

Rector's Ramblings


For I am about to do something new.

Dear Friends,

It's good to be home, and welcome to the September edition of St Mary's Newick's Church and Community Magazine. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Fr Martin Morgan for his Murmurations whilst I've been on Sabbatical, and for the teams at St Mary's Newick and St Peter's Chailey for all they have done whilst I've been away.

As I return to the parishes we are entering into the month of September, one of my favourite times of the year. September is the season of transition from Summer to Autumn, from preschool to primary, to secondary and sixth form and from school to university or travelling or employment. It is a season of shortening days, of harvests being gathered in and gardens and orchards full of beautiful abundance, though I must confess my apples and pears are plentiful but definitely on the smaller side with the dry summer and lack of rain. I hope you are able to attend one of our fabulous Horticultural Society Shows on Newick Village Green 6th September and in Chailey Village Hall 13th September, where we will be celebrating the very best of all God's glorious abundance. And don't forget that Chailey Tractor Club and the Five Bells are celebrating the season with a Harvest Festival & Barn Dance on the 13th September too.

It has been suggested that I might share a few words about my own time of transition from parish to sabbatical and back again, especially reflecting on my journey from Iona to Lindisfarne.

It is still hard to find the words to express my thoughts, feelings and happenings of the journey. From within, from my head to my heart, there is a sense of peace, of joy and a bubbling up of hope and excitement of what is to come.

There were some very big highs and some pretty low, lows. The soul and the mind do amazing things when they are given an opportunity to 're-boot', and not all of them are comfortable.

Rector's Ramblings - continued

For most of my journey I was alone to my thoughts and my prayers. The route I used is not a well-known one, so I met very few fellow pilgrims travelling the same way as me. This was the case until I reached the final 100km of St Cuthbert's Way from Melrose to Holy Island, when I occasionally walked a short way together with other pilgrims. I'm not really sure what I'd expected, but I'd chosen this route because I didn't want the crowds of the Camino, however I must confess it was very isolating at times.

Quite quickly I realised that when we walk at God's speed, which I've worked out is about three miles per hour in the right conditions, we re-tune to God's frequency. So much of our lives these days is at a frenetic pace; when we are pushed for time, we jump in the car to go here or there, we catch a train to work, we fly away on 'holiday'. But when we walk, as Jesus did, we enter a sustainable pace, a place where there is just the way before us (sometimes rough, sometimes smooth), the weather above us (sometimes harsh, sometimes comfortable) and God's creation all around us (always awesome).

Sometimes there are people walking the same way, sometimes in a different direction. Most of the time there is just ourselves and our Creator, and we are walking at His pace.

On reflection I found an overwhelming sense of joy in the journey. This came from the sense of knowing that others had walked this way before me; in the unexpected encounter of the stranger on the way (whether I wanted their company/ conversation or not), in the stripping away all that was unnecessary from my rucksack, myself and my faith (I sent over three kilos of stuff home after the first five days!). Finding enough water and food gave the words of The Lord's Prayer a whole new meaning...'give us this day our daily bread'.

In the simplicity of the journey, the sound of my own breathing, heartbeat, footsteps in rhythm with the tap-tap of my hiking poles, in the vulnerability of the challenges, both physical, spiritual, and psychological, and yes, there were times when I wanted to quit.

Working out how to pray in these moments was particularly powerful, as was the unexpected hospitality of strangers, and the resting that comes at the end of a long day's walking, hopefully with a pint if I was lucky.

The biggest take home, I realised in the final sixty miles, was that my journey wouldn't finish at Holy Island. In fact, reaching Holy Island and reconnecting with God in a new and more vulnerable, personal way was just the start. God has a vision and a mission for His churches, in all their differing traditions, churchmanships and diversity, this is especially important in our rural parishes where community is at the heart of who we are and what we do.

We need to be open to hearing God's instructions and to do this we each need to spend a little more time journeying with God at God's pace. Now that I am home, I am hoping for some time to keep walking with God, to reflect and process what I have learnt along the way and looking forward to sharing with you all in the future.

Thank you all for your love, your support and most of all your prayers, I'll leave you with a Celtic autumn prayer I read on the journey:

We bless you, God of Seed and Harvest, and we bless each other in this season of mellow fruitfulness. May the beauty of this world and the love that created it be expressed through our lives and be a blessing to others, now and always.

Until we meet again, may God keep us in the hollow of His hand.

Have a great month, be joyful, keep the faith and keep doing the little things that make a difference to those you love and those in need.

Finally, I'd like to thank Alex & Jackie for all their work in putting together the St Mary's Newick Parish News.

Our new season begins with 'Shopping on the Rialto in Renaissance Venice.' This lecture had to be postponed from November last year, so we are delighted that it is now going to take place. The first few bridges were built of wood but after one collapsing under the weight of the crowds, who had rushed to watch a wedding, with considerable loss of life, it was decided in 1588 to build in stone.

Shops line either side and then, as now, sold jewellery, glass and clothing. Situated in the heart of Venice, merchants bustled to and fro and wealthy Venetians could choose to purchase luxury items from all over the known world.

Dr Antonia Gatward-Cevizli is a specialist in the Italian Renaissance. She has lived in Venice and has lectured at Sotheby's, the National Gallery and the V & A. She has also worked as a Guide for both the Tate and Tate Modern.

Our lectures are always on the second Wednesday of the month. Guests are always welcome, £8 on the door, but of course it would be splendid if you could join our society. It costs £60 for the year and for that not only do you get 10 lectures but you can also enjoy several other advantages like our Christmas Lunch at the ever-popular Picture House Restaurant in Uckfield or the chance to go on one of our specially organised visits.

SNIPPETS OF NEWICK HISTORY BY ANTIQUARIUS

Poaching in days past

In the 19th century, labourers seeking food to feed their families considered that free-roaming wild birds, rabbits and hares should be the property of those that could kill or capture them. They felt that they had committed no moral crime in shooting that wildlife. There were difficulties in grasping the idea that wildlife, when on a farmers land, somehow was then not so wild but was protected, to be shot just by the farmer alone or his guests. The Game Act 1831 introduced controls to protect game birds.

In 1832 three poachers, one with a sword, were discovered in the woods by 'Beechlands' at Newick. The gamekeeper received dreadful wounds and his assistant was shot in the back!

In 1847 three labourers were night-poaching with guns on the lands of James Henry Slater. The gamekeeper had assembled 13 men to tackle them. In Broomlye Wood there was a desperate encounter, with the gamekeeper and two of his assistants receiving dreadful blows to the head from the guns. The doctor who in due course attended to the three injured men said that all three were in danger of losing their lives during the first week of their injuries. The three poachers were charged and appeared in the assizes court. Reference was made to rewards being offered by J H Slater when his gamekeepers and helpers apprehended poachers and that this could motivate them towards identifying individuals when in fact the identification was not perfectly clear. The jury was not convinced that the poachers, in the darkness, could definitely be identified as the accused persons and accordingly found them not guilty. In May 1861 a labourer from Newick was found to have stolen eight pheasant's eggs taken from a nest on land at Reedens. At court the labourer was fined five shillings for each egg plus considerable costs. A case of poached eggs!

Into the 20th century poaching still continued. The Canadian soldiers here in Newick during the 2nd World War were taught how to poach pheasants by the local lads.




