What's this story about?

The family is decorating the new house. When they pull off the old wallpaper they find a door to a secret room. Inside the secret room there is a doll's house.


Talk together

Talk about the work involved in redecorating a room. Ask the child if he/she has ever helped to decorate at home. Ask, "Do you remember what it looked like before?"

Read the story



- Look through the pictures to see what happens. Read the story together.
- Page 5, notice what Biff was thinking. Ask, "What kind of wallpaper did Biff want?"
- Page 17, ask, "Who do you think had made the little house?"
- On page 18, if the child reads 'finded' for 'found', show them how to look at the letter sounds: f-ou-n-d.
- Discuss where the family found the secret room. Help the child to find the evidence in the book to show that it is in Biff's room, e.g. look at pages 6 and 7 which show Mum, Dad and Biff buying the wallpaper for Biff's room before they put it up on pages 8–11; turn to page 22 to see the secret room within Biff's room and then read about it on page 23.
- Ask the child to read the story to you. Decide how much to read, then put in a bookmark and read more tomorrow.



Biff and Chip liked the new house. They helped Mum and Dad.




Mum put wallpaper on the wall. Chip helped her.

Biff wanted new wallpaper.




They went to the wallpaper shop.

Biff and Chip helped. "What a job!" said Chip.




Biff found a door.

Everyone looked inside.




Mum went into the secret room. She found a little house.

"It looks like our house inside," said Biff.




Kipper found a little dog. "Look at this little dog," said Kipper.




"It looks like our dog. It looks like Floppy."




Chip found three little children.

Play a game

Find '-ed' words

To help the child to notice spelling patterns in words.

- Open the book at any page. Ask the child to look for a word that ends with '-ed'.
- The child opens the book at any page for you to look for an '-ed' word.
- Have two or three turns each, then read all the '-ed' words you can find in the story. See who can spot the most.

Other ideas

You can use these ideas straight away, or on another day.

- Find 'found' on pages 10, 14, 18 and 20. Together, practise spelling 'found'.
- Talk about what it would be like to find a secret room. Ask the child to imagine what might be inside it. Ask, "What would you like to find inside the room?"
