## What's this story about?

## Talk together


If the child has been in a play or concert at school, talk about what happened. If he/she likes dressing up, ask, "Who do you like pretending to be?" Look at the pictures on the cover. Guess who or what each child is pretending to be.

# Read the story






- Read the story together. Talk about the pictures as you read.
- Page 6, show the child how to work out 'Dorothy' using letter sounds: D-o-r-o-th-v.
- Page 8, point out that 'Scarecrow' is made up of two words: 'scare' and 'crow'.
- Pages 16 and 17, use the pictures to see which child is inside each costume.
- Page 24, ask, "Why did Chip say it was like the play?"
- Together, discuss what happened in the story in the right order. Use the book to help you.
  - Ask the child to read the story again. If necessary, put in a bookmark and read more tomorrow.



Biff and Chip went to school. They went with Wilf and Wilma.




Biff and Chip liked Mrs May. They were in her class.

It was story time.




The story was The Wizard of Oz. It was about a girl and her dog.




The girl was Dorothy.




There was a storm. The wind blew the house away.

Biff was a witch.




Wilf's dad helped Mrs May. He painted a house.

"It's like the play," said Chip.


