# What's this story about?


## Talk together

If the child has moved house, ask him/her to talk about it.

# Read the story




- Read the story together.
- Page 1, work out 'van' using letter sounds: v-a-n.
- Find these words that need to be recognised on sight: 'they', 'what', 'said'.
- Point to the exclamation marks on pages 2 and 3. Ask the child to read these sentences aloud. Explain that when a sentence has an exclamation mark, it needs to be read with lots of expression. Find and read aloud other sentences that have exclamation marks (pages 5, 7, 10, 11, 15, 16).
- Ask, "What did Kipper, Biff and Chip put in the van?" Can the child find the pages?
- Ask, "Do you think the family enjoyed moving house?"




A van came to the house.



"What a big van!" said Chip.




"What a big man!" said Kipper.




The man looked at the things.




"What a lot of things!" he said.




Mum and Dad helped the man. They put things in the van.




"What a job!" said Dad.




The children helped too. Kipper put his toys in the van.

## Play a game

#### When I moved house I packed...

#### To help the child to concentrate and remember what has been said.

- Think of something you would pack if you moved house. Say,
   "When I moved house I packed my clothes."
- The child thinks of something else, and says, e.g. "When I moved house I packed my clothes and my teddy."
- Go on taking turns, adding another thing each time.
- Have fun going on until you begin to forget what came next.

## Other ideas

#### You can use these ideas straight away, or on another day.

- Ask the child to find words with three letters in the story and to say the sounds of the letters in each word, e.g. 'job': j-o-b. The child can then practise spelling them.
- Find 'man' and 'van' in the story (pages 2 and 3). Ask the child to think of as many words as he/she can that rhyme with 'man'.
   Praise the child for thinking of lots of words.
