2019 NFHS End of Match Protocol Summary for MAVO Officials [Updated 7 16 2019]

Final Point of Match:

R1: After awarding point (and signaling fault if R1's whistle ends rally), R1whistles and signals end of match (R2 mirrors)

joins R2 at table to thank assistant officials

R1 whistles and directs teams to come together for post-match greeting Absent alternative post-match exit pre-gamed with partner, R1 leaves stand and

R2: After mirroring R1 end of match signal, R2 checks and initials scoresheet, thanks assistant officials and awaits R1 at table (absent alternative post-match exit strategy)

Mandatory Post-Match Debrief:

Facilitated by R1, participation required from both R1 and R2 (& other MAVO official) Resolve any specific questions about rules, mechanics, and match events Review performance strengths

Identify performance weaknesses <u>and</u> solutions for avoiding or correcting problems Display honesty, respect and professionalism in giving and receiving critiques Goal is for every official to continuously improve, so officiating cadre can improve Different perspectives yield different advice - take it all in and make use of what you can Don't try to fix everything at once, work on a few specific points each succeeding match

Post Match Obligations:

Follow up promptly after match with peer evaluation on Arbiter.

Written Arbiter comments are far more useful to Assignor than numerical ratings
If conduct red cards are issued in match, R1 must immediately email/call Assignor
(and/or MAVO President) to facilitate MAVO report/response to AD and MPA
Use what you learned from the experience in your next match
