What is Congressional redistricting?

The U.S. Constitution mandates a census every ten years to count every person living in the United States, and this count plays a key role in determining political representation and allocating federal resources.

Apportionment is the process of dividing the 435 memberships, or seats, in the U.S. House of Representatives among the 50 states based on the apportionment population counts from the decennial census.

Redistricting is a process to redraw Congressional districts after the decennial census.




Who draws the Congressional maps?

- Independent Commission: AK, AZ, CA, CO, ID, MI, MT, NY, WA








The Nationwide Redistricting Race for the House


