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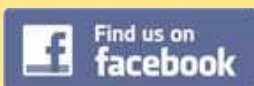

Dear Friends,

Welcome to the July & August 2026 edition of the St Mary's Newick Church & Community Magazine. As I write this, the hedgerows are full, gardens are bursting with colour, and the long evenings invite us outdoors to enjoy the beauty of God's creation.

July and August have a different rhythm from the rest of the year. Schools break up for the summer holidays, families head away on holiday, village events fill the calendar, and many of us take the opportunity to slow down, rest, and spend time with those we love.

Rest is something that our modern world often undervalues. We live in an age of constant activity, where emails arrive around the clock, news is available every minute of the day, and many people feel under pressure to be continually productive. Yet from the very beginning of creation, God built rest into the pattern of life. In the book of Genesis, after six days of creation, God rested on the seventh day. Later, the commandment to keep the Sabbath reminds God's people that rest is not a luxury but a gift.

Jesus himself understood the importance of stepping away from the demands of daily life. Throughout

the Gospels we read of him withdrawing to quiet places to pray, reflect, and spend time with his Heavenly Father. On one occasion, after the disciples had returned from a busy period of ministry, Jesus said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while" (Mark 6:31).

Summer offers many of us an opportunity to do just that. Whether we are travelling far afield, enjoying a day at the seaside, tending the garden, walking the South Downs, or simply sitting with a cup of tea in the sunshine, these moments of rest can refresh both body and soul. They remind us that life is about more than busyness and achievement. They remind us that we are human beings, not human doings.

Yet rest does not mean disengaging from God. In fact, some of our deepest encounters with God happen when we finally stop rushing. The beauty of a Sussex sunset, the laughter of grandchildren playing in the garden, the sound of birdsong on an early morning walk, (We have a wonderful Song Thrush with us at the moment) or the quiet of the prayer-soaked walls of our ancient church buildings, can all become moments when we become aware of God's presence.

The summer months also bring change. For some young people, exam results will determine the next stage of their education or career. Others may be moving home, changing jobs, beginning retirement, or facing new challenges and opportunities.

Times of transition can be exciting, but they can also bring uncertainty.

It is reassuring to remember that God walks with us through every season of life.

The writer of Ecclesiastes reminds us that there is "a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven." Just as the natural world moves through the seasons, so do our lives. Some seasons are busy and demanding; others are quieter and reflective. Some are marked by joy and celebration, others by difficulty and loss. Through them all, God's faithfulness remains constant.

As a church community, summer often sees a mixture of activity and quietness. While some regular groups take a break, concerts, weddings, baptisms, village events and visitors bring new faces through our doors.

We are reminded that St Mary's is not simply a building, but a living community of people seeking to know, love and follow Jesus in Newick. On the 18th of July, St Mary's will be holding a Vision Day from 9:30 – 3pm, where we will come together and explore where God might be calling us over the next 5 years and how we can better engage with our wider community. We will be looking at issues around Churchyard space, Accessibility to Church and Barn Centre, Children's, Youth and Families Work, and how we can grow our Pastoral Care across the generations. All are welcome and refreshments will be made available, and a light lunch provided. Please drop the Church Office

a line if you are hoping to attend, so we can cater for the right number without depending on the blessing of loaves and fishes!!

Our church remains open throughout the summer, for prayer and reflection, and I encourage you, whether you are a regular worshipper or an occasional visitor, to make use of this peaceful space during the summer months. Many people tell us that simply sitting quietly in church for a few minutes brings a sense of calm and perspective that can be hard to find elsewhere.

As we enjoy the gifts of summer, let us also remember those for whom this season may be difficult: those who are lonely, unwell, grieving, or struggling with life's burdens. A phone call, a visit, or a simple act of kindness can make an enormous difference.

The love of Christ is often experienced through the care and compassion we show one another.

Whatever your plans for July and August, may you find time for rest, renewal and thanksgiving.

May you discover afresh the beauty of God's world, the support of family and friends, and the peace that comes from knowing that God is with us in every season.

On behalf of everyone at St Mary's, I wish you a happy, safe and blessed summer, have a great month, be joyful, keep the faith and keep doing the little things that make a difference to those you love and those in need.

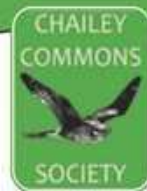

Everyone is welcome



Our outdoor activities have continued with our June flower walk on Red House Common, and it was well attended by an enthusiastic group of all ages keenly looking for the seasonal blooms. For the home brewers there is a good crop of elderflower so the resulting cordial will be delicious for the summer drinks. Lots of usual plants such as Foxgloves, Bramble, Tormentil, Buttercup (creeping) and even late bluebells were showing and a few special ones such as Orchid (common spotted), Violet, Milkwort and Figwort and a special mention of the Sandwort – tiny and quite rare.

Secondly, we did our Nightlife Safari starting at 8.30.p.m. and followed a special mysterious route in the gathering gloom. We were rewarded by a lovely warm evening with a beautiful sunset and as we approached the car park there was a surprise show by the nightjars churring and circling above us silhouetted against the night sky.

The Commons have been so dry but early June has brought a change in the weather pattern with the Jet Stream blowing in strongly, giving wet and windy low pressure areas across us and much needed rain has been falling.

The marked Wildlife Refuges are hidden now amongst the strong growth of birch and bracken and are providing the much needed safe areas for the ground nesting birds, especially the nightjars and other summer breeding inhabitants of the heathland. Please continue to avoid these for the time being.

As mentioned, the migrating nightjars have arrived and should be with us until August, and we have been carrying out surveys on each Common to monitor the number of nightjar territories and likely nesting activity. Results to follow.

The ponies are looking well in their summer coats so please do not feed the ponies but enjoy them from a distance. Our advice and request continues that if your property borders the Commons, please do not be tempted to put any prunings or mowings onto the Common. Grass mowings in particular can cause colic in ponies and lead to serious disease and death and prunings may be poisonous. Furthermore, the added nutrients lead to a decline in the heathland wild flowers. Thank you.

We are looking forward to welcoming our new Reception starters to their settling in sessions this term, as well as a Teddy Bear's Picnic where they will get to meet their future buddy.

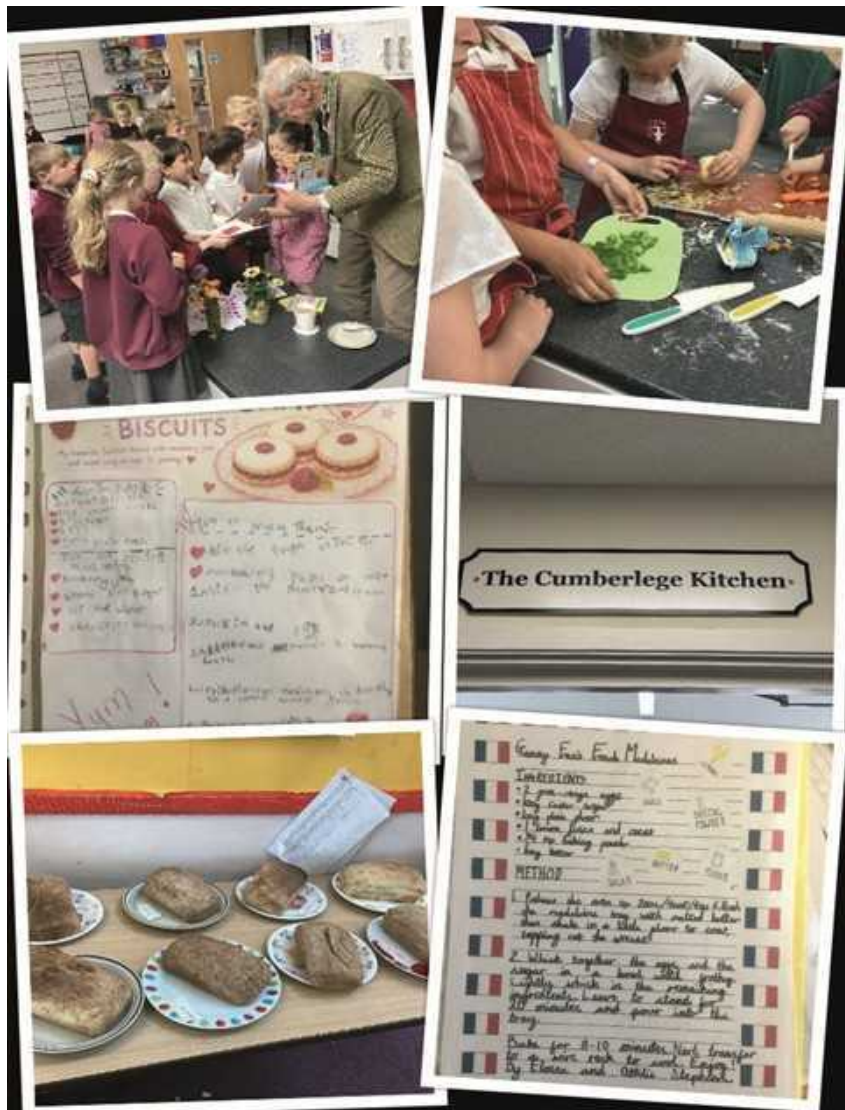

Snippets of Newick History by Antiquarius



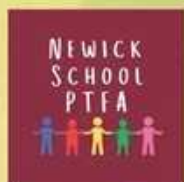
The 1840 tithe map for Newick shows accurately every parcel of land in the parish, prepared to assess how much tithe money the parcel 'owner' should pay towards upkeep of the parish church and the clergy. Payment was in money instead of the former tithe method of 'payment in kind' (ie crops, wool, milk, etc). There is an accompanying list called the 'apportionments' showing each numbered parcel with its acreage, its owner and occupier and a description of its use...cottages, gardens, woodland, fields (pasture or arable), farm yards, plantations, coppice, orchards, hop gardens (27 acres), osier beds, etc.

'Pleasure grounds' are shown, associated with the big houses such as Newick Park and Beechlands. Ponds are shown, including one on the village green. Also by the green were the turnpike toll house, the Bull and Butcher public house and the forge of Thomas Attree. The green itself was called the 'waste' of the Lord of the Manor. There were several other such 'wastes' about the parish including common land and roadside verges.

Parcels named Kiln Field, Kiln Plot and Lime Kiln Wood illustrate that there were lime kilns here and there in the parish. The River Ouse was navigable for barges in those days, so the land of the Trustees of the Upper Ouse Navigation' is shown. There was a 'wharf' near Goldbridge. In what was later to be called Allington Road was a windmill as well as various cottages.

At about the same time as this tithe map was the 1841 national population census, including entries for Newick parish. This census information includes details of employment/occupations of the residents and is very useful for amplification and comparison with the tithe map details. The two combined give a good understanding of Newick in the 1840s.

The original tithe map is a six-foot long roll but it is now also digitised for general inspection. The scale of the map is 'four chains to the inch'. Decipher that as your homework for the month.

Across the school, students have been involved in a wide range of activities and achievements. We are incredibly proud of those who took part in the Junior UK Maths Challenge, showing excellent problem-solving skills and achieving fantastic results, with some progressing to the next round. In sport, our students continue to excel; Year 7 students represented the school brilliantly at a local athletics meet, while our Year 8 Street Cricket team made a strong start to their season with impressive performances at a local tournament. Updates from Our District & County Councillor

Cllr Charlotte Keenan shared two detailed reports, covering:

- Concerns about proposed national planning reforms and the importance of protecting Newick's local voice.
- A full update on road safety issues around the **A272/Newick Hill junction**, including speeding concerns, parking on verges, school bus arrangements and ongoing Highways monitoring.
- She has also requested a comprehensive road safety profile for the whole Chailey Division.



Planning Matters

Councillors reviewed several applications, with a mix of no comments and one objection relating to a restrictive covenant on Godden Road.

A number of recent applications were also noted as approved by Lewes District Council.

A busy session saw councillors approve:

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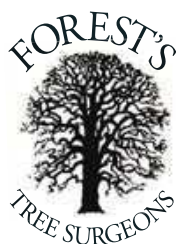
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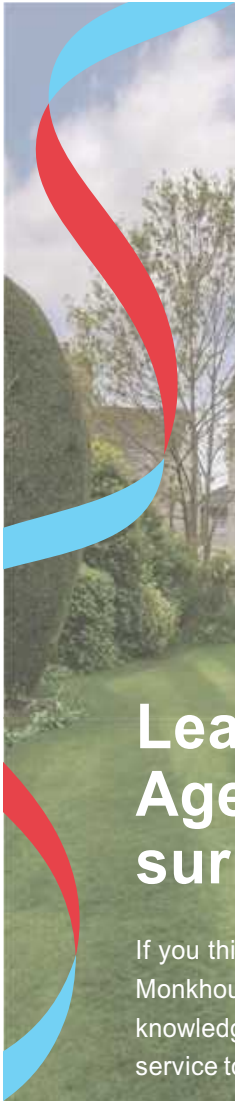


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
