Rector's Ramble

"For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time for my departure is near. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing." — 2 Timothy 4:6–8

Dear Friends,

As the clocks prepare to go back this weekend and autumn settles in, we're reminded of the rhythm of seasons and the constancy of God through all of them. Life, much like faith, moves in cycles—moments of activity and stillness, of celebration and reflection.

It's been a week filled with thanksgiving and fellowship. A heartfelt thank you goes to the St Peter's team for hosting a wonderful quiz night last Friday. Between the bowls of chilli and the challenging trivia questions (not all answered correctly, mind you!), laughter filled the hall and much-needed funds were raised for the church.

Huge gratitude also goes to Patsy and Mandy for leading St Mary's Thanksgiving Service on Sunday. It was a deeply moving and healing time together. Sharing tea and cakes afterwards inside the church was very precious and thanks to our tireless hospitality team for the tea, cakes and sandwiches, who brought warmth and connection, a reminder that community is one of God's sweetest gifts.

As I write, the King and Queen have just landed in Rome for a historic meeting with Pope Leo XIV. It's the first time a Supreme Governor of the Church of England has prayed alongside the head of the Roman Catholic Church since before the Reformation. Together they will take part in an ecumenical service in the Sistine Chapel—an extraordinary moment of unity.

Let's keep them in our prayers: that their time together will be filled with grace and love, and that their witness might inspire deeper understanding and reconciliation among all Christians.

While thinking about crowns and unity, another story caught my eye—the "Great Parisian Jewel Heist." In less than eight minutes, thieves escaped with some of France's most priceless treasures. For a moment, I wondered if the news had switched to a crime film!

It reminded me of Paul's words to Timothy: "Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness." The apostle didn't seek earthly riches or treasures that tarnish, fade or lost. His crown was one that could never be stolen—a reward of righteousness granted by a loving God.

The world often glorifies fleeting success and material wealth, but the true reward, the one that endures, is faithfulness.

This week also brought a reminder of how dependent we've become on another ruler in our world; technology. Monday's massive AWS outage left millions without access to apps and services. Some took to other platforms to complain, while others faced serious disruptions to their work and lives.

We trust technology to always be there—until it isn't. Paul didn't have servers or social media, but he knew a far greater source of connection and reliability. His trust was anchored in God, whose presence never fails and whose support never wavers.

It's also that time of year again—Strictly Come Dancing season! Even if you're not a fan, it's hard to avoid the sequins and the sparkle. I must confess, I enjoy watching—though perhaps not the early weeks where the two-left-footed contestants struggle valiantly across the floor.

What I really love is seeing those who learn from their mistakes. The dancers who listen to feedback, practice hard, and return stronger the next week—they're the ones I root for. The joy of improvement, the willingness to persevere despite setbacks—it's inspiring.

And in that, I see something of Paul's journey. His faith wasn't about perfection; it was about persistence. He faced struggles, made mistakes, and endured hardships, yet he never gave up. Like a dancer learning new steps, he kept moving forward, strengthened by God's grace.

The difference, of course, is that Paul wasn't competing for a glitter-ball trophy. His goal was far more glorious—a crown of righteousness, promised by God to all who keep the faith.

So let's take a page from Paul's book—and perhaps from the dance floor too—and *keep on trying*. Even when life's choreography seems complicated, we can trust that God's grace will guide our steps.

Let's close with a timeless prayer for the unity of the Church from Archbishop William Laud (1573–1645):

Most gracious Father,
we pray to you for your holy Church.
Fill it with all truth;
in all truth with all peace.
Where it is corrupt, purge it.
Where it is in error, direct it.
Where anything is amiss, reform it.
Where it is right, strengthen and defend it.
Where it is in want, provide for it.
Where it is divided, heal it and reunite it in your love;
for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.
Amen.

As we turn our clocks back and our hearts toward God, may we hold fast to faith, gratitude, and perseverance. Let's keep doing the little things that bring light and love into the lives of others—because those small acts, done in faith, make all the difference.

Have a joyful week, keep the faith, and never stop dancing in grace.

Youthwork at St Mary's




Exciting opportunity to get involved with our Youth Work at St Mary's


