#### **Martin's Murmurations**

July for many is a month of change. Pupils in year six at our local primary school came to the end of their time in what was a familiar place which they had grown used to. Their school was a place of security where they spent much of their time among friends being taught by adults with a deep sense of vocation. They are about to go through an enormous amount of change. New buildings, systems, new new classmates, new subjects and new challenges. Their new term starts in September.

They need our prayers and our support. It is not an easy time for them. For teachers it has also been a difficult time. Young people they nurtured from Reception Class to year Six will soon be in the care of others. It is not possible to spend time along side other people albeit of such tender years without caring for them, being infuriated with them, laughing with them and watching them blossom and flourish because of the work they and their colleagues have done. It will have been hard work for them. Most teachers I have known worked more hours than they are given

credit for. The ludicrous taunts which claim they enjoy long holidays such as they are doing now in August does not bear examination if all the hours out of school they spend preparing for lessons are added up. Gearing up to enthuse young children to enjoy learning is no easy task. To have to face the draconian inspection from OFSTED is always a huge ordeal.

I remember when I was a chair of governors having to spend so much time trying to calm the nerves of our staff before such an inspection and then having to pick up the afterwards. This despite the fact school was deemed the excellent. I worked also with a school in an inner city which was deemed to be in 'need of improvement'. The pressure on the teachers was enormous but all of them found time to fill the school with love for the large number of disadvantaged children who attended the school

OFSTED did not acknowledge the level of care in that place nor the fact the teachers set up a food bank for their pupils to use. Without that food, children would have gone hungry. If I went into school early in the morning they were already there and were still hiving away well after the going home bell had rung.

It is heartening to know that whatever the backgrounds of children, there are a massive number of young men and women eager to train as teachers; and many thousands who have spent the whole of their working lives opening up so many possibilities, so many dreams and visions for our young people. They should all be hailed as community heroes.

At the leaving service for our local year six every child moving on was given a copy of the Holy Bible. Some may have preferred books telling adventure stories or tales of epic journeys. They may have wanted books which tell of great friendship or huge betrayals. Some may have preferred poetry or works of great human achievements. They might have wanted tales of sacrifice and bravery. In truth this is exactly what they have received. The library of books which is the Holy Bible contains all these things and more. Above all it is the story of how God loved the world and no matter how many times he was let down that love did not diminish and still does not diminish. The love of God, is demonstrated best through human love. Human love is wanting the very best for those we love. The teachers who have nurtured our young people for the first six years of their education have been part of God delivering his love. The rest of the community should not only be grateful for that but should also pray that during this holiday they may have a time of rest and recuperation in order to begin again with the next cohort to come under their care.

If you are going to be on holiday have a great and blessed time.



We are on holiday until September so no lecture this August. However our Programme Secretary Peggy has been working very hard on your behalf organising our next season.



As a result, the hospice is running a 50 for 50 campaign and is reaching out to our local community to help us raise £50,000.

#### **SNIPPETS OF NEWICK HISTORY BY ANTIQUARIUS**

This poem is based on a true report in the local newspapers of the time (Sussex Weekly Advertiser and Sussex Express).

#### **Newick - November 1865**

The banns were read in Newick church, the couple smiled and kissed.

Young shoemaker Spencer and Emily were heading for married bliss.

Spencer was a cheerful sort, industrious through and through. Emily was a servant girl, intending to be true.

They had their plans arranged with care, furniture to buy mid-week. Then on Saturday the wedding day with all their friends to meet.

But plans were foiled, sad to say, joy was not to be. A bird and a shotgun played their part in the tragedy.

In a garden came a black bird that Spencer sought to shoot. He fired the gun but the barrel burst and the stock was shattered wood.

The fatal blast made a gruesome sight as Spencer lay on the ground.

In a pool of blood and his disfigured head, by his father he was found.

At the coroner's inquest, held in the Bull Inn, the evidence was heard.

The black bird was mentioned. 'Accidental death' was the verdict's words.

In a grave near the church vestry door, Spencer's body was lain. On that chill November day in Newick, the whole village felt the pain.

## Newick Villagers Form Campaign Group to Stop Over-Development

Colourful signs are springing up in and around the village as residents rally to halt the proposed 250-house development at Goldbridge Farm, which they say will turn our historic rural village into an anonymous urban town.

Campaign group Save Newick Village was launched at the Newick Food Fair, with more than 150 people pledging their support for the fight against the development on 85 acres of productive farmland and historic countryside. They say it will increase the village population by a third and add 300 more cars to the chaos of the already over-congested A272. The village has welcomed and supported several recent and on-going developments, which are already adding 148 houses and around 450 extra people to Newick.


The group is urging residents to go to <a href="www.savenewickvillage.com">www.savenewickvillage.com</a> to add to the objections being sent to Lewes District Council to help halt the development.

Newick Parish Council has already submitted its objections to the proposal to Lewes District Council. Parish Council Chair Cllr Brian Hodge said: "The proposed development is totally unsustainable. There's up to a six-week waiting list at our GP surgery, local schools and colleges are turning pupils away and the proposed development will add even more pollution and sewage into the nearby River Ouse – the site is on the edge of a flood plain and adjacent to a sewage works, which regularly dumps into the river.

"Residents of a new development would be car-dependent, causing more congestion, delays and accidents on the A272 - and walking into the village along narrow or non-existent footpaths would be extremely hazardous. With starting prices of around £700,000 for houses at its other recently-built sites, claims of 40% affordable homes at Newick by developers Brookworth Homes are laughable."




