Then there's formatting—a detail many underestimate. From margins and spacing to ebook conversion, you'll need software and technical know-how. And because platforms like Amazon KDP, IngramSpark, and Barnes & Noble Press all have different requirements, expect to make adjustments along the way.

### The Final Steps: Proofs, Platforms & Patience

Before you release your book into the world, always order a proof copy. This lets you check print quality, formatting, and cover alignment. If it's off, you'll need revisions—and patience. Once approved, you'll also want to consider distributing beyond one platform, expanding your reach through additional marketplaces.

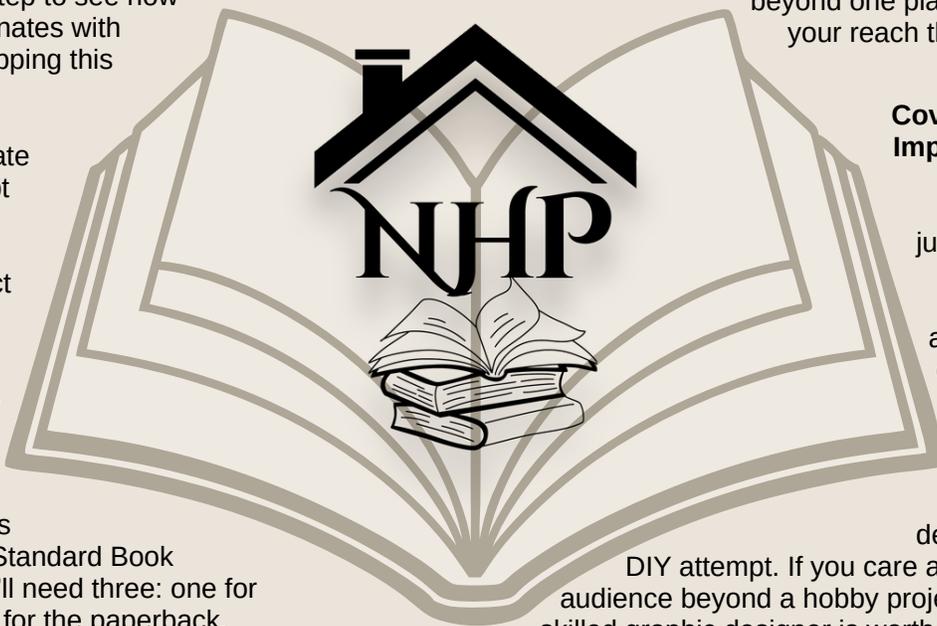
### Cover Design: First Impressions Matter
