

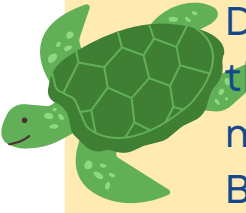

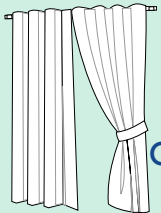
DO

Babies are in risk. As soon as possible, alert the staff of your hotel. Soliman bay has trained and authorized volunteers that know how to help

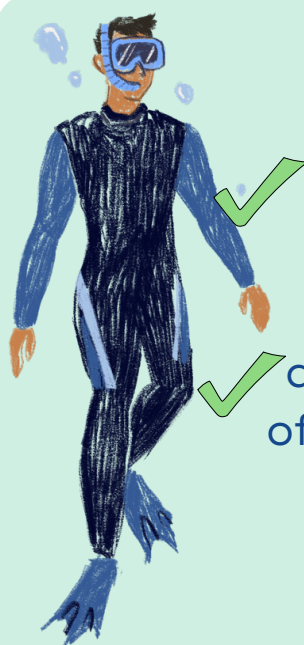
