Rector's Ramble

Jeremiah 4:11-12,22-28, 1 Timothy 1:12-17, Luke 15:1-10
Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost Luke 15:6

Dear Friends,

Thank you for your prayers this week at the Chichester Diocese Clergy Conference held at the University of Kent and Canterbury Cathedral. It was a good few days with some very intense teaching on our understanding of the Trinity within the Nicene Creed, from an Evangelical, Catholic and Eastern Orthodox perspective, with the overall understanding that the relationship we see expressed between the One in Three & the Three in One is love. And that our Creed is to be celebrated as an expression of that love, and as a witness to our faith.



We also had a very challenging lecture/after dinner speaker by Dr Eve Pool on our understanding of AI & the Soul, and her book Robot Souls, Programming in Humanity, but more of that another time!!

Despite the intensity of the conference topics, it was a good few days of sharing our faith and experiences of parish ministry together and our Conference closed with a truly beautiful Mass and service of healing and reconciliation in the Crypt of Canterbury Cathedral.

Despite the appalling traffic back from Canterbury (4.5 hours) I made it back for the first NYC of the year, with 29 years 7's attending our early session and 38 year 8,9&10's attending the later one.

One of the conversations I had at Conference has meant that we've been invited to join St Andrews Burgess Hill for a combined youth service on Sunday 28th September and we will be hiring a minibus to take some of our second session youth who are eager to attend.

Please be praying for NYC and for Lee and myself as we look toward building a stronger relationship with Chailey Secondary school over the coming months and for our fantastic new Headteacher Paul Holt.

This Saturday we have our Harvest Festival Celebration at the Five Bells in Chailey, where I will be offering a Blessing of the Hops & Crops, and St Peter's Choir will be singing some Harvest Bangers, along with Vintage Tractors, Craft stalls, Real Ale Tent, live music and the Horticultural Show earlier in the day at the Village Hall. It should be a wonderful celebration.

This Sunday at both St Mary's and St Peter's we continue our journey through Luke's Gospel by entering Chapter 15 of Luke, which contains three different stories about finding lost things, lost sheep, lost coins and a lost (prodigal) son. It also tells us about the celebrations that take place when these lost things are found. As it does, it picks up one of the great themes of Luke, the joy of blessings showered on God's faithful people as a result of repentance and finding new life.



But the passage in Luke is not just about getting people to repent and finding new life; it's also about valuing people as people, even when they're lost.

One of the ways Jesus shows those around Him that He values people is that He enters into close relations with them, even if they are people that the established religious order would never reach out to, the tax collectors and sinners, people of low repute.

Jesus meets them on their terms. He is not prepared to write them off, as his critics did, or to say, as they would

have, I will value you and welcome only if you repent.

Jesus seeks out the lost, even the lost who don't know they're lost, and values them as they are. He seeks out those who society may have written off as losers, no hopers, wasters, and gives them life and hope.

Jesus seeks out the large and the small to redeem and value.

In our own lives, He seeks out those areas which we may have written off; areas that we prefer to hide and not speak about, habits we have we wish we didn't, areas of our lives we hope no one sees. He seeks them out because He wants to redeem those too and give us hope in the 'no go' areas of our lives.

God also wants to use us to seek out the lost and the hopeless and give them His hope and His direction. Part of our mission activity is exactly that, seeking out situations that seem hopeless and giving hope, through our prayers, time, effort, resources and money whether at home or abroad. God calls out to the lost people and places in our lives and in our world and values them for who and what they are, and who and what they can become. As He does, so should we.

And once the lost are found, we should rejoice and celebrate.

Because in being found, in turning around and repenting, in discovering true value, all creation comes that little but closer to being restored to the way God intended it to be.

And as we celebrate and rejoice, Heaven does too.

Have a good week, be joyful, keep the faith and keep doing the little things that make a difference to those you love and those in need.


Useful information - text scams....

If you receive a text that you think may be a scam - check with a friend or Google it.

Here is a prime example of the one currently doing the rounds about the winter fuel allowance. Do not respond. Dept of Work and Pensions (DWP) will never text and ask

for detail and if you are eligible - you will receive it automatically. If you want to contact the DWP do so via the Gov website - DO NOT click on the text message.

For this type of scam you can either click on the report as junk function if you have it on your phone or - forward the text to 7726 and your phone provider will log it and then block it.






Exciting opportunity to get involved with our Youth Work at St Mary's
