Rector's Ramble

Isaiah 2.1-5; Psalm 122; Romans 13.11-14; Matthew 24.36-44

"Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them."

Matthew 18:20

Dear Friends,

As we stand at the threshold of the church year, may I begin by wishing each and every one of you a truly blessed Happy New Year. And with the start of the "silly season" (I love it, I does), a few notices for this weekend:

Please come along and support the fantastic **Christmas Craft Market at St Peter's Church** on **Saturday 11am – 3pm**, the team really do put on such a fantastic show and I'm sure you can find something for everyone for Christmas.

There is **no 8am service** on Sunday 30th November.

Instead, we encourage everyone from **both** churches to join us for a **10am Churches Together Holy Communion at St Peter's**, led by Rev'd Chris Lawrence. Why not bring a friend along?

On Sunday evening at **6pm at St Mary's**, I will be leading our **Advent Carol Service**, and we would be delighted to see a strong gathering from both congregations, and as many friends and family as you can muster.

On **Monday 1**st at 6pm the Christmas Lights on The Green will be switched on and we've been asked if St Mary's and the School would come along and lead the carol singing. Please join us if you are able.

Please also hold **Andy and Loz Jackson** in your prayers this weekend as they celebrate the marriage of Andy's daughter, Maddie, to Alan. Many from the village will be travelling to join them, and we pray that God's love may grow richly in Maddie and Alan's married life together.

This Sunday marks the start of the Church's liturgical calendar, leading us once again into Year A of the three-year lectionary. Throughout the months ahead, our Gospel readings will centre on the Gospel of Matthew, inviting us to listen afresh to the teachings, parables, and life of Jesus in a way that both grounds and inspires our discipleship.

Jesus once said, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Those simple yet profound words remind us that whenever the Church gathers—whether few or many—the presence of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit fills the space. That is why stepping into church can feel, for many, like stepping into an atmosphere alive with warmth, peace, or gentle awe. Often people comment, "There's something special here." And indeed, there is. What they sense is the very presence of God in His own home.

This presents us with a wonderful opportunity. Over the coming weeks, our churches—St Mary's and St Peter's—will host a series of beautiful, meaningful services. Advent is a season designed for reflection and renewal, but also for welcome and invitation. So, I'd like to offer a small challenge for the year ahead: invite someone new to come to church with you.

Last week at the St Peter's Lunch Club, I found myself chatting with a lovely group about the topic of going to the pub—an unexpectedly frequent theme of conversation! It emerged that several people didn't like going to the pub alone and would always invite a friend. So, I asked, "How is it that many people come to

church on their own, then?" There was a thoughtful silence. One lady finally said, "That's a really good point... why don't we?"

We are quick to invite people to the cinema, out for a walk, to a football match, a show, or a meal. Yet inviting someone to church—somewhere filled with welcome, beauty, and the presence of God—often slips our minds. This Advent, perhaps we can change that.

Advent is a season unlike any other—a meeting place of history, myth, prophecy, and hope. Its strength does not lie in deciphering the details of Christ's second coming, but in glimpsing God's promise of salvation and healing. We are not instructed to worry about the timing of God's arrival; rather, we are called to live faithfully in the meantime. God's reign has already broken into our world through Christ's incarnation, death, and resurrection. His Kingdom is near—already here, yet not fully realised. We await its fullness with watchfulness and readiness, knowing that God's love often arrives quietly, whenever grace is shared in places that desperately need it.

This Sunday's readings remind us that the extraordinary is always intertwined with the ordinary. God is at work in the vastness of the cosmos, guiding nations and shaping history. Yet He also moves in the small, unnoticed corners of our daily lives. We are part of God's grand story even as we wash dishes, speak kindly to a neighbour, or offer a prayer in the quiet moments of the day. The ordinary and the supernatural meet within us.

Our Advent hope is not merely an idea—it is a way of living. Scripture calls us to peace, to transform instruments of conflict into tools of healing, a message especially resonant today. We are called to reflect God's glory in the world, to live in a way that prepares not only for Christmas but for Christ's return in glory. Advent invites us to readiness—a readiness expressed not in fear, but in faithful living.

Preparation in this season takes many forms. We decorate our homes, choose gifts, and set aside time for celebration. But Advent also invites inner preparation: reflection, prayer, and openness to God's transforming work. It offers the chance for a fresh start. God's great intervention in history began not with spectacle but with a baby—fragile, small, and seemingly ordinary—born into a chaotic world. In this slow and humble way, God showed His deep commitment to humanity, to our routines and challenges, to our whole earthly journey.

Even now, God continues to come to us through His Spirit, through Scripture, through Communion together, and through the quiet moments when the ordinary becomes extraordinary. Advent is a precious season restores, redeems, and renews the past, present and future, so I encourage you to embrace it with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength.

As we watch and wait this Advent, may we also be aware that, just like the prophets, Mary, Joseph, the Shepherds and the Magi, perhaps there is something new God is inviting you to begin—something that will nurture your faith or allow His love to shine more brightly through you in the year ahead.

To guide us on our way I'll include a poem each week, which is guiding me, this week from Malcolm Guite;

O Sapientia

I cannot think unless I have been thought,

Nor can I speak unless I have been spoken.

I cannot teach except as I am taught,

Or break the bread except as I am broken.

O Mind behind the mind through which I seek,
O Light within the light by which I see,
O Word beneath the words with which I speak,
O founding, unfound Wisdom, finding me,
O sounding Song whose depth is sounding me,
O Memory of time, reminding me,
My Ground of Being, always grounding me,
My Maker's Bounding Line, defining me,
Come, hidden Wisdom, come with all you bring,

Come to me now, disguised as everything


