Rectors Ramblings

1 Samuel 8:4-11,16-20; Psalm 138; 2 Corinthians 4.13-5.1; Mark 3.20-35

Dear Friends,

I hope you've had a good week with the better weather, Pam and I spent all day on Tuesday trying to catch up with what we hadn't done in the Rectory Garden, but then couldn't move on Wednesday!

Thankfully the NYC car wash on Wednesday night meant there was a good amount of stretching and moving around, so it eased the aching muscles a little, and we washed around 18 cars and raised nearly £200 which our young people have asked if we could send this money to a school overseas so this is what we will do.

On Wednesday we also received the sad news that our regular churchyard visitor 'Harry the cat' had used up the last of his 9 lives on earth and had been hit by a car in lower Church Road.

Many of us will have our own stories of Harry and he was a particular good friend for me during lock down where I was solo recording the services from Church and Harry would often join me. Our love and our prayers go out to the Reeve family and Harry's brother Ron.



Thank you to all who came out on Thursday to remember the brave men and women who served in the Operation Overlord 6th June 1944 as part of the 80th Commemorations of that decisive campaign.

It is also important that we remember the Canadian Servicemen who were stationed in Newick and Chailey and our surrounding villages, and as part of our commemorations I think it would be appropriate if, alongside NEASSA we could plant a Canadian Maple in each of our Churchyards at St Mary's and St Peter's, (and perhaps in our schools as well) in memory of those young men who came so far to serve the commonwealth, were part of our communities for a season, and those who lost their lives in the intense fighting following D-day, especially the battle of the Falaise Pocket fought between 12 August - 21 August 1944.

This is another wonderful busy weekend, and the sun is shining, on Friday we celebrate Reverend Joy Grey's 100th Birthday, and please take time to read Patsy's piece and we thank God for Joy's calling and her pioneering ministry. Friday-Sunday is the South of England Show and please be holding the event organisers and participants and especially our wonderful Rural Chaplaincy Team who will be running the sanctuary again this year.

Amongst all the events happening I'm not sure whether you've heard that there's an election coming up?

I'm sure you have - it's rather difficult to escape the elections at the moment. Whether you're turning on the radio, reading the news, or opening up TikTok, the stories, promises, and scandals are everywhere. Recently we've been told AI is getting involved, producing fake stories, which makes it incredibly hard to understand what is going on and what to believe.

In our Old Testament this Sunday the leaders of Israel come to Samuel to ask for a king. Samuel does not think this a good idea but, after praying to God, he comes back to them with God's warning about what having a king would mean – conscripted armies, tithes, and taxes.

But the people insist! So, Samuel takes them all to Gilgal where they find Saul and make him their king.

The choices made by those in this weeks' reading impacted many generations that followed; and, as we will discover over the next few weeks, some of those consequences were big.

- What influences and contributes to choices that we make?
- Are we aware of what the consequences will or might be?
- Where is God in the decisions we make?

And if we feel anxious about such things, remember that there is no choice that can't be used by God to draw us closer to the kingdom.

Like Samuel some of us might be feeling rather sad as we watch certain choices being made over the coming weeks, and this includes many of our young people.

Most young people will not be able to vote, and this news will be filtering through as they watch other people making choices that will have consequences on their future.

- What can we do to guide our young people through this time?
- How do we put God in the centre of political situation?

I would recommend we look to Samuel for guidance on this. In the depths of his sadness and lack of understanding, Samuel turns to God in prayer and repeatedly does so throughout the entire process.

Let's challenge ourselves to do the same.


