SITE SAFETY AND HEALTH PLAN

The following rules will apply to all jobs and trades where Patrick St Peter & Sons is the subcontractor. All workers are expected to be familiar with these rules and to communicate this information to their supervisors and employees prior to starting work on any project. Safety and health is on the same level of importance as production.

GENERAL RULES

1. No horseplay or practical jokes in any area of the job site.
2. Alcohol and illegal drug possession or use on the job site is forbidden and will be grounds for immediate termination.
3. No weapons or explosives allowed on job site.
4. No smoking is permitted within 10 feet of a NO SMOKING designated area. Conditions may warrant that an entire job site will be posted as a no smoking area.
5. All areas of the project are to be considered HARD HAT areas, unless specific Authorization is given not to wear hard hats. In instances where employees come to the job site without hard hats, they will be refused admittance.
6. Safety glasses and shoes must be worn at all times.
7. The company will provide you with the necessary safety gear. Safety shields and masks must be worn when doing any type of cutting or grinding tasks. Hearing protection is required when work being performed creates a high decibel level. You are expected to use it.
8. General contractor supplies all electrical power. Patrick St Peter & Sons' employees are responsible for properly working GFCI's and approved extension cords on all tools requiring electrical power.
9. All workers will be required to attend safety meetings at least once each week and must comply with OSHA standards.

SAFETY RESPONSIBILITY

Patrick St Peter & Sons (PSP & S) will designate a qualified individual as their site safety representative. This individual will conduct periodic safety inspections. Immediate action will be taken to correct substandard work conditions or activities.

Safety is everyone's responsibility. Employees must report any unsafe conditions to the supervisor immediately. Tools and equipment shall be inspected before using and any damage or defects reported.

PSP & S has a Hazardous Communication Program. Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) will be available on the job site for any hazardous material that will be used on the job site. Employees will be trained in their use. Read the MSDS or container label before using any chemical or hazardous material so you will be aware of the possible dangers.

Housekeeping is everyone's responsibility. Workers will be required to pick up debris, tools, and equipment and carry them to the proper disposal or storage location at the end of each work day.

Fall protection will be used any time a worker is going to be over six feet up. Workers will follow all posted safety instructions and respect barricades and controlled access zones.

ACCIDENT CONTROL PLAN

All accidents, no matter how small, must be reported immediately to your supervisor. An accident report shall be filled out with as much detail as possible. A safety meeting will be held to review exactly what happened.

Employees shall be made aware of the location of emergency phone numbers, first aid kits, eyewash or fresh water supply.

First Aid should only be administered by those who are First Aid qualified. When there is an injury, notify one of these people. They can be identified by a Red Cross emblem on their hard hats. All workers must abide by the OSHA Bloodborne pathogen standard. It requires the use of latex gloves when contacting an injured person with exposed body fluids.

Be prepared to be tested for alcohol or drugs after being involved in any injury or property damage incident.

FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION

Be aware of the location of fire extinguishers in your work area and know how to use them. Use safety cans for disposing of oily/greasy rags or flammables.

Smoke only in designated areas. Dispose of butts properly.

Know the procedures to call for help in the event of a fire.
