





Rector's Ramblings

 Romans 13:1

Dear Friends,

Welcome to our July edition of St Mary's Newick's Church & Community Magazine.

As we move towards the big day this month, the Bishops of the Church of England have issued a call to put prayer and participation at the heart of the General Election as the UK goes to the polls.

Back at the end of May, and speaking after the Prime Minister Rishi Sunak announced he was seeking a dissolution of Parliament ahead of an election on 4 July, Archbishops Justin Welby and Stephen Cottrell urged people to set aside time amid the heat of the campaign to reflect and pray for our nation and our world. They also issued a plea for everyone to put good grace and a commitment to truth and integrity at the heart of the campaign.



Well, Election Day will soon be upon us, and I will leave it up to each of you to discern whether 'grace, truth & integrity' have been at the centre of the discussions over the past weeks? One truth I do know, is that the freedom to vote is a precious commodity in today's world, and we have a duty to honour that freedom of which so many are being denied.

Archbishops Justin and Stephen said: "The coming General Election is a critical moment in the life of our nation, which will shape our future by electing those who will make decisions affecting generations to come. It is a time for us all – people of all faiths and of none - to ask important questions about what kind of country we want to be. We are facing epic challenges both in our country and our world: from questions of war and peace to poverty and injustice and very future of the Earth God has given us."

Rector's Ramblings - continued

For those of us with a faith, when faced with such huge questions, our instinct is to turn to God in prayer. We trust that prayer is at the very heart of this Election, and that no matter how big the issues at stake are, this time should be marked by respect for one another, for good grace and a commitment to truth and integrity, above all else.

As the Archbishop's said "It is our prayer that, even in the heat of the debate, we will treat each other with respect and kindness".

In every election, there will be winners and losers, with the winners usually having the loudest voice. However, the most difficult aspect of good government will come in the months ahead, when putting the policies into practice with honesty and integrity may prove more of a challenge than a slick six-week election campaign.

Our writings from Paul's letter to the Romans reminds us that a 'perfect' government exists only in the imagination, and our absolute obedience to any elected government is neither a wise nor safe use of our freedom to vote. But we can give thanks for the dedication of all who stand for public office in service of our communities – often at great personal cost - and those who support the process. We must remember they are but mere mortals, just like you and me, fallible human beings who will make good and bad decisions throughout their lives and have families and loved ones who see the sacrifice of public service far more than we will.

So, may our thoughts and our prayers be centred with compassion for all those in government and in opposition, holding the words of the Lord's prayers 'Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven".

May God's will be done in our nation and in God's World.

Have a great month, be joyful, keep the faith and keep doing the little things that make a difference to those you love and those in need.

The Chailey Windmill is open from 3pm-5pm on the last Sunday of every month from April until September. We look forward to welcoming you to our wonderful mill and our rural life museum. It's free to enter, though donations are always welcome. Any donations are used to help us maintain our windmill.

This past month the windmill has been a hive of activity! For those who pass by regularly, you are likely to have noticed that the fantail, damaged last year has now been repaired and is back in situ. The fantail is the smaller sail arrangement attached to the back of the cap. As the wind changes direction the fantail will rotate. This rotates the cap until the sails are once again facing the wind. The Chailey Windmill fantail was damaged by high winds last Winter. We are delighted that Paul Kemp, a Millwright, has been able to repair the damage. The fantail was lifted into place on Thursday 6th June; this was no easy task involving specialised equipment such as a crane and an aerial lifting platform. It took time to get the fantail in place but as you will now see when you visit, it is back where it belongs in all its glory!

In other news, we've been lucky enough to have welcomed over 50 of our local Chailey & Newick Rainbows and Brownies to the windmill, with both groups visiting the windmill to listen to a talk on the history of the mill and having a chance to explore the mill and look at the local artefacts. The visits were made extra special as some of the girls took their 'Promises' at the Mill at the end of their visit.

Year 2 recently completed their Great Fire of London unit of work which culminated in the building of and then setting fire to Tudor houses. Mr Barnes was on hand to supervise our Great Fire re-enactment.

Year 3 have been learning all about Volcanos as part of their Geography unit of work, they read the book Escape From Pompeii, and in D.T. created lever-based exploding volcanoes! They have also used fantastic sewing skills to perfect some teddy togas, as further demonstration of their Roman learning.

SNIPPETS OF NEWICK HISTORY BY ANTIQUARIUS

The 'turnpike' road through Newick

The current main road through Newick village was a toll road or 'turnpike' between 1771 and 1866, part of the nineteen milelong east to west route from 'Hodges' near Hadlow Down, through Buxted, Maresfield, Newick and Scaynes Hill to Cuckfield. The appointed trustees were responsible for repairing and widening the road and for creating the necessary toll gates. Prior to this, the route had been recognised as being '*in a ruinous condition and in several places narrow and dangerous, so as to be impassable for carriages in winter and very incommodious for travellers at all seasons*'.

The old tollgate cottage where the fees were collected still remains just by the village green, although it has been extended since those days.

An 1847 book 'Pictures of Country Life' by Thomas Miller includes a chapter on 'Country Toll-Gates' providing a charming description of the character of turnpike routes '...the huge broad-wheeled wagon with its six horses and merry faces peeping out from the arch of the tilt...rumbling slowly along.. .then come the gypsies with their children swinging and singing in the panniers, the youngest stowed away at its mother's back and squalling lustily in the hood of her cloak...tents are ready to be erected at a moment's notice...the camp kettle plays a merry tune on the saucepan that swings beside it under the cart and they go on jingling together from village to village.. .They cheat the toll-keeper and laugh in his face...away they go, laughing and chanting ...what a current of human life rushes through that toll-gate...ever along the road are little bits of moving pastoral life – a shepherd lad driving his sheep to the next market to sell; a rosy-cheeked milk-maid fetching up her cows which every now and then pause to low through some gate, or bite off a tender shoot from the hedges; the farmer man, sitting sideways on one of his horses, returning from his field-work, the whip resting upon his shoulder and the measured music of the rattling harness joined with his own voice, as he trolls forth some rustic ditty...'

We will miss his charismatic, yet sociable character and his free spirit. Modesty was a word he did not recognize, and he exhibited a regal air; but like a true monarch, he was friendly and forthcoming, particularly if there was food close at hand.

Newick has lost an icon, and I have lost a friend who enriched my life. I am so very grateful that our paths crossed.

Update from Councillor Sippetts:

The June Parish Council meeting covered the following:

Playground – following meetings and site inspections, specialist contractors are being appointed to repair and replace the worn & damaged areas of soft-play surface. This will take 2/3 days of closure and we will advise of dates (avoiding school holidays!) in due course.

Parking – poor and inconsiderate parking prevails in the village despite our actions to date. The extent of dangerous parking is a safety issue. We are advising Sussex Police of this, to apply their safety responsibilities and enforce the Highway Code.

Grant application – from our local Girl Guiding group Lewes Windmill Rangers to support attendance at the August international adventure event was approved. Happy travels!

Lewes Planning – in the last month we learned that the Secretary of State has placed the district Council in so called 'special measures' (Section 62A of the Town and Country Planning Act). Key powers in determining 'major' planning applications have been removed and adopted by central Government. What this means in practice is not straightforward to determine as the legislation is new and as far as we can see, there are few precedents.

Skate park – a number of small cracks have appeared on the surface of the ramps and the blue areas have discoloured with weathering. The company that built the skate park have agreed to inspect the site, treat the cracks, repair the render and to see what can be done about the colour fading.

In May, the Chair of Newick Parish Council, Councillor Armitage stepped down as Chair after five years of service. Councillor Brian Hodge (who was previously Vice Chair and has in the past been Chair for Planning) was elected Chair for the full Council. The Parish Councillors thanked Councillor Chris Armitage his service as Chair, Councillor Armitage was elected as Vice Chair.


