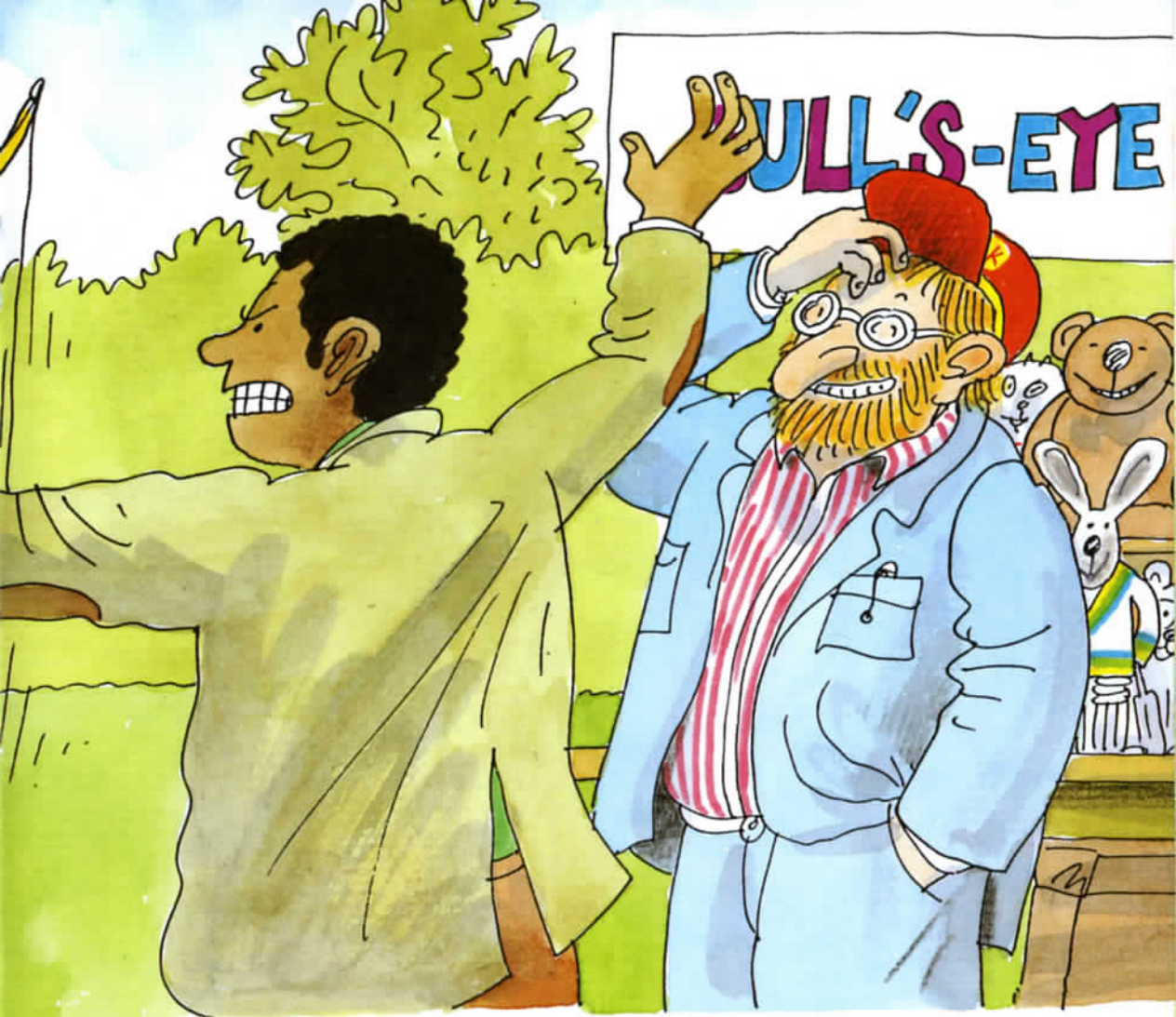




He had to hit a bull's-eye.

Wilma was in the gym display.

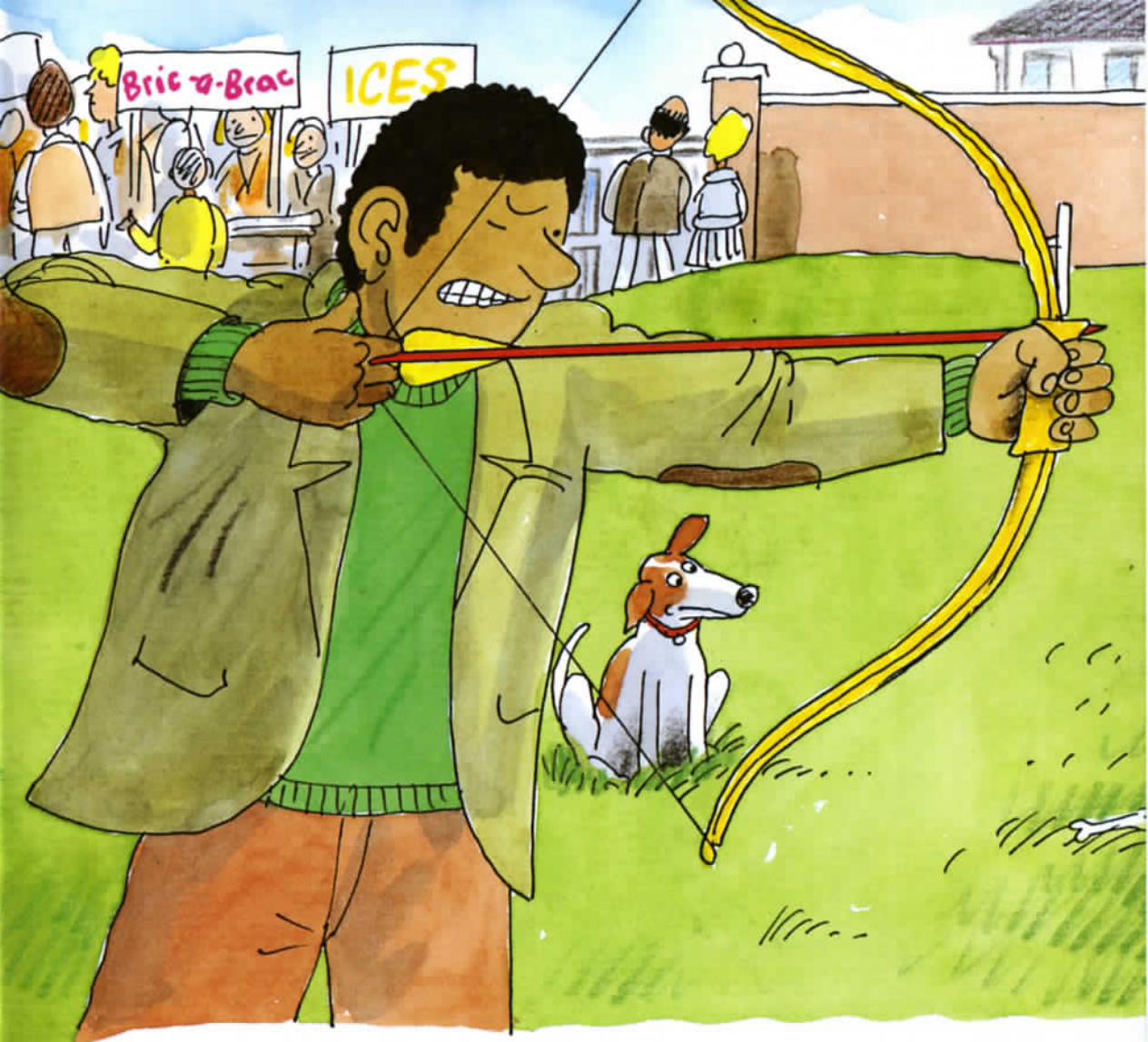




Wilf and Dad forgot to

Play a game

Bull's-eye!

This helps children to think logically and to ask questions.

- Pick a double page and choose a word. The child has to ask questions so that he/she can guess the word, e.g. "How many letters?" "What does it begin with?" "Does it start with a capital letter?"
- When the child has guessed correctly ask him/her to choose a word for you to guess.

Other ideas

You can use these ideas straight away, or on another day.

- Look for the words 'fight' and 'bought' in the story. Which letters can you hear? Which ones are silent?
- Set up and play a target game, e.g. "Can you throw a soft ball into a bucket?"
