

CREDIT UNIONS

• Just What are They, Really?

The statistics in the chart below may surprise some of you. Credit unions are a small but constant presence in the financial services industry. According to Federal Reserve data, credit unions held two percent of household financial assets as of June 2003.

By definition, credit unions are not-for-profit cooperative financial

institutions owned by their members and are usually comprised of people who share something in common - employment, association membership, or residence in a particular geographic area. For example, local Schools Financial Credit Union allows anyone meeting the following criteria to become a member:

- Anyone who lives, works, worships, or attends school in the following counties: Butte, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Solano, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba.
- Employees of California public and licensed private schools
- Anyone certified or classified, full-or part-time, active or retired, in the state of California.
- Students of higher education Anyone enrolled in post-

- secondary educational institutions in the state of California
- Alumni Association members Anyone belonging to a college alumni association of a California institution of higher education.
- Active, or Lifetime California Teachers Association (CTA)

 members
- Employees of the California School Boards Association
- Elected members of public school district Boards of Education in California.
- Family members Anyone related to a Schools' member, no matter where they live.

The credit union philosophy is "not for profit, not for charity, but for service." Credit unions are democratically owned and controlled institutions and are based on "people helping people" principles. Credit union members elect a credit union's board of directors. Each member has an equal vote, regardless of how much he or she has on deposit. Only members may serve as directors, and directorship is not a paid position. Presently, more than 117,900 Americans volunteer for their credit unions, serving as board members, committee members or providing other assistance.

Credit unions offer most of the financial services found at banks, including loans, savings accounts, checking accounts, IRAs, Internet account access, and more. Since they don't exist for profit, but only

to serve credit union members, earnings are returned to members in the form of dividends on savings, lower loan rates or additional services. As a result, consumers have ranked credit unions as the leaders among financial institutions in customer satisfaction for the last 16 years.

If you are in the market for a new financial services provider, you may want to check out one of the local credit unions listed in the accompanying sidebar. Each credit union follows the same basic principles, but also has its own philosophies and practices. For example, Schools Financial Credit Union, headquartered in Sacramento, places quality member service as their number one priority and utilizes monthly surveys to provide direction to member service improvements. Other credit unions located in Folsom are AEA, Golden 1 and Heritage Community Credit Unions. After researching each credit union's requirements and individual practices, you are sure to find one that is right for you.
