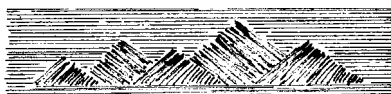

MoJo Sonoma County 2014 “Eight Barrels”

Blend: 34% Cabernet Sauvignon, 33% Malbec, 23% Syrah & 10% Petit Verdot

Sources: Produced from 66% Napa Valley and 34% Sonoma County grapes. All of the sangiovese and a portion of the cabernet sauvignon came from Napa Valley. The remaining cabernet sauvignon and all of the cabernet franc came from Dry Creek Valley and the syrah was sourced from Sonoma Valley.

Alcohol: 14.2%

Fermentation: Fermented in open top bins, hand punched down. Full malolactic fermentation for all varietals was completed in 59 gallon oak barrels.

Barrel Aging: 30 months in new and 2nd use 59 gallon French oak.

Residual Sugar: Dry

Winemakers Notes:

In voodoo a mojo is a mixture of various things that gives the one who wears it a desired power over someone or something. Our MoJo combines the black currant aromas and flavors of cabernet sauvignon and petit verdot with the black cherry of malbec and black plum of syrah to create this richly, powerful and influential wine. Please use it wisely!

This is our most powerful wine in aroma and length of finish. This wine should age gracefully and improve for at least 10 years after the vintage date.
