# Fr Martin's Murmurations

There was a wonderful story once told of how the late Queen Mother was making a visit to a centre which employed young men and women who had learning difficulties. It is said Her Majesty asked one of the young men if he knew who she was. "No", he replied," but if you ask matron she will tell you."

We might at some point ask ourselves the same question. "Who am I?" Even Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Who do men say that I am?" There are many books, articles, in today's world connecting wellness with a heightened sense of who we are. For those who own the Christian Faith the answer to that question is there for all to see in our readings for Pentecost Sunday. We learn in Romans Chapter 8 the wonderful truth when it reveals to us,' all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption.

When we cry "Abba! Father!' it is that very Spirit bearing with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ - if, in fact we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him." As our Rector might say, "Wowza!!!!!" That puts me in my place. There am I telling myself that I am a miserable sinner, identifying with the centurion who claims 'Lord I am not worthy that you should come under my roof '. But it is not just me, there is a majority of Christians who in worship often forget who we are. We seem obsessed by our supposed unworthiness. Pentecost tells a different story. God adopts us, which means he chooses us. This is further emphasised in the Epistle of James Chapter 12 when we are told, 'Blessed are those who persevere under trial because, having stood the test, they will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him."

Our destiny, if we joyfully take up our cross and follow Him is eternal life. Our journey like Christ's is through Cross to Crown but unlike Jesus we will never as heirs have cause to cry out 'Eloi. Eloi Lama Sabacthani, which means 'My God. My God why have you forsaken me.' Our co-heir's sacrifice ensured we will never be abandoned. Pentecost is also our liberation day. We are no longer slaves. We are free. Yet we are still open to temptations and at times will fall into sin but when this happens we must not return to fear. There is to be no stifling the work of the Spirit by blocking off the outpouring of his grace with the spiritual plug called guilt. We are set to gather even more love from the Father by returning to him.


Remember the parable of the Forgiving Father in Luke 15. One of the heirs decides he wants his inheritance whilst his father is alive. The generous father complies with the son's demand. Off the boy goes and lives a life of debauchery. A famine sets in where he is living and as a Jewish boy he is faced with the shame of eating the food given to the pigs. The choice set before him is of either returning to the family or remain an outsider. He decides to go back to the Father and to offer to act as one of his servants as penance.

The Father, we can imagine, looked day by day to the horizon just in case he should see the beloved son returning is rewarded by this becoming a reality.

A recognisable shape appears a distance away. The father doesn't wait for his boy to arrive home and apologise, on the contrary he rushes to embrace him. When they meet the son recites his confession and requests that he be taken on as a servant. There is no paternal finger wagging. We just find the father putting the cloak around him and his ring on his son's finger. There is a party where they eat the fatted calf. For the son the famine is over. This is how God is to his daughters and sons. When we turn back to him there is much rejoicing in heaven for we have returned from the desert and famine of sin. Pentecost affirms this to us. It tells us to know our place. Not slaves but co heirs with Christ. Never abandoned, even when we sin. I can hear a voice from the road St. Columba trod crying out 'Wowza'. Have a blessed Pentecost. Be filled with the Holy Spirit. Show the world what true liberation means. Be willingly led into all truth.
