**The Estates at Pembroke Park**  
**HOA Crime Prevention Meeting - 10.19.2023**  
**Cedar Ridge Christian Church - Fellowship Hall**  
**BAPD officials Officer Michael Peale, Officer Connor Poole and Ethan Hutchins presented to our meeting. Here are some of the points they made during the presentation:**

- 38 Calls for Service from November '22 - April '23, this is for Pembroke Park and the Estates at Pembroke Park.
- 11 of those calls were home alarms that went off but were not crime related. The other 27 calls were as follows: 2 man w/a gun, 3 disturbance, 3 Fraud, 4 traffic related, 1 lost property, 1 Keep the peace, 1 mental illness related, 1 suspicious person. There has not been any "porch pirate" calls in our neighborhood.
- They hope within the next few months, we will be able to go to crimemapping.com and enter our address to receive alerts on our phone or email to know what is happening in our area. Go to BAPD Facebook page to learn when crimemapping.com goes live!
- If you ever sell anything on Facebook Market place or any site and want to meet the buyer at a safe place, you can meet at the Public Safety Center at 1101 N. Sixth St. It is a safe place with lights and cameras all over the property.
- The officers answered questions and gave us tips such as:
  1. Know your neighbors
  2. Keep your cars locked if left in the driveway
  3. Do not leave any valuables in your car outside
  4. Lights on overnight around your home always deters crime
  5. Watch for unusual cars or people in your neighborhood and report anything that looks suspicious
  6. Having camera/video surveillance is helpful

Something the officers shared is the response time for emergency calls is under 2 minutes to a BA address!

If you are interested in learning more about the BAPD consider enrolling in an upcoming Citizens Police Academy. It is a once a week, 3 hour course for 12 weeks. You get to meet officers from every department and learn what it takes to be a BA police officer. It is every interactive. My husband and I took the class 3 years ago and loved it! So informative.
