

Rector's Ramblings

"And his name is called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlas**ti**ng Father, Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9

Dear Friends,

Welcome to the December edition of the *St Mary's Newick Church & Community Magazine for 2025.* It has been an incredible year and I'd like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your love, support and prayers. Yes there have been tough times, but we have faced them together and the sense of love and community is breathtaking, using the gifts we have been given to help and support each other along the way. And now we begin our journey through Advent looking forward to the joy and hope of Christmas.

Christmas truly is the gift that keeps on giving, a season that shimmers with joy, warmth, and hope. At its heart lies a gift so perfect, so radiant, that no earthly wrapping could ever contain its wonder, its awe, or its joy. This holiest of seasons invites us to look again at the depth of God's generosity and the beauty of the light He brings into our world.

As our two parishes of St Mary's Newick and St Peter's Chailey join together once again in fellowship and celebration, we are reminded that the Christmas story is not only about God's great love for the world, but

also about the ways that love draws communities closer. Whether in our shared Christmas tree lightings, our Advent and Christmas services, our Carols by Candlelight, the Christmas Tree Festival, our Nativities, or the prayers we offer day by day, we see reflected, brightly and beautifully, the unity that Christ himself came to bring.

In St John's Gospel, we are reminded: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." In these familiar words God reveals himself as the generous giver, the one who pours out mercy, love, and grace in extraordinary measure. Nowhere is this generosity more radiant than in the gift of his Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

At Christmas we rejoice in the child born in Bethlehem, God's perfect gift to a weary world. As we sing in one of our beloved carols, He is the one who brings "light and life to all." He is the one "born to give us a second birth."

Unlike so many gifts exchanged at Christmas, some forgotten, some unneeded, and some that fade with time, the gift God offers cannot be misplaced, outgrown, or replaced. It is the gift that continues giving, the gift we cannot live without the gift of hope, salvation, and eternal joy.

And yet we know that for many, Christmas is not always an easy season. In our churches and villages there will be those who feel the strain of rising costs, those struggling with illness, those caring faithfully for loved ones, and those carrying quiet burdens of grief or anxiety. Some will feel uncertain about the future, their work, their families, or simply about themselves. Christmas can magnify both joy and sorrow.

But into every circumstance, joyful or heavy, Christ comes. The message of Christmas is that God steps into the world not when it is tidy and settled, but precisely when it most needs light. "When the time had fully come," writes the apostle Paul, "God sent his Son." The world needed him then; we need him now. And the promise remains that when we place our trust in him, he walks with us, through celebration and sorrow, through laughter and longing, always as Emmanuel, "God with us."

This gift of Christ is not only eternal, but transformative. When we receive him with open hearts, something wondrous begins to take place within us. His love reshapes our priorities, softens our hard hearts, and inspires us to give in ways that echo his grace. These gifts cannot be measured in pounds or wrapped in ribbons. They are gifts of the heart: mending a friendship strained by misunderstanding; offering forgiveness where hurt has lingered; speaking gently instead of harshly; visiting someone who is lonely; giving quietly and anonymously; or offering an apology freely and sincerely.

As our two communities gather this Christmas, in worship, in song, in fellowship, hospitality, and love, we embody the very message we celebrate: a hope for our world and a light shining in the darkness.

Christ's light does not belong to one community alone, but shines across our villages, across households, and across every heart that welcomes him. We are called to share that light, whether, like Kiera and Joe, that's by offering "Nan's turkey pie," meeting with friends and family, or supporting a local charity. This Christmas, let your light shine brightly.

Together at St Mary's and St Peter's, all are welcome. We stand side by side as a joyful witness to the unity Christ brings and to the love this season calls us to share.

So, this Christmas, let us open once more the greatest gift of all. Let us cherish it, hold it close, and allow it to fill every corner of our lives. And let us not forget that Advent is our season of getting ready – ready to understand the true meaning of Christmas, ready to welcome Jesus into our hearts, and ready for the day when he will come again.

May the Babe of Bethlehem be yours to tend, May the boy of Nazareth be your friend, May the man of Galilee his healing send, May the Crucified Jesus his courage lend, May the risen Lord Jesus be with you to the end.

Wishing you all a blessed, peace-filled Advent and a joyful Christmas.



Otters - Had a chat from Graham from the St Francis Hedgehog Rescue charity, and met a real hedgehog! They then had a workshop with Alan from Cats Protection League, a national charity with a centre very nearby, where cats are re-homed.

Year 1 - Were also lucky enough to meet the cheeky hedgehog (who did a poo!) from St Francis Animal Rescue, and then worked with Carrie, Daniel and Karen from Sussex Green Living learning about composting and being more eco-friendly.



Year 2 - Spent the morning baking a plethora of treats ready to host an Afternoon Tea! The tea was for our volunteers, governors, donors and trustees of local grants who have helped enable us to run such amazing enrichment opportunities here at Newick. The Puffins even baked their own bread!

They also went up the bell tower with two of the bell ringers and then got to ring the church bells!

from Trevor from WRAS, the East Sussex Ambulance Service for

wildlife.



Year 6 - Half went to Uckfield CC for a morning of STEM activities with the staff and to find out about Secondary School life. The other half worked with Newick Parish Council on a Newick Tidy Up, looking after our lovely village.

Finally he never neglected his batting, one summer hitting over 1000 runs. A record still waiting to be surpassed.

SNIPPETS OF NEWICK HISTORY BY ANTIQUARIUS

Newick Cottage Hospital

Yes, Newick once had its own hospital opened in 1869, located near the eastern end of Allington Road. The hospital was for the poor when suffering from disease or from accident and was run under the direction of trustees, supported by voluntary donations, legacies and subscriptions. Various functions were held in the village, such as bazaars and concerts, raising funds for the hospital.


At the start, the appointed medical officer for the hospital was Doctor Richard Gravely, who lived at the house 'Greenfield' nearby. The staff comprised a nurse with an assistant. The accommodation comprised beds for nine patients, in two well-ventilated wards and a separate room for bad cases.

Injured and suffering navvies were treated there when the railway was being built through Newick and Chailey in 1879-1882. Other injuries treated over the years included a badly cut foot from a mowing machine accident, injury from being kicked by a horse, an accident on a traction engine and a crushed hand from using a turnip-cutting machine, requiring amputation of a mutilated finger. Apart from treating medical problems the matron Mrs Anne Doust had even taught some patients to read and write.

The 1904 annual report still exists and shows that 28 patients were admitted in that year; five from Newick, ten from Chailey and others from nearby villages together with three from Brighton and one from London. Gifts were given in that year of dressing gowns, books, magazines, papers, a bath chair, household brushes, old linen, blankets, carpets, food including rabbits together with the usual fruit and vegetables from the village Harvest Festival event.

The hospital closed in 1916 as reported in the local newspaper. Furniture and effects were sold and the balance of the funds remaining was distributed to the Sussex County Hospital, St Dunstan's Hostel for the Blind and the Star and Garter hospital.

The hospital building was easily adapted to a house, now known as 'Hurstfields'. It is particularly encouraging that the building has retained its character into the 21st century.




