



Rector's Ramblings

I am the Lord your God".

Leviticus 19:34

Dear Friends,

Happy New Year and welcome to the January & February 2026 edition of the St Mary's Newick Church & Community Magazine.

As the calendar turns, many of us embark on the familiar ritual of setting New Year's resolutions. Whether it's promising to exercise more, save better, or deepen relationships, these intentions arrive from a heartfelt urge to reconnect with what truly matters. Yet, by February, many resolutions quietly fade away, lost under the weight of life's relentless pace. Perhaps what we actually need isn't a longer list of goals but a renewed sense of focus.

This is where the Christian season of Epiphany can offer a guiding light. Epiphany, meaning "manifestation" or "appearance," celebrates the moment Christ reveals himself to the Gentiles, symbolised by the three kings – or Magi – following a star to find the infant Jesus, and it proclaims a bold truth: Jesus came to save the whole world, not just one nation or people.

Epiphany invites us to welcome the light of Christ into our hearts just as the Magi followed the star to find the Saviour. Epiphany challenges us to seek God's guidance in all things, letting divine wisdom shape what truly matters in our lives and communities.

Consider the Magi: learned and wealthy, yet they didn't rely solely on their own understanding. They sought and trusted God's direction throughout their journey. Their story poses important questions for us: How might we align our daily actions and our resolutions with a deeper, more intentional purpose?

Adopting this perspective transforms New Year's resolutions from mere checklists into paths of intentional living. It might mean making space in our day for quiet reflection, committing to serve others in our community, or managing our resources more responsibly.

Whatever the goal, Epiphany highlights the importance of lives shaped by God's character – humble, persistent, and faithful.

The Magi's journey was neither quick nor easy. They faced barriers but pressed on, trusting in God's provision. Likewise, when we choose to embrace change – whether personal or communal – it rarely happens overnight. Setbacks are inevitable, but the Epiphany story reminds us that perseverance intertwined with faith is key. Even when progress feels slow or uncertain, we can trust that God is working in and through us.

There is a less often told but profoundly important story of Epiphany that speaks directly to our current social and political realities. As we looked back on 2025, we saw a worrying upswing in far-right politics, often accompanied by a co-option of Christian symbols and language. This agenda frequently casts asylum seekers and those of other faiths as threats, sometimes even quietly undermining the sense of welcome within our churches and communities.

Yet, right at the heart of both the Christmas and Epiphany narratives lies the story of a refugee family – Jesus, Mary, and Joseph fleeing to Egypt to escape King Herod's deadly slaughter of the innocents. This isn't just a sentimental backdrop but a stark tale of political violence, terror, and forced displacement.

Egypt was a logical and safe place to find refuge. Egypt and Judea were linked by a coastal road known as the *Via Maris* (Way of the Sea). Egypt was outside the dominions of King Herod but was part of the Roman Empire and had large Jewish communities. The Jewish settlements of Egypt dated back to the time of Jeremiah (see Jeremiah 41.17 and 44.1). They had their own synagogues and had adopted Greek as their everyday language. The first translation of the Scriptures, which we call the *Septuagint*, was made in the third century BC at Alexandria in Egypt, originally for these Greek-speaking Jews.

Though the Bible doesn't use the modern term "refugee," its demand to welcome and love outsiders is crystal clear: "*The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt*" (*Leviticus 19:34*). Remarkably, Jesus' very early life embodies this command before he ever spoke a word.

We know little of their years in exile, but the theme of hospitality to strangers' echoes throughout the Gospels. Jesus later instructs, "*I was a stranger, and you took me in*" (*Matthew 25:35*). And the Letter to the Hebrews counsels, "*Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers*" (*Hebrews 13:2*). These powerful reminders call us to resist politics driven by fear and exclusion, and instead to live out Christ's vision for a world rooted in joy, hope, peace, and love.

Epiphany invites us to look beyond ourselves. The light of Christ is not something to keep hidden – it's meant to illuminate and guide our actions and our words in the world around us.

As you consider your 2026 resolutions, I encourage you to include an inclusive sharing of that light with others. Step into the new year with hope and purpose, ready for the encounters that will turn strangers into friends and transform communities into places of welcome and belonging.

Thank you for being part of our church family and community.

May this season bring you fresh insight, resilience, and joy as we journey together in faith.



At the time of writing this we are in the midst of the Christmas fun here at Newick CE Primary School. Our wonderful Early Years, Y1 and Y2 class have wowed us all with their Nativity – 'It's A Cracker!' In true Newick style they have performed with pizazz, singing up beautifully and conveying the true meaning of Christmas through their wonderful speaking. Well done to all of the children and staff involved in this magical production.

Not to be outdone our Key Stage Pupils are set to perform their evening Cantata, a collection of music sung beautifully at St Mary's Church on Monday 15th December. We hope to see many of the community there. Meanwhile the choir are busy, performing at the Barn Lunch Club, the big Glyndebourne Christmas concert and entering the DCAT Christmas Voice competition. The music around the school really comes to life at this time of year and evokes powerful emotions. There is nothing more joyful than the sound of their voices coming together.

Otters class have been learning about polar regions and even got to experience some polar action in real life when it started snowing on a visit to the woods one Wednesday! Luckily they come prepared for all weathers and are a really resilient bunch.

Year 1s have been busy in the Graden School this term. Now that we have the polytunnel we can garden all year long, which is a real game changer. They have sown sweet peas, broad beans, prepared the beds for winter and planted some bulbs ready for spring. That feels a way off in the dark and dismal weather we are currently having.

SNIPPETS OF NEWICK HISTORY BY ANTIQUARIUS

50 years ago

Here are some past businesses in Newick, based upon advertisements in the 1976 Parish Magazine...

Woods Fruit Farm at Goldbridge Road sold 'fruit, vegetables, eggs, cream, chicken, honey, etc' with the proud boast that 'our home produced fruit and vegetables are grown with natural manure, not artificial'. What can you buy there now? Just expensive new houses. Also in Goldbridge Road were 'Newick Aviaries' at 'The Gables', selling budgerigars of 'various colours'.

On the corner of Allington Road and Church Road was the popular, long-established Bannister's Stores, run by Guy and Judy Cornish, selling groceries, drapery, clothes, toys, hardware, gardening materials and a host of other domestic requirements, as well as being an off-licence.

The main shop on The Green was 'The Stores' with S and V Sampson as proprietors, selling groceries, confectionery, cigarettes, stationery and general provisions. The butcher on The Green was S G Barrett selling 'finest quality home-killed meat' including turkeys, chicken geese and ducks.

In August 1976 Vi and Geoff Dorking announced the opening of their shop V G D Newsagents in Newick Drive for newspapers, magazines, ice-cream, confectionery, cigarettes and stationery. The little 'Handy Shop' in the High Street was a 'newsagent tobacconist, confectionery etc', run by G S Wheatland. At 26, High Street was Newick Antiques run by Irene Fenton.

In Western Road the well-established Hardwick's Nurseries was run by proprietor Clive Baulu, specialising in heathers. Wreaths and bouquets were sold by G J Stanbridge at 'The Pines' in Allington Road (a 'member of British Teleflower Service').

Woodgate Farms Dairy Ltd delivered milk and eggs in Newick from their base near Sheffield Park station.

D W Wilkins and Sons was the long-established builders, decorators and plumbers from Woodbine Lane.

There were several hairdressers, including Doris King hair stylist in Church Road, 'Newick Hair Fashions' at Newick Drive run by Carol Gliddon, together with Margaret Paling a visiting professional hairdresser, manicurist and pedicurist from Cornwells Bank.

Parish Council Update – December Meeting Highlights

The Parish Council met on 8th December at the Community Centre, and here's what was covered:

-  **Budget & Precept** – Councillors unanimously agreed the budget for 2026/27, setting the precept to ensure NPC can continue providing local services and projects across the village.
-  **Lewes Local Plan Consultation** – With many residents keen to have their voices heard, NPC will be hosting a *drop-in morning* on the 7th February in Newick Community Centre. Timings and final details to follow. Information sheets and comment forms will be available, and councillors will be on hand to guide you through how to share your views with Lewes District Council.
-  **Sports Pavilion Progress** – Work on the new pavilion is moving forward well. Plans are underway for the final finishes and an official opening.
-  **Community Support** – A grant of £202 (inc VAT) was awarded to Newick Rootz to finalise the fixtures of their storage space. Newick Rootz are a fantastic volunteer group who help maintain our village footpaths and spaces with their regular workdays.
-  **January Newsletter** – The next edition is being prepared and will include details of the Local Plan consultation, pavilion updates, and more. Look out for it mid-late January.
-  **Local Government Reorganisation** – Councillors discussed the ongoing consultation and Councillors could not see how the devolution process could go ahead in advance of the mayoral elections being decided. NPC confirmed support for the East Sussex County Council business case, while opposing Brighton & Hove City Council's devolution bid.


