

Rector's Ramblings

For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them."

Matthew 18:20

Dear Friends,

Welcome to the May edition of our Church & Community Magazine. I love the month of May. Two bank holidays is always a blessing and it's our wedding anniversary phew! But I especially love May because for the last eight years (except during the pandemic), St Mary's has taken a group of young people from Newick & Chailey to the Diocese of Chichester Youth Festival called 'May Camp.' This event is held each year at Plumpton Racecourse over the second Bank Holiday. In our first year we took six young people, this year we are taking 32 and one of those original six will be up on stage the whole weekend as a May Camp Leader. In fact this will be the third year that one of our young people has been on the main stage in a leadership role, which is a great reflection on our rural

weekend of worship, teaching, discipleship, sports, games, music and more!

This year we're exploring what it means to go on a journey of faith,



looking deeper into what it's like to love our neighbour, in the context of the Christian faith. We've got a line-up of inspiring talks, a range of interactive seminars, and space to experience and engage in worship and prayer in different and exciting ways.

Here are what two of our May Campers from 2023 have said:

May Camper 1: I go to May Camp because it gives me a chance to build core memories with my friends as I have over the last couple years I have been going; it's not just the big things either that build the memories; it's the times where we'd all come together in the evening when we didn't want to go to sleep so we'd sit around in the marguee with hot chocolates warming our hands, all of us talking about the randomness of things. It was great to be so silent yet so much was happening. It's the laying out in the campsite trying to catch the last warm

breeze of the evening before the sun set and being able to see the heat rising on the horizon when we were lucky enough to have a heatwave that weekend.

I love the community - how everyone makes you feel welcome and as though you've known them your whole life. I love how it feels when we all gather into the main marquee for morning worship, and evening worship when the songs start to play and even if you don't know all the lyrics it feels like you do (and you definitely do by the end of the weekend). The certain dances and things that go with just the one song that you pick up along the way are always such a memorable things. It's all very enlightening and freeing in a sense.

All the activities in the day fill up your weekend you barely even notice that it's happened. There are so many things to do, although I think my top three, I've done across the years has been archery, spray painting and the inflatable obstacle course that I could race for hours on with my friends. The football tournament has to be up there too, and especially the disco at the end of the weekend, that's the thing that I look forward to the whole time. It's so incredible how such a few days can create such huge

The first year I went with my friend we felt so at home and enjoyed it so much that the two of us have both continued coming every year (for the last 3). It's a weekend we look forward to all year round, we have brought friends along too, who I think would agree with us that it is such a life fulfilling experience. This is why I think May camp brings me so much joy.

May Camper 2:

I have been to May Camp twice and I am going again for the third time this year.

This camping trip is such a brilliant weekend away. I get to spend time with friends and meet new people. I especially love this trip as I have made so many good friends.

The activities they provide are great fun. We tried spray painting graffiti, axe throwing, an inflatable obstacle course, as well as the disco on the last night, which is always the best part as everyone has the best time and doesn't stop dancing.

Paul's cooking is amazing, there is always SO much cake and the tuck shop is full of sweets. It feels like one big family, everyone is so welcoming and friendly.

We couldn't take a group to May Camp if it wasn't for your support and generosity, and our amazing Youth Worker Lee Buck (He is the one in the middle) and our awesome team of volunteers.

As I wrote in the April magazine, at the end of 2023 we asked for your help in funding our Families and Youth Work at St Mary's and St Peter's, and I thanked you for the donations. I've been asked by some of you for a bit more information. Our Youth Appeal for 2023 came to over £15,000 from across the two church communities. This goes a long way to enabling us to carry on our Youth Work, which costs us between £32,000 - £40,000 each year. This is solely funded from our Church giving and a Church Mission Fund grant which finishes this year. We currently employ a part time Youth Worker, and we are recruiting for a Families worker this month, again a part time position as budget allows.

Through your continued support we can continue our work with Chailey & Newick young people through our youth clubs, school mentoring and families work, and we hope to be taking many more groups to May Camp in the years to come,



Many of you will be aware of issues with Royal Mail letter deliveries over the past few months. I have heard from many concerned residents about delays which have had a severe impact on people, including missed medical appointments and prescriptions.

I am keen to hear from residents if this is improving as I am picking up that in some parts of the constituency a good service is returning but in others it is still very hit and miss. I have met with local posties regularly and been to the Lewes sorting office to see first hand the pressures they are under. Before Christmas staff were not being replaced to cover sickness or leave and vans were being taken away from routine walk routes. I met with local managers to raise concerns from residents and to ask them to urgently look at the situation of staffing and resources.

When things did not improve after Christmas, as a group of Sussex MPs we met in Parliament with senior representatives from Royal Mail so we could discuss the continuing local issues with the service.

Since then Royal Mail have confirmed that they have ended their recruitment freeze and so more posties are now working in each area so residents should start seeing improvements. They have also started hiring more vans so that posties, particularly in rural parts, should again notice the difference.

Since this meeting a few weeks ago there do seem to have been improvements in the service with most areas in the constituency seeming to have returned to a normal service.

I would encourage anyone who is still experiencing issues with their post to please report it to me at maria.caulfield.mp@parliament.uk so that I can make sure Royal Mail are aware of the situation and can rectify it.





SNIPPETS OF NEWICK HISTORY BY ANTIQUARIUS

The 19th century fair on the green

In the 19th century, an annual fair was held on Newick village green, trading cattle, horses, sheep and other livestock. It also attracted pedlars (itinerant traders) and others looking to sell or buy. Other activities on the day included gamblers with their pea and thimble trick (1832), soldiers looking for new recruits (1836) and the Fletching brass band enlivening the proceedings in 1884. The event also included a visiting amusement fair with roundabouts, swings, shooting galleries and coconut alleys. Here are two incidents reported in the newspapers.

In April 1828 an intoxicated fellow named Twigg caused some disturbance by furiously riding up and down in a careless manner on a horse which he was seeking to sell. He collided violently with a cow, not only breaking the horn of the animal but also injuring himself. He was insensible for some time before he recovered himself.

The newspaper in May 1848 provides an amusing description of an incident occurring at the end of the day's event by the Bull Inn (then called the Bull and Butcher Inn). A policeman was assaulted by a drunken Mr Richardson who was 'a comical looking little fellow, with a very red nose bearing evident traces of modern blows and ancient brandy...attired in a smock frock, smeared in one or two places with blood'. Mr Richardson upon being asked by the policeman to leave the Inn 'resisted and struck the policeman on his cheek with his fist....the policeman being almost as big and strong enough to eat poor Richardson took him out and laid him on the ground..' Richardson returned, but this time, as delicately described in the newspaper, he had to be handled a bit more roughly, resulting in '...a melancholy termination to his festivities at Newick fair...'

In court, Richardson was fined 20 shillings but as the payment was not forthcoming he served 14 days in prison.

In time, over the latter part of the 19th century, the livestock fair on the green gradually ceased and it was just the amusement fair that continued.

80th Anniversary of D-Day and the Normandy LandingsOn 6th June this year the UK will commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Normandy Landings with a series of major commemorations and events across the UK and in France.

The Battle of Normandy (Operation Overlord), the Allied operation that began the liberation of France, and the rest of Western Europe, and laid the foundations of the Allied victory on the Western Front



began with D-Day. The term D-Day and H-Hour are used for the day and hour on which a combat attack or operation is to be initiated. Operation Overlord was launched on 6 June 1944 with the Normandy landings, best known as D-Day (although the code name was actually Operation Neptune). D-Day consisted of an amphibious assault involving more than 6,900 naval vessels in an assault on five Normandy beachheads: Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno, and Sword – the largest seaborne invasion in history. This was followed by an 11,500 aircraft airborne assault resulting in 160,000 troops crossing the English Channel on 6 June, building up to more than two million Allied troops operating in France by the end of August.

Newick Parish Council Update

Parish Council Update from Councillor Melanie Thew from meeting on Monday 8th April 2024

The key points discussed were as follows -

PLANNING

The Councillors reviewed 4 planning applications – it was agreed to 'object' to 1 (89 Allington Road, the reasons given as over development of site, drainage problems and parking issues); make 'no comment' on 2 (Streeters Farm & Ridge House); and to 'support' 1 (Tanglewood Farm - as the PC wishes to support expansion of local business, in line with our Neighbourhood Plan).

The Councillors discussed the consultation that is currently running regarding the Wealden District Council's Local Plan. (deadline for comments is 10th May 2024) This also includes proposals for the Ashdown Business Park extension at Maresfield. Whilst this area is not in the Parish of Newick, the increase of traffic on the main A272 could affect us. It was agreed to prepare a letter of objection.

FINANCE

One grant application had been received – from Newick Primary School to support a new project 'Hedgehogs R Us'. This is a national programme that has been designed to educate about Hedgehog Conservation and to help in the battle to prevent the extinction of this endangered species. The aim is to create hedgehog highways to enable them to more easily forage for food and meet other hedgehogs. The application for £150 was approved unanimously.

ENVIRONMENT & RECREATION

Cllr Thew gave an update on the progress of the Sports Pavilion project to the Council. George Pottinger, Project Manager, had attended the Annual Parish Meeting on 20th March and had presented the latest draft plans for the refurbishment of the building, which had been well received by the 50 Parishioners present. Representatives of the sports clubs who regularly use the pavilion are taking part in a meeting on 9th April to make further comments and participate in discussions to move this project forward.






