## Fr Martin's Murmurations

Like many of us at Chailey and Newick the idea of sabbaticals has been on my mind lately. I have prayed daily with and for our Rector. I've worried about him, rejoiced with him and missed him. I have realised the pressure he works under and can't wait to return to sharing the Blessed Verger's bacon sandwiches and the excellent coffee with him after the 8.00 am services on a Sunday morning. That time is a highlight of the week when we can have a few minutes of good clerical gossip [no not about you!] about things happening in the dear old Church of England. But thinking of Paul reminds me that I never really got around to having a sabbatical. I was once asked by my Bishop in Portsmouth to come up with an idea of what I might like to study if I went on a three-month break. I went back to him and said I would like to study the theology of leisure. I would start with the Chelsea Flower Show, go on to Royal Ascot and Wimbledon. I would want to research the subject at Test Matches. I would go to art exhibitions, Glyndebourne and Glastonbury and many other national social events. I think the Bishop thought I was 'Having a laugh!' But I really wasn't. Millions of people attend these events and the effects of them are enormous. Watching thousands joining together to sing Sailing with Rod Stewart at the Glastonbury Festival was a deeply moving experience which will have touched many souls. Listening to an aria sung beautifully in an opera house often moves people to tears. Watching the English Test team can take the soul to both the depths and the heights of emotions whilst hoping for a home-bred Wimbledon Champion defines what hope actually is! Watching and attending all these things is to witness people moving away from the pressure of work to have their hearts raised, their spirits lifted, and their aspirations both realised and often denied.

I would have used a sabbatical to ask the question as to why the most exciting event in history does not bring about the same effect as say a closely run battle on tennis court or football pitch.. I mean, of course, that moment in time when God chose to revolutionise the world by sending His only begotten Son to bear the price of our sins and gifted us a part in His new creation. The notion we could be deemed fit not by our own merits but by His infinite love to be called heirs to His kingdom is the most amazing experience known to humanity. I wanted to find out why Andy Murray could move people whereas Jesus Christ remains an irrelevance to many. Why I ask, would hundreds of thousands miss their own funerals if they could, in order to attend a football match played by their chosen team - yet would not dream of giving a moment's thought to worshipping their Redeemer.

In the light of the Gospel at the Parish Communion this Sunday morning those who do acknowledge the mighty works of Christ are bidden by Jesus to go out to proclaim the good news. They are invited to join with God in his mission to the world. Called to take the Good News and present it to others in our contemporary world. I wasn't able to make my study on a sabbatical but had I done so I am becoming aware that in our hands the Good News can easily turn to the bad. Often we smugly give the impression we are judging others when we are expressly told not to. We award many A levels in guilt and fail to be the sacred heart of God in our world today.

But, of course, there is hope and that hope lies in you. You who do get the point of life are His witnesses. You who faithfully worship God daily show his power. You present-day disciples who say your prayers and love your neighbours as yourselves are where hope lies.

You who treat everyone no matter who they are or what they are as a brother or sister should realise you are lights in the world and those who show the beauty of God in their goodness and holiness ensure God's mission is carried on in this generation. You are all the hope that one day others will get the point of living by acknowledging God as Father and Christ as Saviour. Let them know God and leisure are not incompatible because, even He needed a time of rest. Enjoy your leisure time and activities and see them for what they are. A gift from a Father simply because He loves us.


