Course Description: R.A.D.A.R.™ is an advanced three-day terrorism interdiction training course designed for proactive law enforcement officers, Homeland Security personnel, interdiction teams, intelligence personnel, and highway criminal enforcement units operating at the frontline of America’s internal security.

In today’s threat environment, recognizing ideological indicators and behavioral anomalies during routine field contacts has never been more critical. R.A.D.A.R.™ teaches participants how to apply cultural, behavioral, and psychological analysis skills in real-world settings to detect radicalization and ideological threats before they escalate into violence.

Developed by a former child soldier turned U.S. law enforcement agent, this course fuses operational tactics with deep cultural intelligence. Participants will learn how to read nonverbal deception indicators, recognize radicalization patterns, differentiate between normative cultural behaviors and ideological anomalies, and conduct effective field interviews across diverse populations.

The curriculum combines behavioral deception detection techniques with the understanding the ideological and cultural depth of the Middle East and religious nuances. Officers will also analyze real-world traffic stop videos demonstrating how these techniques reveal ideological threats during routine interdictions.

Whether working highways, ports of entry, criminal corridors, field operations, or HUMINT operations, attendees will leave equipped with the tactical communication skills, cultural competency, and threat-recognition mindset needed to transform everyday field contacts into life-saving interdictions.

Course Delivery Method: Lecture, pre-instructional strategy, class discussion.

Testing/Assessment Method: Student will be engaged in Q&A type questions, during the course of each lesson objective, as well as at the end of each objective to determine their ability to comprehend the material by open discussion Q&A based on the topic and case studies.

Terminal Learning Objective (TLO): Upon completion of the course, the student will be able to detect behavioral, cultural, and ideological anomalies during proactive field contacts and apply terrorism interdiction techniques to interdict potential threats before an attack materializes.

1. **Recognize behavioral deception indicators** during roadside interviews, inspections, and casual conversations.
2. **Analyze ideological threat cues** based on Middle Eastern cultural knowledge and Islamic doctrinal variances.
3. **Identify early-stage radicalization** signs through language patterns, physical behaviors, and ideological references.
4. **Apply strategic questioning and elicitation techniques** to provoke revealing responses during field contacts.
5. **Interpret cross-cultural communication styles accurately** to distinguish between normative behavior and ideological concealment.
6. **Deploy real-time threat assessment techniques** during vehicle stops, pedestrian encounters, and port-of-entry inspections.
7. **Utilize real-world interdiction tactics** to document behavioral anomalies for intelligence and operational reporting purposes.
8. **Integrate terrorism interdiction practices** into daily enforcement activities to enhance officer safety and national security.
